The awards ceremony was held at Parliament House in Canberra.

Council votes to change the date

Kingborough Council will change the date of its January 26 Citizenship Ceremonies from 2024 onwards.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said this was a positive and inclusive move for Council and the community. "Relocating the date for January Citizenship Ceremonies will help alleviate concerns associated with holding Citizenship Ceremonies on January 26 every year," Cr Wriedt said.


"This date has become controversial, with many Australians concerned about celebrating Australia Day on January 26, which is also identified as a day of mourning and invasion by many Australians.

"Following the amendment to the Australian Citizenship Ceremonies Code, several councils have moved to change the date of their January citizenship ceremony, including City of Hobart, Glenorchy and Huon Valley.

"I think it is incumbent on our Council to consider what is in the best interest of all our community.

"We all recognise that there is community distress surrounding Australia Day and its differing meaning for many. "By choosing to hold the Citizenship Ceremonies on another day other than January 26, we are alleviating any distress that some community members may feel either by attending or by participating in them.

"The changes will take place commencing in 2024, with the ceremony to be held either on the 23, 24 25, 27, 28 or 29 January."

Callout for public transport advisors

The Rockliff Liberal Government is making a last call for nominations to join a new group to advise on public transport accessibility.

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson, said that ensuring accessibility for as many members of the community as possible was a key focus of our public transport network.

"We're looking for a range of community members to join a new Public Transport Access Advisory Group who can provide lived-experience perspectives to help guide public transport service delivery and policy development," Minister Ferguson said.

"The Rockliff Liberal Government has committed \$10 million over four years to upgrade bus stops at priority locations, and 100 per cent of urban services are now scheduled to be delivered with low floor buses, but we acknowledge there is further room for improvement

"Collectively the group will identify current or emerging issues in relation to the

accessibility of our services.

"Group members will have an interest in improving public transport accessibility in Tasmania and be able to represent the perspectives of people facing accessibility issues.

"Whether it is older Tasmanians or Tasmanians with a disability, or their parents or carers, we want this to be a truly representative group to help make our public transport

"We expect to appoint up to 10 members to the group to ensure we have a wide range of experience and views represented."

Pending appointment of members to the Public Transport Access Advisory Group, the first meeting of the group is expected to take place in the first half of the year. Nominations opened on January 13 and close on February 24.

Funding to address local mobile black spots

After an election commitment to improve mobile coverage in identified locations, including Alonnah, the Australian Government has announced the opening of applications for grant funding.

The \$40 million Improving Mobile Coverage Round (IMCR) delivers on election commitments to fund Mobile Network Operators and Infrastructure Providers to deploy new mobile infrastructure at 54 target locations across Australia.

In addition to benefiting regional communities, this dedicated round is also targeting mobile coverage issues along a number of major regional highways to ensure motorists have access to essential mobile services in the event of an emergency

Member for Franklin Julie Collins MP expressed that she is proud that the Australian Government is delivering on its election promises for the Huon Valley.

"Reliable mobile coverage is key for regional communities like ours," stated Ms

"It's at the centre of our daily lives, keeping the local economy thriving, and staying in touch in the event of an emergency or natural disaster.

"I know that reliable mobile coverage will make a big difference to locals and visitors on Bruny Island and in Verona Sands and I look forward to seeing this program rolled out.

"I will continue working closely with mobile operators to get the best results for the people in these areas.

Similarly, Minister for Communications Michelle Rowland MP said that all Australians

deserve world-class mobile coverage.

"The Government's October Budget included one of the most significant investments in regional connectivity since the creation of the National Broadband Network over a decade ago," Minister Rowlands explained.

"This dedicated funding provides an opportunity for Mobile Network Operators and Infrastructure Providers to help locals in Verona Sands and Alonnah, motorists, and tourists in identified areas with unreliable service.

"The Government will continue to invest strongly in expanding mobile coverage" The IMCR was funded in the October 2022-23 Federal Budget.

This comes as part of a \$656 million Better Connectivity Plan for regional and rural Australia by the Australian Government, with its plan committing \$400 million to expanding mobile coverage and improving communications resilience, including investment to fund future rounds of the Mobile Black Spot Program, and \$200 million to fund place-based communications solutions through additional rounds of the Regional Connectivity Program. Consultation is currently open on both of these Programs.

Mobile Network Operators and Infrastructure Providers will have until 5PM AEDT, April 13, 2023 to apply for IMCR grant funding.

Nearby, Sue's garden is an illustration of what can be achieved in a near-urban environment offering privacy and seclusion and a perfect habitat for birds and frogs. At Dalmere in Middleton, a garden first developed

almost 20 years ago surrounding a straw bale house, combines shrubs, vines and trees with a year-round productive veggie patch.

With its year-round colour, Jana's garden south of Woodbridge reflects a sense of European grandeur and incorporates a Monet-inspired dam filled with water lilies while dotted among the fruit trees are some of the sculptures created by the owner.

Five Bob Farm at Birchs Bay - previously known as Fleurtys Cafe - is run by a manager and an enthusiastic team of volunteers in a garden which produces inspiration and therapy as well as fresh herbs and vegetables. It also gives visitors the opportunity to walk the neighbouring Art Farm trail.

Entry to all five gardens is \$20 with free entry for under-16-vear-olds.







DRAMATIC PROSPECTS FOR KINGSTON BEACH

IF a five-million dollar casino and multi-storey hotel at Wrest Point is calculated to place Tasmania on the world tourist map, what would a sinilar expenditure at Kingston Beach recognised by those who know it as one of the most attractive places in Australia, do for the State?

The difference is that you won inthe deed a case-ino at Kingston Beach. It is already one of the pest beaches imaginable for swimming, yachting, and fishing. It already has an international golf course, sailing club facilities, a sports ground, and caravan park, and an esplanade promenade which could be made to rival Manly (N.S.W.)

What can be done locally is improvement of the caravan park, with a better access road, reclamation of the river front marshes for sports or additional accommodation.

marshes for sports or additional accommodation areas, and possibly the formation of a trout fish-Browns River above Kingston. This would not affect the flow once the lake was filled in the rainy season, because the water would not be drawn off.

What an investing de-veloper could do, once these preliminaries were accomplished, would be to build a multi storey hetel with night life on international lines, innetrational lines, in-cluding club room faci-lities, a heated swim-mizg pool, and public tennis courts.

The experience of other Eastern Australian States suggests also that multi storey apartment units along the esplanade would be snapped up as quickly as they were built. but there would need to be some available for visitors

and at prices that gave value for money.

The advent of the outlet road undoubtedly will lead to dramatic developments, which could be on this scale. though it is doubtful whether many doubtful whether many Kingston residents would appreciate such inroads





the dogs and, in turn, the huge benefit it has had to the hundreds of dogs that have been able to be adopted following their training in the prison," the Attorney-General said.

"On a personal level, I know how beneficial an animal can be to our overall health and wellbeing, and many people in the community I'm sure can relate to the benefits that come from having a pet in their lives, and for inmates it's no different; the benefits are enormous.

"I am pleased that the TPS is able to provide these great opportunities to our inmates, and I'm very supportive of more options like these being developed."


