Lack of merit-based recruitment at **Tasmanian councils**

Key findings from the Integrity Commission into a Tasmanian council's job application process have found that applicants were hired not based on merit, were prone to bias and direct appointment via association was common.

The Integrity Commission has warned the Tasmanian local government sector is exposed to perceptions of nepotism and cronyism in recruitment.

A spokesperson from the Kingborough Council issued a statement to the Kingborough Chronicle stating "Council applies a merit-based approach for all appointments".

"All assessments use a competitive selection process," they said "Council welcomes the Integrity Commission's recommendations."

In a report tabled in State Parliament today, the Commission recommended that the Minister for Local Government develop a model recruitment policy aimed at addressing the issue.

The report also recommended that the Local Government Act be amended to reintroduce a provision obligating councils to appoint employees based on merit.

"This was removed in 2005 and while we are unsure of the government's intention at the time, the Commission is of the view this is an important legislative measure to protect the public interest," Integrity Commission CEO Michael Easton said.

"However, legislation without clear policy guidelines on how people should administer the law leaves both individuals and organisations exposed.

"Therefore, we have recommended that the Minister for Local Government develop a model policy for all councils in Tasmania to adopt."

A recent investigation titled Investigation Smithies examined recruitment processes involving alleged misconduct at a Tasmanian council.

Several of the jobs in question were awarded via a process called direct appointment which means the roles were not advertised - internally or externally.

"There was also no policy governing recruitment processes at the council and therefore no requirement to disclose any conflicts of interest," Mr Easton said.

"In this investigation we found there was a failure to recognise that a professional association - where two people have worked together before - was a potential conflict of interest.

"This was followed by a failure to ever declare that potential conflict which in turn led to a complaint and these issues being investigated. "Having a clear legislative and policy framework

alongside thorough training which ensures people understand those policies, protects the reputation of the people and organisations involved, and promotes workplace harmony.

"And getting the right people into the right roles benefits not just the council itself but also ratepayers who receive better public services as a result."

The Commission's finding comes after a 2021 report by the Tasmanian Audit Office recommended appointment processes for council general-managers also be conducted on a merit basis.

The report concluded that it was probable that these misconduct risks were not isolated to the one council.

Celebrating Ayyam-i-Ha

On Saturday, 25 February Habib and Fahimeh Niakansafy of Redwood Village hosted a celebration of Ayyam-i-Ha attended by about 25 friends and community members.

Ayyam-i-Ha means intercalary days.

They are four or five days inserted into the calendar to make it fit into the solar year.

The Bahá'í Faith has a calendar, comprised of nineteen months, each of which has nineteen days making a total of 361 days.

The days of Ayyam-i- Ha bring the total of days in the year up to 365 days in a normal year and 366 in a leap year.

These intercalary days are days of giving: a time of

celebration, of bringing the community together and finding ways to reach out to anyone in need.

They come before the month of fasting from March 2 to March 20 when adult members of the Bahá'í community abstain from food and drink from sunrise to sunset, and spend time in meditation and prayer in preparation for the Bahá'í New Year.

This is similar to the period of Lent in the Christian calendar when Christians give up something in memory of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and spend time in contemplation and prayer in preparation for Easter.

The celebration of Ayyam-i-Ha this year in Kingborough included a potluck dinner, socialising and games enjoyed by all.

Questions over amalgamation of councils

The Australian Services Union (ASU) say the Local Government Minister and the Tasmanian Liberals must come clean with Tasmanians about plans for forced amalgamations.

The Liberal Party has commissioned a Local Government Board which is presenting amalgamations as an option to create fewer, larger councils and centralised services.

"The Minister must rule out forced amalgamations or any changes without genuine community support and legislation passing both houses of Parliament," ASU Victoria Tasmania branch secretary Lisa Darmanin said.

"Workers and communities will be dismayed by this news. "Reforms should never leave any Tasmanian worse off and should not be done in an underhanded way."

Minister for Local Government Nic Street said "The Tasmanian Government commissioned the independent Board to undertake the Future of Local Government

Review, over twelve months ago".

"The process has been completely transparent," Minister Street said.

"That's why the Board published its Interim Report and Options Paper, which was released on 14 December 2022

""I will be waiting to see what the Board has to say at the end of the Review about the options and models that it believes have the best chance of delivering better services to Tasmanians.

"I won't be drawn by Labor or the unions into a politically-motivated 'rule in-rule out' game.

"I will invite submissions on the Board's report as I am required to do under the Local Government Act and I will ensure the sector is involved in the conversations and direction we take as a State.

"Our local communities deserve better council services now and into the future."

During the Channel Highway upgrade, a section of Channel Highway Kingston will be closed to traffic for approximately 10 weeks.


Although traffic will be restricted, pedestrians will have access to all the businesses and services on the Channel Highway during construction.






