Responses to roundabout

The Department of State Growth is constructing a roundabout on the Channel Highway at Huntingfield and a north-bound slip lane to connect the Channel Highway to the Kingston Bypass.

Kingborough Councillor David Bain posted an announcement of this roadwork on Facebook. MP Dean Winter responded to the post that construction works were 15 months behind schedule. The *Kingborough Chronicle* reached out to MP Winter for comment.

"We are in a housing crisis and so it's hard to believe how long the Liberals have taken to get it started," he said.

"Minister Ferguson suggested to the Council they include a condition for a slip lane in their approval - then when they included one, he tried to take them to the tribunal.

"As far as I am aware, they still do not have approval to build a northern slip lane."

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said "The new roundabout will include a north-bound slip lane and preliminary construction activities have commenced at the Huntingfield roundabout site, however construction has been delayed due to three further requests from the Council for additional information with the most recent request received from the Council on 31 March 2023".

Festival of Ridván

On Saturday, April 29 the Bahá'í community of Kingborough celebrated Festival of Ridván, the holiest time on the Bahá'í calendar, by planting around 100 native flowering shrubs and groundcovers at the Dru Point Bicentennial Park in Margate.

This was done in collaboration with the Kingborough Council, and Bridget Jupe (aka BJ), the Council's Natural Areas Interpretation Officer, supervised the planting and participated in the celebration.

Ridván commemorates 12 days in 1863 spent by Bahá'u'lláh Founder of the Bahá'í Faith in the Garden of Ridván situated on the bank of the Tigris River, on the outskirts of Baghdad.

Around 40 people attended.

It follows on from the very successful planting in August 2020 of 100 trees and plants to mark the 100th anniversary of the

Bahá'í Faith's arrival in Australia, and a further planting in a second bed in 2021.

The plants were purchased from Redbreast Nursery in Margate and donated by the Bahá'í community.



Some were used to fill in gaps in the areas planted previously and the rest in a third garden bed close to the river.

The area planted by the Bahá'í community is visible as you drive into the park at Dru Point, and is a space designed for contemplation.

The plants include a line of black gums planted in 2020 now flourishing next to the path leading down to the Aboriginal Reconciliation Garden and the waterfront.

The black gum provides a food source and habitat for the Swift Parrot, a threatened species which breeds only in Tasmania.

New roundabout causes concerns

Kingborough Councillor David Bain said he had posted
an announcement of the new roundabout because he
thinks it is very important this type of information is
shared amongst the community, especially when it's a
project of such a size that has been in the pipeline for
quite some time.

"Initially the Development Application in relation to the
Huntingfield roundabout came to Council without the slip
lane included," Cr Bain said.

"The previous Council need to be congratulated for
listening to the feedback from the people of Kingborough
and working with the State Government in relation to
having a slip lane at this location.

"Margate and Snug are growing at a rate of knots, so
it's crucial those vehicles can flow through to Kingston
and further abroad, without interruption.

"Likewise, the Huntingfield roundabout will play an
important part in diverting additional Huntingfield traffic
away from an already congested Algonia Road roundabout.

"I have heard residents raise concerns around the
proximity of the roundabout to the crest of the hill and
also wanting to see pedestrian and cycle access at the
roundabout to connect two major residential areas
(Whitewater Park Estate and Huntingfield), hopefully
these are addressed in the detailed design documents."

Kingborough resident Samantha Nicolson brought such
concerns to Kingborough Council when the roadworks
were first proposed.

"Every car that uses the new roundabout to exit
Huntingfield to head north will break the stream of
north-bound traffic from the Channel area," Sam wrote
in an email to Kingborough Council back in March 2021.

"This will lead to significant traffic build up, right back
into Margate.

"In autumn, when the sun is rising during this shift
worker and tradesman early commute, the sun will be
shining in north-bound drivers' eyes-lowering visibility
on the approach to the new roundabout.

"Individual cars with right of way crossing into the
stream of north-bound traffic will interrupt the flow of
traffic and risk accidents.

"A roundabout may be the easiest/cheapest 'solution'
to enabling traffic into/out of the new Huntingfield
subdivision, but that doesn't make it neutral or of
'acceptable' impact on the Channel community living
south of Huntingfield."

Sam Nicolson said, when approached by the
Kingborough Chronicle, that she did not feel these
concerns were ever seriously addressed.

A Kingborough Council spokesperson said "Council
considered the submission made by Samantha
Nicolson in relation to the Development Application
DA-2020-676 for the roundabout".

"The DA application was assessed in accordance with
the requirements of the planning scheme and the
application was approved.

"Any further questions should be directed to the owners
of the project, Department of State Growth."

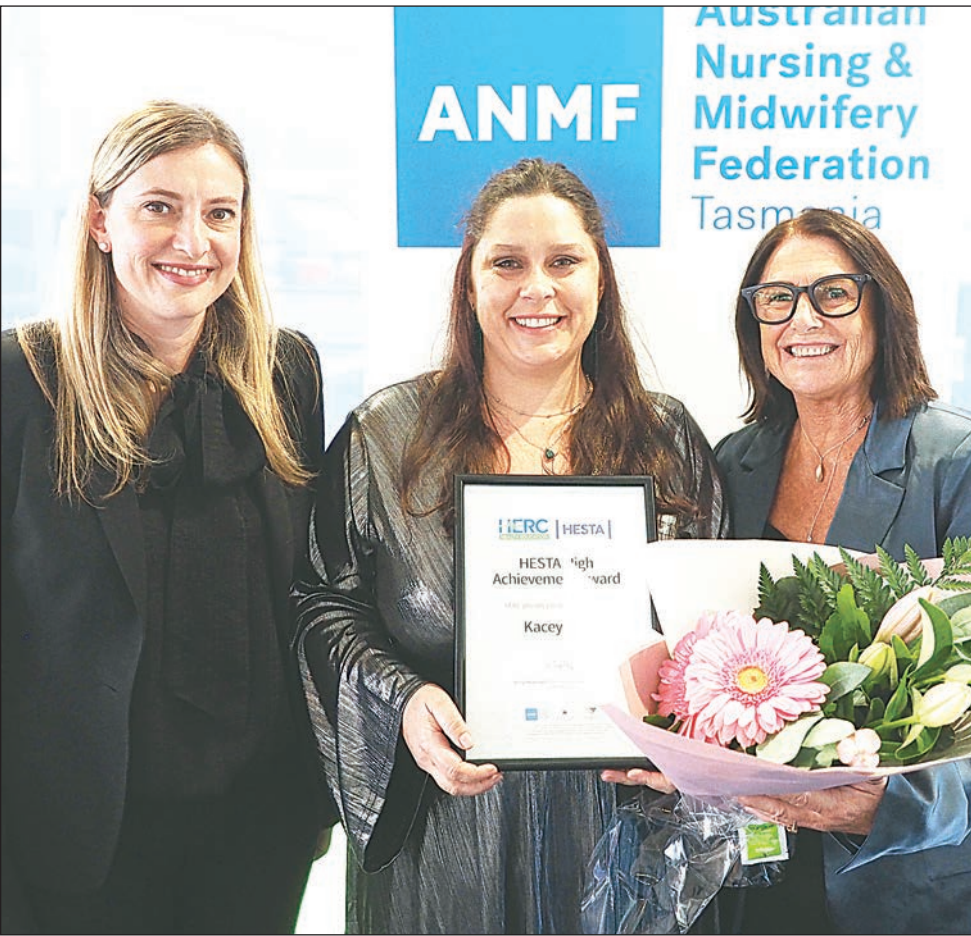

Oyster reefs restored

National Resource Management South (NRM South) is working with The Nature Conservancy to restore two hectares of native Angasi oyster reef in southeast Tasmania's Derwent Estuary and D'Entrecasteaux Channel.

"Under the Reef Builder program, The Nature Conservancy is working to restore shellfish reefs across Australia," said NRM South's Marine and Water Program Manager Jennifer Hamer.

"Our sites are the only Reef Builder sites located in Tasmania, and our state is also home to the only remaining functioning Angasi oyster reef in Australia."

NRM South started construction works at two sites (Helliwells Point in Woodbridge and Dixons Beach in Tarooma) in late April.

While there will be some temporary restrictions on boating or swimming activities during this construction period, the long-term benefits of reef restoration are significant.

Once the construction works are complete, the new reef will be seeded with juvenile native oysters.

For anyone planning to visit these areas during the construction works, there will be a notice to mariners outlining the specific construction area and minimum distances for recreational boats, swimmers and commercial vessels to transit the area with care.

Community food relief grants now open

The Tasmanian Government is launching its first Tasmanian Community Food Relief Grants Program, with a total funding pool of \$300,000 over two years.

Minister for Community Services and Development Nic Street said the grants will support community food relief organisations to reduce the rate of food insecurity in their local communities.

“The first round of this program will provide \$150,000 for Tasmanian food relief organisations to apply for grants of up to \$10,000 each,” Minister Street said.

“The grant program is designed to help Tasmanians by funding existing food relief organisations to provide no-cost and low-cost food through both hampers and ready-to-eat meals.”

Minister Street said since 2018 the Tasmanian Government has provided more than \$9 million toward the delivery of food relief across the state and had increased its investment in statewide emergency food relief providers by 20 per cent.

“We recognise that food security is more important now than ever,” Minister Street said.

“We know many Tasmanian household budgets are stretched, and we know that we need to ensure there are multiple ways for Tasmanians to access healthy and nutritious food, particularly for those who need help.

“That is why we have invested an additional \$2 million through the Food Relief to Food Resilience Action Plan to help ensure Tasmanians have access to sufficient, quality and nutritious food.”

Upgrades to school speed limit signs

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said nearly 600 electronic speed limit signs at school zones throughout Tasmania have been replaced with upgraded and networked signs under a \$9.5 million program jointly funded by the Australian and Tasmanian governments.

"The new solar-powered signs have an electronic display that will notify drivers when school crossings are active and display the applicable speed limit," said Minister Ferguson.

"The technology links them to the Tasmanian Department of State Growth's Traffic Management Centre in Hobart.

"This will allow any faults to be identified and managed remotely, reducing the amount of time they are out of action, as well as ongoing maintenance costs.

"They can also operate without sunlight and in adverse weather for extended periods of time using internal backup batteries.

"The signs can also relay important information about vehicle and pedestrian traffic which will help manage the road environment better.

"Road safety in school zones is a high priority and electronic signs help keep drivers aware of changed conditions such as the reduced speed during peak school drop off and pickup times."

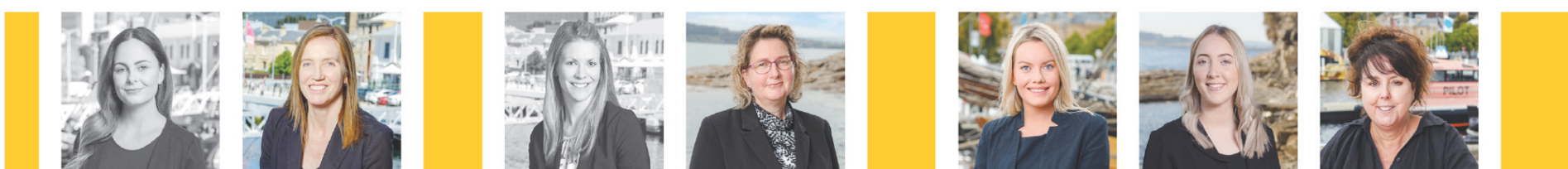

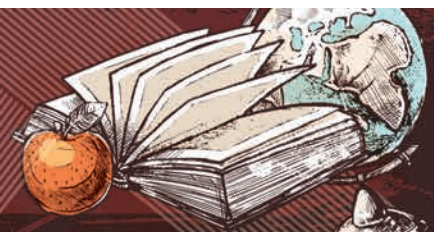

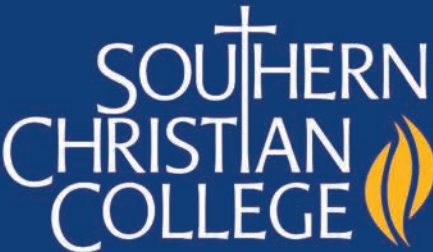
