## **Testing continues at Blackmans Bay**

Members of the Kingborough community have continued to ask questions and express concerns regarding the recent Blackmans Bay water contamination.

The public were advised against swimming at Blackmans Bay Beach following a sewerage blockage and spill on Friday, March 24.

The Kingborough Council announced an update on Facebook on April 6 advising the no swim advisory signage had been removed from Blackmans Bay Beach following a water quality result.

The source of the contamination has not yet been identified and Council are continuing to investigate.

Community members have taken to this Facebook post to make suggestions of potential causes for this contamination and to express their concerns.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* has brought the community's thoughts to Kingborough Council for comment.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said investigating the poor water quality at Blackmans Bay Beach is, and will continue to be, a priority for Council.

"Local Councils, the Derwent Estuary Program and the Environmental Protection Authority collect water samples from 35 sites throughout the Derwent Estuary each Tuesday during swimming season, from the start of December to the end of March," Cr Wriedt said.

"This program is called the Beach Watch Program and it has been running for over 20 years.

"Following the high levels of bacteria (enterococci) detected at Blackmans Bay Beach as part of the Program, Council erected signs advising against swimming.

"On April 6, test results improved, and the no swim advisory signs were taken down. "While the cumming season

"While the swimming season has finished and signs have now been removed, Council Officers continue to investigate recent poor water quality trends at the beach.

"The presence of this type of bacteria in water samples is an indicator of faecal contamination." Story continues on page 3

## A clear threat to other road users

#### Dear Editor.

A recent correspondent to the Chronicle suggested there was little reason to change the current 60km/h speed limit through Kettering.

Kettering Community Association (KCA) takes a different view and believes that for reasons of safety this should be reduced to 50km/h and has been pressing its case for at least four years with the full support of Kingborough Council, but so far without success.

Kettering is a growing community with a consequent rise in traffic.

It is clear some drivers of cars and trucks regularly exceed the speed limit, and this poses a clear threat to other road users, especially pedestrians.

Along the Channel Highway and adjoining roads in Kettering there are nine road junctions, more than 20 businesses, seven private marinas and a range of community venues (including access to well-used walking tracks) with service driveways.

In addition, Kettering has a number of Metro bus stops, it's a pick-up and drop-off point for regular school buses and is now catering for a significant increase in visitors using the Bruny ferries. The post office/general store/service station is

constantly busy, and for those people trying to enter or exit, sight-lines for oncoming traffic are restricted.

Some years ago, when KCA first raised the case for a lower speed limit on Channel Highway, the Department of State Growth responded "pedestrian activity across the road is not sufficient to justify a lower speed limit". Kettering Community Association takes the view that,

given a growing township, increased residential development and a rise in commercial activity, the situation has now changed and in the interests of safety the time is long overdue for the speed limit to be reduced to 50km/h in line with limits in Margate and Woodbridge.







## Bacteria free beaches

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said there are many ways that bacteria can end up in beach water including animal faeces and other material being washed down the roads, large flocks of seagulls in the water and sewerage spills.

"There have been a number of sewer spills recently that may have contributed to the poor water quality results," Cr Wriedt said.

"One of the main ways people can help prevent blockages is by putting only the three P's down the toilet-poo, pee and (toilet) paper.

"Council's Stormwater Investigations Officer has been on the ground across the catchment, testing outfalls, checking connections and following up reports of contamination to trace the possible bacteria sources.

"Council will also be working collaboratively with TasWater across the cooler months, sampling and actively investigating the Blackmans Bay catchment.

"Blackmans Bay water quality is an important priority for Council, and we do appreciate the community alerting us to issues that they see in their areas.'

Hands on a food run on Good Friday, April 6. "The team at Kingborough Helping Hands provide an incredible service to the local community and we thought they might need some extra helping hands over Easter," said Huon Aquaculture's Community Relations Adviser Kristy Harrison.

"It was great to be able to add the Huon smoked salmon packs as a special extra to the everyday essential food supplies that Edna and her volunteers provide on a weekly basis.

"It's a really challenging time for a lot of people in our community and the team at Huon Aquaculture just wanted to do something to help make a difference.'

In 2013, Edna Pennicott established Kingborough Helping Hands (KHH) to provide an organisational structure for the work she had been doing for decades.

KHH provides food and household essentials to people experiencing financial difficulty.



## Pilot phase for transit officers begins

#### Phase one of the pilot of transit officers on public transport services is now operational to discourage antisocial and aggressive behaviour.

"This increased safety presence on our bus services is highly visible and ensures our public transport system is as safe as possible for commuters and bus drivers," Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said.

"Deployment will cover general access services in the south, targeting key urban corridors on both metropolitan and regional services and across different operators. Observations from this deployment will assist the Department of State Growth in informing phase two and the future operational model, including the development of new regulations and protocols to allow for body-worn cameras and expanded powers.

"I have also tasked State Growth with the development of a mechanism to enable easier reporting of nonurgent incidents of antisocial behaviour. "The vast majority of trips on our buses are incidentfree, but these actions will bring comfort to our drivers and the majority of passengers who enjoy using public transport.

"These initiatives are in addition to CCTV cameras on all Metro buses which assist with safety and security on board and with investigations by Tasmania Police.


"Metro also has a long-standing partnership with police for a dedicated resource.

"I look forward to announcing further details as we move into phase two of the pilot, and thank the members of the Safe Public Transport Working Group-including Metro Tasmania, Tasmania Police, other bus operators, State Growth and the Rail, Tram and Bus Union-for their valuable contributions and look forward to their continuing support and input as we progress these initiatives."



## Be mindful of meningococcal

The Department of Health is encouraging the public to be aware that meningococcal disease still occurs in Tasmania after a case was recently diagnosed in the state's south.

A 17-year-old male from southern Tasmania was diagnosed with meningococcal disease, the second case in Tasmania this year.

Director of Public Health Dr Mark Veitch said anyone with a suspected infection should see a doctor immediately. "Meningococcal disease is a rare but serious contagious disease that can develop quickly and be fatal," said Dr Veitch.

"Early detection and treatment of cases can save lives, which means anyone with a suspected meningococcal infection needs to seek emergency medical care immediately.

"The symptoms of meningococcal disease include fever, severe headache, confusion, severe muscle pain and rash.

"People with meningococcal disease can go from feeling well to being extremely ill very quickly.

"Babies and infants may not have these symptoms but can be unsettled or drowsy, pale or blotchy, floppy and not feeding."

The Director of Public Health said the case also highlighted the continued importance of vaccination

against meningococcal disease. "This case is a reminder of the importance of getting vaccinated against meningococcal disease," said Dr

Veitch. "Vaccination against the meningococcal A, C, W and Y strains is routinely provided free as part of the National Immunisation Program for children aged 12 months and as part of the school-based program for students in year 10.

"A vaccine is available to protect against the meningococcal B strain for children from six weeks of age. "This vaccine is free for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander infants.

"Others wishing to protect themselves or their family against meningococcal B can purchase the vaccine through their General Practitioner with a private script. "In the last three years there has been an average of three cases per year."

Meningococcal disease is caused by bacteria called Neisseria meningitidis.

Meningococcal disease is more common during winter and spring but can occur at any time in any place and affect people of any age.



## **Continuing to be road safe after Operation Safe Arrival**

#### Operation Safe Arrival is a road safety initiative that was launched over Easter.

Road Safety Advisory Council Chair Scott Tilyard said Easter is a particularly dangerous time on the roads with more vehicles driving to holiday destinations around the state, often travelling long distances on less familiar roads, and with many drivers towing a caravan, boat or trailer.

"The Easter holidays are a popular time to get away with family and friends, but drivers need to take every precaution to ensure they get to their destination safely," said Mr Tilyard.

"It's easy to become frustrated and impatient but making the right decisions on the road can be the difference between life and death, so I urge all motorists to slow down, drive to the conditions and take regular breaks to ward off fatigue.

"Over the past five years, three people have died over the Easter period (from Good Friday to Easter Tuesday) and 19 have been seriously injured.

"We don't want to lose another life, or leave another family heartbroken, which is why we're asking every Tasmanian to plan ahead and be safe on our roads." Whilst Operation Safe Arrival may have officially wrapped up, police will continue their effort to keep people safe on Tasmanian roads.

"This Easter, police have been doing what we can to crack down on dangerous behaviours like speeding, mobile phone use, and driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs," said Acting Assistant Commissioner Jason Elmer. "We've had high-visibility and covert patrols on our highways and main roads, and we've been covering other routes, back streets and rural areas.

"We want to thank most road users for doing the right thing, and heeding our advice about slowing down, paying attention, buckling up, stopping and resting to avoid fatigue and never driving after drinking or taking drugs.

"Unfortunately, there's far too many people who ignored our warnings, and deliberately put themselves and others in danger." Operation Sofe Arrival's state wide traffic enforcement activities spanned April 6 to April 11






