# Considering council consolidation

The Local Government Board publicly released its Stage Two Interim Report on the Future of Local Government Review last week.

ISSUE No. 677

The Report outlines the level of community engagement and research undertaken to identify, develop and test reform options during Stage Two of the Review.

The Report establishes how the Board will approach the development of its final package of reform options in Stage Three.

Whilst the Report reveals the Board is open to a range of possible outcomes, their preferred approach is to consolidate existing council boundaries to create a smaller number of larger, more capable councils.

This proposal is informed by research, analysis and community feedback.

The Board's findings indicated most Tasmanians believe they have too many councils for the population, with one in three believing the current number is right or that we should have more.

The Report stated 80 per cent

of Tasmanians do not mind which level of government provides services locally, as long as they are delivered well.

The Tasmanian Conservation Trust has findings that indicate councils are opposed to amalgamation, with close to half of all councils against it and one quarter in support.

The Kingborough Chronicle reached out to Kingborough Deputy Mayor Clare Glade-Wright for comment.

"I support a strategic approach to boundary adjustments," Cr Glade-Wright said.

"I don't believe banging two councils together is necessarily a good approach but redrawing boundary lines which has considered how councils can function more efficiently can only be good for local communities."

The Board will be accepting public feedback about the Report until June 21.

Minister for Local Government Nic Street said Stage Three will have the Board working closely with councils and communities to explore what the future shape of the local government sector could look like.

"What is now clear from the Stage Two Report is that the Board is seriously and actively considering a suite of structural reform measures which, if implemented, would fundamentally alter the current structure and design of the Tasmanian local government sector," Minister Street said.

"I want to strongly encourage all Tasmanians to get involved, so that we can all build a system of local government that can meet the challenges and seize the opportunities we will face in the decades to come.

"The Board's reform proposals are highly complex and require substantial further technical analysis and design work during the third and final stage.

"In response to requests from both the Board and the Local Government Association of Tasmania, I have agreed to extend the Review's final reporting date by three months, to 30 September 2023.

"This will provide the necessary time for the community and the sector to be able to meaningfully engage on reform proposals."

# Kingborough represents in Virtus Global Games

Kingborough's Rebecca Mathers has been selected to represent Australia in the Virtus Global Games that commence on June 4, 2023.

Rebecca is one of three athletes selected for her event groups. This competition is being held in France in the province of Vichy. The Virtus Global Games is the largest multiple sports competition for athletes with an intellectual impairment with over 1000

athletes expected to be competing in seven days of competition. Rebecca trains two hours a day, five days a week, and around this fits in a permanent position at Adventure Patch's Ocean View Child Care Centre to support her to be able to compete as an athlete. Rebecca has commenced fundraising for the event.

The Kingborough Council was the first to celebrate Rebecca's selection with a kind donation to support her with this opportunity.

Rebecca holds state records in discus, hammer, shot put, and javelin and is ranked in the top three in Australia for those events. The Virtus Global Games are the pinnacle of the sport for her particular para classification with only the World Championships and Paralympics being considered higher for para-athletics.

The Virtus Global Games provide an opportunity to develop as an elite athlete and showcase what is required to take the next step in athletics

# **Public scrutiny**

Are you aware that Hazell Bros are proposing to double the output from their Leslie Vale quarry to 2 million tonnes pa?

To achieve this, there will be substantial increases in traffic to and from the mine, increased blasting, and some processes, such as crushing, will become 24-hour

It seems inevitable that such a large increase in scale will lead to even greater emissions of noise, dust, greenhouse gases, and diesel exhaust from what is already one of Tasmania's largest mining operations.

Unlike other smaller quarries in Tasmania (e.g. the Hanson Lindisfarne quarry) Hazell Bros do not report any of their emissions to the National Pollutant Inventory so there is no publicly available information on their atmospheric emissions but they are likely to be high and certainly higher than other quarries.

Given that new housing developments in Kingston are within about 2 km of the mine it is appropriate that this mine expansion be subject to thorough public scrutiny.

(Note that the draft guidelines for the EIS have just been released and public comment closes on 1 May).

# **Irrigation for Blackmans Bay**

Construction works are set to commence on a facility at Blackmans Bay.

The facility will treat wastewater purchased from TasWater to Class A irrigation quality (meaning while not potable, it can be used to irrigate crops suitable for human consumption).

This untreated wastewater is currently released into the Derwent River.

An important milestone has also been reached on the Arm End Public and Recreation Area and Golf Course project, with construction works commencing on the 14-kilometre pipe network to provide irrigation water to the South Arm Peninsula.

Batchelor Construction Group have been engaged as the Managing Contractor for this exciting project.

"It is anticipated that the pipeline will be completed and commissioned in early 2024, which subject to approvals will allow us to expand the significant revegetation aspect of the project and watering the golf links course during the summer and early autumn growing season," said Mary Ann's Island Pty Ltd Director Jack Chrapot.

"This revegetation is a crucial part of restoring the country after almost 200 hundred years of agricultural activities that have severely impacted the cultural

"These revegetation areas will be approximately twice the size of the golf links course.

"Once operational, around 2.6 megalitres of water per day will be purchased and treated from TasWater and piped to the South Arm Peninsula.

"It is anticipated that roughly one quarter of this water will be required for the Arm End public recreation area and golf course, while the remainder will be available for broader irrigation purposes.'

When completed, the pipeline will cross the Derwent River from Blackmans Bay to Half Moon Bay, then run north and south on the South Arm Peninsula.

Vos Construction and Joinery has been appointed to deliver the new Kingborough Child and Family Learning Centre, with building works expected to commence this month.


Minister for Education, Children and Youth Roger Jaensch said the new Kingborough centre, to be co-located on the Kingston Primary School site, was part of a \$28 million commitment by the State Government to deliver six new Child and Family Learning Centres around Tasmania.

"These centres offer a variety of critical services all in one place to support families with children from birth to age five and are part of our government's commitment to supporting our youngest learners and their parents and carers," Minister Jaensch said.

"Once the works are completed, the new Child and Family Learning Centre will be a welcoming place for families with young children in the Kingborough region." Each of the centres are tailored to their local community, with extensive community consultation undertaken during the development stage playing a key role in the final design and services provided.

# **Fuel reduction burns**

The State's Fire Permit Period for 2022-23 has ended and communities are asked to use this time to reduce fuel loads ahead of next summer.

Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management Felix Ellis said the end of the fire permit period means that landowners can now complete fuel reduction burns on their land to manage bushfire risk and avoid potential future devastation to property and infrastructure.

"Fuel loads are high after a number of wet years and with the potential for a hot, high-risk, El Nino summer ahead we need to reduce the danger now," Minister Ellis said.

"Landowners still need to take steps like managing the size of your fire, considering conditions and working closely with your neighbours to make sure that fire and the smoke from your burn isn't going to impact

"Tasmania's Fuel Reduction Program strategically reduces bushfire risk in the areas that provide the most protection to communities, critical infrastructure and natural values."

Minister for Primary Industries Jo Palmer said the Fuel Reduction Program was highly consultative with vineyards and noted this behaviour should be the model for private landowners seeking to conduct burns

"Engagement with neighbours in the vicinity of any planned burning is critical to ensure smoke will not

adversely affect farming or harvesting operations," Minister Palmer said.

"We emphasise this when it comes to the wine industry, which is particularly vulnerable to smoke at this time of year.

"All landowners should consider whether there is a vineyard nearby - it could be across a river, or over a hill, and it might not be obvious.

"Engage with them early and ahead of time and be open to negotiation and working together so that we can ensure our lands are bushfire safe, and our grapes can be harvested safely."

Landowners can learn more about how they can reduce the potential impact of smoke taint by going to Wine Tasmania's website and downloading the TasVine resource.

Last year nearly 32,500 hectares of strategic land was burned to reduce the impact of bushfire.

Between the start of the 2022-23 Fire Permit Period and April 4, the Tasmania Fire Service issued 968 fire permits and responded to more than 709 vegetation fires across the State.

The Tasmanian Government has invested more than \$112.3 million into the Fuel Reduction Program since 2014.

Landowners should contact the Tasmania Fire Service to register their burns and ask for any advice they might need on 1800 000 699 or visit fire.tas.gov.au for more information.

# Palliative care campaign launch in Kingston

Palliative Care Tasmania launched a campaign on Wednesday, April 19 at John St Medical Centre.

Palliative Care - It's more than you think has been created to engage the community in a conversation about the benefits of palliative care. The campaign seeks to challenge perceptions that palliative care is a

'last resort' "At its heart, it is a clear and simple message; the campaign is aimed at

informing, empowering and encouraging Tasmanians living with a life-limiting illness to engage with their health care professionals early in their diagnosis, so as to live as well as possible for as long as possible," said Acting CEO of Palliative Care Tasmania Venéy Hiller. "Palliative care really is more than you think.

"Sometimes palliative care can support people for many months, or even

"People need to know that palliative care is available to anyone with a life-limiting illness, regardless of their postcode, diagnosis, age, ethnicity, socio-economic status or place of care, to enable them to live as well as possible for as long as possible.

Ms Hiller officially launched the campaign with thanks to the John St Medical Centre staff for their commitment to palliative care.

Premier Jeremy Rockliff said the government is supporting Palliative Care Tasmania with \$4.25 million in funding over four years.

Palliative Care Tasmania also plans to deliver a separate Advance Care Planning awareness campaign later this year encouraging people to make future decisions about their healthcare if they were to become seriously ill and unable to communicate their preferences or make treatment decisions





# Finding Tasmania's next Olympians

The Tasmanian Institute of Sport (TIS) is introducing Talent ID in preparation for the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Minister for Sport and Recreation Nic Street said the talent identification testing would be open to Tasmanian athletes aged 12 to 22.

"The TIS has a goal to test 1000 athletes across seven testing sessions in May in Hobart, Launceston and Penguin," he said.

"It is the first time the TIS has run a large-scale Talent ID testing program for athletes in more than a decade. "Tasmania had a proud history of producing world-class athletes.

"This talent identification program will work to uncover the next batch of talented athletes through testing.

"Identified athletes will be offered further opportunities to train and develop with the TIS through this great program.

"This program provides the perfect opportunity to give Tasmania the best chance to contribute to winning medals at an Australian Olympic and Paralympic Games."

TIS Senior Coordinator Talent Identification Gina Vernon said the testing would identify athletes who had natural upper and lower body power, good endurance and mental capabilities.

"With Brisbane 2032 only nine years away, we have to start work now to get our talent pool in the best shape possible," Dr Vernon said.

"The range of tests used vary from the classic beep test, to a 20-metre sprint and vertical jump.

"We are looking for athletes from all sporting backgrounds who may find themselves being perfect for a sport they have never tried before."





