# Bus service woes in Kingborough

Residents within Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates are voicing their concerns at the lack of school bus services in the local region.

Councillor David Bain has been receiving numerous enquiries from residents who say they were advised by the Department of State Growth that a Metro or school bus service would not be considered yet as the 'area is far from fully developed'

Cr Bain conducted a tally in December 2022 across both Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates and counted 542 homes built and builds underway, with the number of vacant blocks at 84 - several with development

This equates to approximately 87 per cent of both Estates being fully developed," said Cr Bain.

Cr Bain also conducted a poll on the Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates Facebook Group.

"61 responses were returned noting that 101 children would utilise a school bus service if it were available in the area," Cr Bain said

Councillor Bain said he contacted Wisby's Bus Services who hold the State Government contract for school bus services throughout Kingborough.

"Wisby's informed me that they also have received a lot of enquires from families within Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates," said Cr Bain.

"Wisby's advised that they could accommodate the service within existing routes, however are only able to service additional areas if directed by the Department of State Growth.'

Instead, the nearest bus stop for Wisby's is located along Channel Highway near Mertonyale Circuit.

"Given the clear demand for the service, the bus contractors' ability to service the run and the current focus on encouraging people to consider other modes of transport, I'm struggling to find an answer as to why this service isn't being put in place," Cr Bain said.

This is an issue that has also been raised by Kingborough Council multiple times, although Cr Bain has conducted this further research by himself.

"Council is disappointed for the residents in Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates at the ongoing failure of the State Government to address the

lack of bus services," said Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt.

"We know that there is an increasing need for commuter and school bus services and believe there is support for services from community members and school bus providers.

"We recently received correspondence which indicates that the State Government is aware of the growing needs of the area but has no immediate plans to address public transport needs."

When contacted for comment, the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson stated "I have recently written to the Mayor with news that the Rockliff Liberal Government is considering how to best service growing communities, including Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates, as part of future network planning for Greater Hobart bus services"

"The Department of State Growth is planning on installing new bus stops on the Channel Highway near Spring Farm Road which will increase access for Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estate residents," said Minister Ferguson.

### Better walkability equals big benefits for greater Snug

A recent report by the Menzies Institute has highlighted that while there are good opportunities and reasons to walk in 'greater' Snug, there are some rough, unsafe and disconnected sections in the network of pathways.

Improvements in these sections would bring significant benefits to the local community, both for the safety of local school children and to improving social connections and economic activity.

Benefits of better walkability include improvements to physical and mental health, safer access to the school, increased independence for local children, reduced car trips and richer social connections.

Environmental benefits include direct experience of nature and reduced carbon emissions.

There is growing public awareness of the negative impacts of poor walkability on a healthy, happy community, and there is now growing interest in plans to create the next generation of long-term community infrastructure.

Armed with these research findings and building on years of persistent community advocacy, local community and school groups are mobilising behind a campaign to take walkability in greater Snug to a new level.

The campaign will kick off with an open community meeting at the Snug School Hall at 9.30am on Saturday, February 25.

All from greater Snug are welcome, encompassing Snug, Lower Snug, Electrona and Coningham.

So, how did the Menzies Institute assess walkability? In simple terms, by identifying features that make it easier or harder for community members to be active and walk around their town.

Local residents documented segments of the walk-ways to record the quality of the walking experience.

This included reporting on the walking surfaces, safety issues, destinations and their level of enjoyment or concern. Community members then came together to make sense of the data collected by the citizen scientists at a

The Menzies Institute then put it all together for them. A major finding of the study is that, while there are many great destinations to walk to through a very beautiful environment, there is a lack of connectivity of existing paths and trails.

A good example is the lack of a pedestrian and cycling bridge and trail on the bay side of the highway between Lower Snug and Snug.

Research has shown that these locations are well within the distances that people are known to regularly walk. Connecting this segment would massively improve walkability in both directions and enable, for example, many more children to safely walk or cycle to and from school each day.

The other major finding concerned pedestrian safety, particularly along the Channel Highway.

Kids who walk to Snug School from Sunsail Street must supermarket, the Snug Tavern and the Snug Caravan



Station Road, (PS Richard M

cross the Channel Highway four times and busy Beach Road twice on the way to and from school each day.

For those kids, a pavement along the western side of the Channel Highway in Snug would fix a broken link and mean no crossing of the highway at all.

President of the Coningham and Lower Snug Community Association (CALSCA) Richard Mount says he is constantly hearing examples of near misses of children on public roads, which is very stressful for the children and their parents and for the car drivers as well.

Narrow, rough verges like those on Old Station Road are clearly a hazard, though many people, including children, frequently walk along this perilous pathway as it is the main way to walk in and out of Coningham.

The significant risks of this route deter people from walking and mean that more people are driving cars even over short distances.

Local services and businesses, including the local

Park, are very supportive of improved non-car access in and out of Snug.

A recent community survey indicated that residents would use safer shared pathways to access the services and businesses in Snug, such as the doctor's office, school, shops, bus services, café, chemist, post office and churches, as well as the public hall, scouts, Snug Beach, sporting facilities and the new council playground.

The people in Snug would also be able to visit their friends in neighbouring communities more easily as well as accessing Coningham beaches and the recreation nature reserve.

# Lack of buses inconvenient

Councillor Bain said this response from State Government is disappointing.

"It goes without saying that I'm disappointed in the Minister's response as it still fails to address the question of why they won't implement school bus services when the existing contractor says they can accommodate the route and the demand for the service is clearly there," said Cr Bain.

Locals like Erin say that the lack of services to the area contribute to her being late for work most days of the week. "Our family moved into the estate two years ago and

we have a daughter who attends St Aloysius," said Erin. "I have to specifically drop my child into school, and it can sometimes take nearly an hour to get through the traffic of two schools, find a park and take my child to her classroom and get back home again.

"I am late every morning to work.

"If a bus service was available, I could get more hours of work in the day.

"It is very wasteful that a new estate with so many young families does not have any bus services. "In the times when we are trying to do more for the

environment it seems the government doesn't want to support this through lack of appropriate bus services." Other locals like John and Anna La Roux say the inconvenience of not having a bus service in Whitewater Estate

puts additional pressure on them as working parents.

to make special arrangements with our employer for our child's school drop-off and pickup," said John and Anna.

"On top of this, when we have meetings or other important engagements during pickup time, it creates even more issues for us.

"We believe that every child deserves access to safe and reliable transportation to and from school, and it's unacceptable that families in both Whitewater Estate and Spring Farm Estate have to go to such lengths to ensure this for their children.

"We call on the local government to address this issue and provide the necessary transportation options for families in both areas.'

# Kingborough Council donates land to Hobart Women's Shelter

On Monday, February 6, 2023, Kingborough Council agreed in-principle to donate land in Kingston to the Hobart Women's Shelter to provide long-term housing for women and children.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said she was delighted that Council had unanimously decided in-principle to make a large block of land in Kingston available for housing for women and children who needed long-term accommodation after leaving crisis care.

"The Hobart Women's Shelter presented at the Greater Hobart Mayor's Forum in April 2022 last year, asking councils to consider any suitable land to gift them, to enable them to secure grant funding to build long term accommodation," Cr Wriedt said.

"Although Council does not have large areas of land that could be developed, this particular block which under the Planning Scheme is zoned as Community Purpose Use was identified as being suitable for affordable housing.

"The central location has easy access to public transport, sporting facilities, schools, and services and is perfect for the development of long-term housing for women and children.

"Unfortunately, the need for long-term and crisis accommodation in Tasmania is only growing.

"Women living in crisis accommodation after fleeing domestic violence situations are staying longer at these facilities as the tight rental market makes it difficult for them to find permanent homes.

"With crisis accommodation at peak capacity it's alarming to

know that eight out of ten women who turn up at the Women's Shelter in Hobart are turned away as they are full.

"The homes, once built, would provide longer term housing for women transitioning out of crisis accommodation.

"A formal proposal was developed by the Hobart Women's Shelter and presented to Council, requesting gifting of the land."

Shelter and presented to Council, requesting gifting of the land." Cr Wriedt said that the Hobart Women's Shelter had given permission for the location of this proposed development to be

released as it was for long-term housing and not crisis-care. "The location of crisis-care facilities is not something that is provided publicly for security reasons, but this accommodation

is not in that category.

"The land is zoned Community Purpose, which means that is suitable for community housing, subject to meeting the requirements of the Planning Scheme.

"Councillors unanimously agreed on Monday night that we wanted to support the development of social housing in Kingborough and gifting this land is one of the practical ways we can do this.

"As this is public land that we are disposing, the Local Government Act requires us to go through a process that includes notifying the public and calling for community feedback prior to 6 March 2023."

Council must then consider any feedback before making a final decision.

# **Incarceration rates** of Aboriginal people

The Tasmanian Government must resource and fund community-led solutions to address the staggering increases in the imprisonment of Aboriginal people.

The Tasmanian Aboriginal Legal Service (TALS) is committed to working with any Government, stakeholder, any and all communities to provide solutions and advocate for the rights of all Aboriginal people in Tasmania.

We are the only funded Aboriginal Legal Service in Tasmania, providing legal and wrap-around services to Aboriginal people living in Tasmania since July 2020.

We are an inclusive service for all Aboriginal people in Tasmania.

There is no issue too small, and we want people to feel they can come to us without shame or judgement.

The recent Productivity Commission data showing a rise in the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people being locked up in Tasmanian prisons is alarming - but without systematic and sustained change it is not a surprise.

Demand for TALS services continues to increase, and will do so unless there is a change of attitude, a change of systems that do not work and are oppressive.

Since June 2020, the TALS has opened 2300 files and assisted clients with various legal matters, from tenancy issues, to parenting arrangements and criminal court matters.

The service has 16 lawyers across the state providing advice throughout the entire legal process and there are five Aboriginal Liaison Officers who support clients with their non-legal needs. Since July 2020, Tasmania Police have contacted TALS around 5700 times to advise they have

arrested an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person.

We have lawyers available to support every single person identifying in custody - 24/7, 369

days a year.

Concerningly, TALS expects that from July 2020-July 2023 we will have seen a 47 per cent

increase in the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people arrested in Tasmania.

TALS understands ordinary Tasmanians - who do not see the people and their disadvantages on a daily basis - think that jail is the only option to protect the public.

on a daily basis - think that jall is the only option to protect the public.

The reality is, if we do not deal with people with humanity and compassion, people that we send to jail will not be able to rehabilitate and will continue to offend putting the public at risk on an

to jail will not be able to rehabilitate and will continue to offend putting the public at risk on an ongoing basis.

There is so much more than can be done in the prison to support people and provide options for a brighter future.

Given the high rates of incarceration of Aboriginal people, the commitment and consultation around what Indigenous support needs to look like in the prison must be a priority for the Government.

There must be serious commitment to justice reinvestment, where money being pumped into prisons and a 'tough on crime' policing response gets redirected to pay for programs and infrastructure to deal with the root causes of offending.

We need to help and support people early to avoid the cycle of crime.

The past has shown us that a police and prison approach does not work.

We have to break the cycle, and that is not going to be done with four walls but with social justice and community led responses.






