New retail centre set for Kingston

A 3.5-hectare site in Kingston has been acquired by Sydneybased developer Tipalea Partners for \$5 million.

The site is set to become a neighbourhood retail centre known as Huntingfield Village

"Modern, convenient retail is essential infrastructure for growing regions and Huntingfield Village will provide local residents with choice, convenience and significant amenity for years to come, in addition to boosting local employment," said CEO of Tipalea Partners Scott Spanton. The anticipated retail centre is intended to feature a Coles or Woolworths supermarket with a significant drive-through and click-andcollect service.

An additional 15 retail facilities - including medical and dental services, a café, bakery and takeaway food options are also intended for the site. Tipalea anticipates that following the necessary Kingborough Council approvals potentially being secured in 2023, construction will commence early next year, with completion due in early 2025.

The Kingborough Chronicle reached out to Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt for comment.

"It is good to see a proposal for this site, which includes a boost for medical and dental services for Kingborough, which the community is calling for," Cr Wriedt said.

"As a Development Application has not been lodged, and one is required, I cannot pre-empt any decisions that Council will make on the specifics of the development.

"I would like to assure the community though, that as the land is split zoned with just over half of the site zoned commercial and the remaining area of the site zoned environmental management, any development would be contained in the commercial zone land part of the site.

"The natural and cultural values within the environmental management zone, located at the southern end of the site and along the Southern Outlet, would be protected and could not be developed.

Declaring a climate emergency

Dear Editor,

Huon Valley Council unanimously passed a motion at its January 25 meeting declaring a climate emergency and a commitment to "strategically respond to this". The initial motion was raised by Cr Toby Thorpe but Cr Mark Jessop's amendment

was subsequently carried. Amongst other things, climate change now has to be taken into consideration in all "current and forthcoming council strategies, policies, and work plans"

The council has joined Hobart, Kingborough, Launceston and the Northern Midlands councils in declaring an emergency, and more than 100 other jurisdictions around Australia.

Only South Australia and the ACT have declared a climate emergency among the states and territories.

In opposition in 2019, federal Labor supported a Greens' motion to declare a climate emergency but it was blocked by the Morrison government and some crossbenchers. Federal Labor may be less keen now that it is in government and could actually take meaningful action if its economic advisers allowed.

However, it prefers to continue to give subsidies to fossil fuel companies and open up more fossil fuel projects so that we can have a booming economy while the planet burns and the seas rise

Climate change is a problem of excessive pollution - in this case greenhouse gases. It is also a symptom of an even larger problem called 'overshoot', which is when economic activity breaches the planet's ecological limits (carrying capacity).

As overshoot continues, the carrying capacity decreases as we degrade our life-support systems.

That makes overshoot worse, which further reduces carrying capacity in a vicious circle

Climate change is often portrayed as a uniquely dangerous problem requiring our special, undivided attention but this is dangerous thinking.

We cannot solve one problem without understanding how it fits within a series of

Upgrades to Kingston Beach breakwater

Kingborough Council is currently rehabilitating the existing breakwater located at Kingston Beach.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the breakwater was damaged in 2020 from storm activity and required work to ensure it could continue to protect boating and marine activity in the area.

"Kingston Beach's breakwater provides protection for the boat ramp and pontoon," Cr Wriedt said.

"The breakwater enables our boating community to have protection from the waves as they launch and retrieve their boats.

"We are also currently upgrading the existing breakwater to include an all-abilities access footpath along the top, which you can gain entry to from the carpark of the Sailing Club.

"This will enable pedestrians to access an area for fishing as well as providing a seat for the community to relax on. "Improvements will be made to the ladder on the jetty which enables people to alight from their boats making it easier and more accessible.

"Upgrades will also be made to the fenders which cushion the boats from the jetty.

"I look forward to being able to enjoy a walk along the beach and taking in the view from the end of the breakwater."

The project was contracted to Tas Marine Construction and is due to be completed towards the end of May. Funding for the breakwater was supported by two State

Government grants, \$125,000 from the Public Jetties fund and \$50,000 from the Small Boating fund with Kingborough Council contributing \$155,000 towards the project.

Construction begins on Huntingfield subdivision

Subdivision works at Huntingfield have commenced with the \$14.8 million construction tender awarded to Tasmanian company DCS Civil (Tas) Pty Ltd.

The works will deliver the first 30 residential lots in Stage 1 of the Huntingfield redevelopment anticipated for purchase off the plan in late 2023.

"I commend Simon Heazlewood and his team from DCS Civil (Tas) who are delivering both the subdivision works and new roundabout," Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing Guy Barnett said.

"These are massive projects for the Kingborough community that will deliver vital new infrastructure, create jobs and apprenticeships with DCS Civil and local subcontractors."

Franklin MP Dean Winter posed some questions over the works in a recent speech to Parliament.

"It is not clear to me whether the government is actually committed to building a northern slip lane to protect those residents from the growing traffic pains," Mr Winter said.

"It is also not clear to me, and I hope there will be when the budget comes out, when exactly the promised Algona Road upgrade is actually going to be delivered." The *Kingborough Chronicle* reached out to Minister for

Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson for response.

Minister Ferguson advised as per the Department of State Growth response to the *Kingborough Chronicle* on May 5 the new roundabout will include a northbound slip lane.

"As for Algona Road, this is a \$60 million jointly-funded project with funds already in last year's budget papers," Minister Ferguson said.

"There are some very positive changes coming for local infrastructure, and we're pleased to be getting on with delivering them for the people of Kingborough." Franklin MP Dean Winter also expressed concern

about the impact the work may have on local traffic. "We just want to make sure we can get in and out of

the site," Mr Winter said. "We just want to make sure there is appropriate treat-

ment of traffic on that site." The Department of State Growth has advised they will be blasting next to the Channel Highway, Huntingfield (between Rays Court and Maddocks Road) on three consecutive Wednesdays in May and June.

The blasting is part of early works for the planned roundabout to service Homes Tasmania's new residential subdivision.

Traffic will be closed in both directions to keep everyone safe during the blasting.

This means there will be delays of up to 30 minutes between 1.30pm and 2.00pm on Wednesday, May 24, Wednesday, May 31 and Wednesday, June 7.

Drivers are encouraged to avoid this section of the highway during blasting times or allow for a delay if they are intending to travel between Margate and Huntingfield on these days.

Blasting depends on the day's weather conditions, which means the works might be postponed or changed closer to the date.

Updates will be provided through the RoadsTas Facebook page and on electronic message signs on the highway if there are any changes.






