Liberals are in the minority

The Tasmanian Liberals now lead a minority government following Bass MP Lara Alexander and Lyons MP John Tucker resigning from the Liberal Party to sit as independents instead. Ms Alexander and Mr Tucker cited the anticipated Macquarie Point

Stadium as a factor in their decision.

The proposed stadium has been a point of contention with the Federal Budget committing \$240 million to the Macquarie Point urban renewal redevelopment announced last week.

Labor holds nine seats, the Greens hold two and there are now three

independents. "I am obviously disappointed, but this is their decision," Premier

Jeremy Rockliff said. "We will continue getting on with the job of building a strong

economy and a safe, caring community.' "Our absolute focus remains on getting things done and delivering

the things Tasmanians care about," said Deputy Premier Michael Ferguson.

Discussing crime rates in Kingston

Kingston's Ann Osbourne recently shared concerns over the crime rate in Kingston over the past months with the Kingborough Chronicle.

Ms Osbourne posed the question: Why is the Kingston Police Station not on a 24-hour shift basis?

'This region is the fastest growing area in Tasmania, although classified as a suburb and not a city which provides a reason for having a 'country station' instead of a fully manned station 24 hours a day," Ms Osbourne said.

A number of burglaries in Blackmans Bay took place from May 5 to May 8.

Property stolen included money, wallets, handbags, laptops and jewellery.

The Tasmania Police posted on their website requesting members of the public to submit any information or to report suspicious behaviour. On May 8 as well, three youths rummaged through the St Vincent's donations

Ms Osbourne said had the police station been manned a quick phone call and hopefully immediate response could have resulted in the apprehension of the three youths.

'The current level of crime and offenders not being apprehended indicates lack of police presence in Kingborough and is unacceptable, said Ms Osbourne.

"Due to the increase of recruits being trained at the Academy it is requested that more police presence is provided to Kingborough, both car drive pasts and walking patrols."

The Kingborough Chronicle reached out to a representative of the Kingston Police for response.

"Kingborough is actively policed through day and afternoon shifts and an on-call roster," said Commander Jason Elmer of the Southern District.

"This includes 24-hour response from Hobart Police Station, as well as other police units such as road policing, criminal investigation, and other uniformed divisions.

"The Kingborough region is serviced by an Inspector and includes stations at Kingston, Woodbridge and Alonnah.

"Staff at Kingston Police Station has nearly doubled over the past 10 years from 12 in 2012 to 23 in 2023.

"Crime rates do fluctuate due to criminal group trends and the activities of a small number of high-volume offenders, but what's important to remember is that the overall crime rate over the past 18 years has decreased significantly.

"Our frontline officers are advising that the level of youth offending, particularly in the Southern District, has increased, and there are ongoing challenges in dealing with these offenders.


"These concerns are being reiterated through our discussions with key stakeholders, including local businesses and local councils, including in the Kingborough area.

"We need the community's help to get the message to those people that choose to do the wrong thing - anti-social and unlawful behaviours will not be tolerated as everyone has the right to be safe in our community.

'If you see unlawful or anti-social behaviour, please report it to police at the time to allow us to investigate promptly.'

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Tasmania is not leading the nation in what matters

Dear Editor,

You might have heard recently about the latest 'State of the States' report from an outfit called CommSec that ranks Australian states by some questionable growth measures such as economic growth (Gross State Product), population growth and investment, among others.

The ABC news website's headline said that Tasmania was again Australia's "best-performing" economy.

Well, that depends on what you measure. What is good for CommSec's bottom line is not necessarily good for ordinary Tasmanians.

CommSec is a business selling finance and brokerage services yet the ABC seemingly regurgitated its media release as if CommSec is some kind of independent, scientific authority.

There is a lot of data one could choose to evaluate a state's economic performance, but ideology rather than objectivity is typically the guiding principle.

A useful evaluation would include data on general wellbeing: the state of the natural environment: inequality; private-sector debt; the housing crisis and homelessness; the health crisis; corruption; human rights; and general sustainability.

Put another way, we should ask if the costs of growth are greater than the benefits - producing uneconomic growth - but if you don't ask you'll never know. Costs seem mostly ignored in the CommSec ranking of what matters

The ABC report, as usual, had no critique of mainstream economics and its growth obsession despite the vast amount of 'post-growth' scholarship that not only questions the validity of mainstream economics but warns of a looming global collapse and mass suffering.

This scholarship says that degrowth will happen whether we like it or not, not least because of a shortage of energy, but also because of a shortage of resources in general as we rapidly convert them into waste.

Growth economics has given us a climate catastrophe (and broader environmental crises) as well as inadequate climate 'solutions'.

It is regarded by its critics as a heads-in-the-sand pseudo-science that rewards those who are compliant and punishes dissent.

Rather than offering refutations to its critics, mainstream economics mostly ignores them.

Opponents say it is barely tethered to the real world, existing in artificial computer models where starting assumptions are less important than finding an answer that conforms to ideology.

There are economic textbooks from top academic publishing houses that are highly critical of mainstream economics but the ABC (and others) act as if they don't exist. That is misleading.

The most recent figures show that Tasmania has an unemployment rate of 3.8 per cent and an

underemployment rate of 7.6 per cent, giving a labour underutilisation rate of 11.4 per cent, which is the worst in Australia.

Tasmania is also the worst state, or one of the worst, in respect to homelessness and rental stress - the annual Anglicare Rental Affordability Snapshot makes for grim reading.

The Tasmanian State of the Environment report, supposedly published every five years, was last sighted in 2009

It was due in 2014 and again in 2019 (and of course next year) but is now seemingly as endangered as the Tasmanian Tiger.

A healthy natural environment - sometimes called natural capital - is the ultimate source of all wealth and wellbeing, yet we continue to destroy it in the name of growth.

The most recent federal State of the Environment report (2021) identified both economic growth and population growth as key drivers of environmental harm. It appears the experts are yet again being ignored.

The CommSec view of the world - devoid of an understanding of the natural sciences - can be contrasted with recent speeches from the President of Ireland, such as his April 28 speech, where he lambasts mainstream economics

It would be nice if the ABC reported it. **Stephen Williams**

Federal Treasurer Jim Chalmers delivered the 2023/2024 Federal Budget last week.

In response to cost-of-living pressures faced by many Australians, the Federal Budget is committing a 15 per cent increase in Commonwealth Rent Assistance and an extra \$31 a fortnight for people renting in the private market and community housing, among other changes. The Kingborough Chronicle reached out to the Tenants' Union of Tasmania, a not-for-profit organisation that offers tenancy advice and support, for their thoughts on these changes.

"We welcome the Federal Government's commitment to increasing the maximum rate of rent assistance by \$31 per fortnight," said Principal Solicitor of the Tenants' Union of Tasmania Benedict Bartl.

"The increase will provide cost-of-living relief for Tasmanian renters in the private rental market.

"But rents in the private rental market have increased by between \$40-\$150 per week across the Kingborough Council over the last two years.'



Celebrating volunteers with Kingston Park parkrun

National Volunteer Week is Australia's largest annual celebration of volunteering, taking place from May 15-21.

This year's theme is *The Change Makers*, recognising the contribution of volunteers around the country and encouraging others to consider volunteering.

Kingston Park parkrun, which takes place every Saturday at 9.00am at Kingston Park, has been a volunteering success story since it launched on August 21, 2019.

During that time, 238 different people have volunteered at Kingston Park parkrun, carrying out a combined total of 1289 different volunteer roles.

The volunteers have supported 2879 (over 300 on one Saturday recently) people to complete the five kilometre course on 17,598 occasions.

Volunteer Event Director at Kingston Park parkrun Matthew Roadnight said "Everyone in the community is invited to give parkrun volunteering a try".

"parkrun is all about having fun in a relaxed and welcoming environment.

"All the volunteer roles are super simple and there are a wide variety of opportunities, from welcoming first timers to marshalling on the course to handing out finish tokens as people finish the 5k.

"We even have volunteers during the week, for example who coordinate our volunteer roster and post on our social media channels.

"Our volunteer roster is never full and there is a role to suit everyone!"

Kingston Park parkrun is one of 470 parkruns across Australia, with more than 143,000 different people volunteering at the free weekly events since the country's first parkrun in 2011.

A recent national survey of almost 38,000 Australian parkrunners revealed that people who volunteer experience significant health and wellbeing benefits.


99 per cent reported that they volunteer to feel a sense of purpose, while 93 per cent said it makes them feel part of their community.

With cyber-crime on the rise, the Tasmanian Government has launched the Defend your data awareness campaign.

- The campaign is aimed at encouraging all Tasmanians to defend their data as cyber threats from criminals become more frequent and more sophisticated.
- Whether at home or in our workplaces, our reliance on technology is increasing, making us all potential targets for cyber-crime.
- Recent high-profile cyberattacks have shown that even being a client (or former client) of an organisation can put us at risk.
- Key to the campaign is raising awareness of how to detect a scam, what you can do to protect yourself online and knowledge of what to do if you are the victim of a scam.
- A new website defendyourdata.tas.gov.au has been established to provide information on how to defend your data.

The site contains three videos to explain how you can screen for scams, shield yourself and be ready to react if you need to.

Anyone can be vulnerable to a scam, so it is timely that everyone refreshes their knowledge of best practice data protection both at home and at work. Screen for scams:

- Be wary of unexpected contact, even from someone you know.
- Be cautious of communication that demands you to act quickly or provide personal information.
- If you feel unsure about a message, don't send a reply, open attachments, or click on any links.
- Shield yourself:
- Regularly update the apps and software on your devices.
 Never use the same password more than once. Make them unpredictable, unique, and long.

Set-up two-factor or multi-factor authentication whenever possible.
Immediately close any website your browser identifies as unsafe. Be ready to react:

- Block all further contact from the scammer.
- Contact your bank if money is involved and inform them of what happened.Report the scam.
- Seek support from family and friends to get yourself back on track. Look out for the campaign on commercial television, radio, press and on social media.

Extensions completed on Tinderbox Hills Track

Extensions to the Tinderbox Hills Track have been completed from Estuary Drive to Mt Louis Road, creating better access for walkers and mountain bikers.

Kingborough Deputy Mayor Clare Glade-Wright said Kingborough Council has been liaising with private landowners over many years to formally extend this track for public recreational use. "The extended track now continues through the Thinking Frog Private Reserve and the Tasmanian


Land Conservancy's Tinderbox Hills Reserve to Mt Louis Road," said Cr Glade-Wright. "In providing access along the track, we have focused on minimising any impact on the diverse and

vulnerable blue gum dry forest and woodland community which is listed as a threatened vegetation community in Tasmania.

"Users must stay on the main marked track at all times due to the covenant obligations of the private landholders and the sensitive nature values including forty spotted pardalote and eastern barred bandicoots.

"The track is 4.5 km return from Estuary Drive to Mt Louis Road and has several steep sections with loose rocks.

"The track also has fabulous views from the ridgeline across to Storm Bay and North West Bay."

Making your legal wishes known with Public Trustee

May 15-21 is Law Week and the Public Trustee is urging Tasmanians to consider the Big Three - making your financial, medical, and legal wishes known.

Public Trustee CEO Todd Kennedy said Law Week is an important opportunity to start a conversation with the community about planning for the future.

An estate plan typically includes an Enduring Power of Attorney (to make financial decisions), an Enduring Guardianship (to make medical or personal decisions), and a will to distribute your estate when you pass away. These are separate documents, each covering a distinct and important aspect of your care and estate.

"Having a will and estate plan is like having a road map for providing protection and support for yourself and your loved ones if something ever happens to you," said Mr Kennedy.

"If you do not have estate planning documents, the Tasmanian Civil and Administration Tribunal (TASCAT) may need to appoint someone to help you make medical or financial decisions if you lose decision-making capacity due to an accident or illness.

"TASCAT can appoint a loved one to support you.

"If there is no-one willing or able to assist you or where there are conflicts of interest, the Public Trustee can be appointed to support financial decision-making or the Public Guardian to support medical or personal decision-making. "If you pass away without a will, your deceased estate

will be distributed according to the Tasmanian Intestacy Act 2010. "Your loved ones may need to apply to the Supreme

Court of Tasmania for a Grant of Letters of Administration to distribute the estate.

"This can be a difficult process to coordinate and may not necessarily reflect your wishes. "It can also cause additional emotional and financial

distress for your family and loved ones during an already challenging time.

"As part of the Law Week program, I am travelling around the state, discussing how important it is to make a will and estate plan to provide clear instructions to manage your legal, medical, and financial affairs.

"The Public Trustee will hold an information session in Hobart on May 19 to discuss estate planning and answer questions. "If people can't make one of the sessions, they can always call us to make an appointment to discuss the Big

Three and how we can help them plan for their future. "Alternatively, there is a presentation online on our website."

The Public Trustee can prepare both a will and Enduring Power of Attorney documents from \$140 for a single person or \$210 for a couple and if you are a pensioner or senior's cardholder, they can prepare these documents for free if the Public Trustee is appointed as executor or attorney.

The Public Trustee can also prepare Enduring Guardianship documents from \$140 for a single person or \$210 for a couple.






