# Celebrating seventy years in Kingborough

On Saturday, February 18, members of the Verdouw family met at Dru Point Reserve to celebrate 70 years since their arrival.

Cornelis and Hendrika Verdouw and their ten children, ranging in age from five to 21 years of age, emigrated from Holland to Kingston in December 1952. They were the first of the 'Verdouw' clan to come to Tasmania, so all the Verdouw family you meet now in Tasmania are descended from them.

Those 10 children married and had 43 grandchildren, who married and had a further 126 great grandchildren, some of whom have also married and had a further 47 great-great grandchildren so far.

In total there are just over 300 descendants of Cornelis and Hendrika, nany of whom have since relocated from the Kingborough municipality to other locations around Australia.

Dirk Verdouw (86), one of the original 10 children who immigrated to Kingston at 16 years of age and has lived in Kingston ever since, expressed his family's gratitude for the quality of life he and the family have been able to experience since their arrival.

He said that upon arrival, Kingborough people were welcoming and have always been friendly to the family

Like other Dutch immigrants of the period, the family prospered and were able to give back to the Kingborough community in many ways.

Many Kingborough residents would remember the impact the family had through the building company, Laver Constructions Pty Ltd.

There are also many other community organisations in the Kingborough municipality who over the years have benefited from the involvement of family members

Dirk's son, Bruce Verdouw (60), representing the grandchildren generation, said that he is very grateful to his grandparents for having immigrated to Tasmania, and for the opportunities for the great life that he has had as part of the Kingborough municipality.

Bruce said that he has enjoyed seeing his descendants enjoy Kingborough and everything it has to offer.

# Out of order behaviour at Blackmans Bay

Due to regular vandalism, Kingborough Council will be locking the Blackmans Bay Beach toilets at night.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said it was unfortunate that as a result of ongoing vandalism the Blackmans Bay beach toilets would be locked at night time.

"It is so disappointing that our new toilets at the beach are constantly being deliberately damaged, requiring money and time to fix, and making them unusable to the community," Cr Wriedt said.

"The most recent attack, last weekend, will cost Council approximately \$3000 to repair the damage, and that is

on top of what we have already spent in recent months.



"As well as locking the toilets at night-time, when the attacks have happened, we will remove the paper towel dispenser and replace it with a hand dryer, to discourage some of the types of vandalism currently occurring," said Cr Wriedt.

"If the vandalism persists other measures such as CCTV will be considered but this then adds considerable costs at the ratepayer's expense.

"It is unfortunate we need to take these steps, but the ongoing nature of the van-

dalism provides no other real solutions.

"Our public facilities should be available to the community when required, but sadly a few individuals have senselessly decided to engage in this appalling anti-social behaviour and forced us to take this action.

"In the near future other toilets which attract this type of behaviour will also be considered for locking at night-time to prevent vandalism and further costs to residents". The proposal is to lock the toilets at dusk and reopen them at 6.30am.

# TARGA Tasmania postponed to October

Following the 2022 TARGA Tasmania event, Motorsport Australia appointed a Targa Review Panel to investigate the conduct of tarmac rallies

Due to the board of Motorsport Australia not yet being in a position to release the Targa Review Panel's report, combined with the time it will take to implement any recommendations, TARGA has made the difficult decision to postpone TARGA Tasmania until October 23

Motorsport Australia has advised that once the report is released, all recommendations will need to be implemented to the satisfaction of the board, meaning the sport of tarmac rallying will remain suspended in the

## Residential blocks sitting vacant in Kingborough

This month's Australian Bureau of Statistics revealed that building approvals were at the lowest number in Tasmania since July 2017.

15.561 residential blocks are sitting vacant across Tasmania with 1083 of these blocks in the Kingborough

Lyons MP Rebecca White said "With 15,561 vacant blocks across, there is so much opportunity to make a positive difference to Tasmania's housing crisis, yet the Liberals are failing to act".

"The process to develop new houses could be far easier to navigate," Ms White said.

"Vacant land could be purchased by the government to build social housing, or they could start building houses on the Fast Track Land Supply blocks that parliament approved from 2018.'

Minister for Planning Michael Ferguson said the Government is providing significant support to ensure an ongoing pipeline of land supply.

"We are providing grants of up to \$10,000 per lot for private landowners to develop land zoned for residential use to help cover the cost of power, water and sewage infrastructure," Minister Ferguson said.

"Under Labor, the average monthly building approvals was 197, compared to 253 per month for the last 8 years under the Liberal Government.

"There was no demand for extra housing under Labor

looking for jobs.'

Master Builders Tasmania CEO Matthew Pollock said not enough land is being released for the builders he represents to construct the houses Tasmania so desperately needs.

A spokesperson from Homes Tasmania stated "The Tasmanian Government is committed to increasing the supply of affordable residential land and affordable and social housing options in Tasmania".

"The Huntingfield Land Release Project is a key element of Tasmania's Affordable Housing Action Plan 2019-2023 and will ultimately deliver about 470 lots for new housing," the spokesperson said.

"A planning permit has been issued by Kingborough Council for Stage 1 of the development, which will deliver

over 200 lots. "An early release of about 30 lots has been approved

by Kingborough Council." Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing Guy Barnett stated the Housing Land Supply Act provides a fast-track mechanism for activating surplus

government land for new residential development. "A Housing Land Supply Order provides a secure pathway to re-zone land where it is demonstrated that the land is suitable for residential use, without the risk for lengthy planning delays," Minister Barnett said.

### Hearing loss diagnosis and treatment could be life changing

The number of Australians with hearing loss is expected to double over the next 35 years, and by 2050 one in four Australians are expected to be impacted.

Aging is a major factor in hearing loss.

Currently in Australia, over half the population aged between 60 and 70 have impacted hearing, increasing to more than 70 per cent of those over the age of 70; and 80 per cent of those over the age of 80.

Research conducted by the National Acoustic Laboratories on behalf of Hearing Australia found that undiagnosed and untreated hearing loss can significantly impact a person's quality of life.

They often feel isolated, their relationships suffer and many experience a loss of identity, withdrawing from the things and people they love.

Thankfully, once diagnosed and treated, people see improvement in their

relationships and well-being, and can participate more fully in activities, reconnecting with those around them.

This was the case for 67-year-old mother of two and grandmother of six, Daphne Terry, until she was fitted with a hearing aid by her local Hearing Australia centre. "I missed so many sounds, particularly listening to the sea, the sounds of

nature and chatting with my kids and grandkids.

"My grandkids now realise when I haven't got my hearing aids in, as I don't hear them properly.

"I feel like I'm not missing out on so much anymore," shared Daphne.
During 2021-22 Hearing Australia supported more than 270,000 children and adults with hearing loss.

"Hearing loss affects nearly 3.6 million Australians and there are often simple treatments, equipment or services that can improve a person's

hearing so that they can continue to live the life they want to," said Managing Director of Hearing Australia Kim Terrell.

To make it easy for more Australians to receive expert hearing care, Hearing Australia is hitting the road providing access to free\* hearing checks for adults aged 18 and over, with the aim of delivering 1000 events across the country in March for their 'Hearing the Nation Tour'.

A 15-minute check is the first step in understanding any potential hearing loss, and whether further assessment and diagnosis is required.

People interested in accessing a free\* hearing check are encouraged to search 'Hearing the Nation' to register for their nearest event.



# Book your COVID-19 booster vaccine

The Department of Health is encouraging eligible Tasmanians to book their next COVID-19 booster vaccine with a local immunisation provider to give them additional protection against severe COVID-19 ahead of winter.

From Monday, February 20 a 2023 COVID-19 booster is available for eligible people aged 5 years and older if they haven't had a COVID-19 vaccination or COVID-19 infection in the last six months.

Department of Health Deputy Secretary Dale Webster urged Tasmanians at greatest risk to book now to increase their protection against severe COVID-19 prior to winter.

"The booster is strongly recommended for older Tasmanians, and other adults at greatest risk of severe COVID-19 as soon as they are eligible," Mr Webster said.

"If you are an adult aged 65 years and over, aged 18 to 64 with a med-

ical condition that increases the risk of severe COVID-19, or have a disability with significant or complex health needs - now is the time to book.

"If you are aged 18 to 64 years without risk factors for severe COVID-19, you should consider a 2023 booster dose in discussion with your immunisation provider.

"Parents and guardians of children and adolescents aged 5 to 17 years who have medical conditions that increase their risk of severe COVID-19, or disability with significant or complex health needs, should also consider a 2023 booster dose for their child, in discussion with their immunisation provider.

"Receiving the booster will increase your immunity to COVID-19 and mean you are less likely to get sick, become very unwell or die from COVID-19.

you are less likely to get sick, become very unwell or die from COVID-19. "There are more than 100 General Practices and 100 pharmacies providing COVID-19 vaccines across the state, and Tasmanians can find one near them using the Clinic Finder on the Department of Health website.

"So, if it's been six months since your last vaccine or infection, book your COVID-19 booster vaccine today by contacting your GP or local pharmacy." All available age-appropriate COVID-19 booster vaccines are expected to boost immunity and increase protection against severe COVID-19.

However, bivalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccines - including the Moderna Bivalent and Pfizer Bivalent vaccines - are preferred over other vaccines. A 2023 booster dose is not recommended for children and adolescents aged

under the age of 18 who do not have any risk factors for severe COVID-19.

Those who have not yet had their primary course of vaccination followed

Those who have not yet had their primary course of vaccination followed by a booster dose for those eligible, continue to be recommended to do so, even if they have COVID-19 in the past.



# Kings Quarter apartments approved

Traders In Purple has welcomed the approval of its amended Development Application to build 50 apartments at Kings Quarter, Kingston.

Amendments to the design made in response to Kingborough Council's reasons for refusing the initial application in April 2022 include a reduction of the overall building height, alterations to the building facade, and provisions for more landscaping.

Traders In Purple Development Director Jennifer Cooper said the \$30 million project would provide a boost to housing stocks in Greater Hobart and local dwelling diversity in Kingston.

"This Kings Quarter apartment stage will provide 50 new dwellings, as well as supporting around 180 jobs both on and off site during the construction phase, with positive flow-on effect to local businesses including suppliers, manufacturers and consultants," Ms Cooper said.

"This will ease pressure on Hobart's tight housing market, while also adding much needed dwelling diversity ideally located within walking distance to existing Kingston amenities."

Apartment sales are expected to commence during the first half of 2023 and Ms Cooper said demand was expected to be high, particularly following all 80 homes in Stage 1 of the project selling out 12 months in advance.

"The two and three-bedroom park front apartments will appeal to a wide range of demographics, and based on Stage 1 sales, purchasers are expected to be a mix of downsizers, local owner occupiers, and investors," Ms Cooper said.

"Traders in Purple is very proud to be partnering with the Kingborough Council and local businesses to revitalise the site of the old Kingston High School, and to be providing high quality housing into the market."

In addition to the residential stages, a development application has been lodged with Council for a commercial office building at Kings Quarter, providing new employment opportunities in the Kingborough region.




