## **Local student** competing in Cologne

Tasmanian student Tegan Dench may be short-statured but has high hopes.

14-year-old Blackmans Bay resident Tegan Dench has been selected to represent Australia at the World Dwarf Games in Cologne, Germany in July.

The World Dwarf Games is the largest international sporting event exclusively for athletes with dwarfism.

Tegan will be one of 40 Australian athletes putting on the green and gold for Australia and playing basketball for the first ever women's team, as well as competing in swimming and athletic throws.

This is a dream come true for Tegan to represent Australia and compete with other short-statured athletes.

### **Proposed boundaries**

The Local Government Board has recently released a series of information packs which offer different scenarios for new local government boundaries.

Stage Two of the Future of Local Government Review proposed the consolidation of Tasmania's 29 existing councils into nine 'community catchments'

Kingborough Council would become part of the Southern Shore community catchment along with Huon Valley Council and Hobart

The information pack for the Southern Shore community catchment offers three scenarios on what the new local government boundaries

The first scenario has the existing Huon Valley local government area (LGA) and existing Kingborough LGA minus Taroona, which could be viewed as a continuously connected suburb of Hobart.

The second scenario combines the existing LGAs of Huon Valley and Kingborough to create one new council area.

The information pack proposes this would allow rural areas to connect to significant regional commercial centres, enhancing the financial sustainability of the new council.

Existing council service, administration and work hubs could be maintained in Huonville and Kingston.

The third scenario combines the majority of the Kingborough LGA with Huon Valley but sees Taroona, urban Kingston and its immediate surrounds excluded, reflecting their urban nature and connections

This scenario proposes Huonville would likely become the primary service centre for this council.

The Local Government Board is offering face-to-face engagement sessions for council staff to discuss this third stage of the Review. Continues on page 3

#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

#### Team yes, stadium no

You may be one of those people who are really excited about our new AFL stadium, and I can understand why. I actually really enjoy football and I do think we should

have a football team, just not a stadium, and here's why. One of the government's ideas is that they will spend \$220 million now, and then get money back later from the football stadium, but there's one problem.

Although the stadium sounds like a good idea, some important issues need to be dealt with now.

For example: climate change (30 football pitches are being cut down a minute, 200 species are going extinct every day); the housing crisis (people are sleeping in cars and tents, otherwise on the streets alone); poverty (2350 Tasmanians, 570 of whom were under 18, were left homeless in 2021 and they were just the ones that were found); and hunger (one in two Tasmanian households needed help to put food on their table in 2022 and Foodbank

are trying harder than ever to do so).

We also have two perfectly good stadiums: Blundstone Arena and the University of Tasmania Stadium.

Money could be put towards improvements to those stadiums instead.

This stadium will also be able to seat 23,000 people but there is an important detail that hasn't really been discussed.

It's called transport.

The stadium may have many seats, but it won't have anywhere near enough car parks.

Tasmania already has issues with bus driver shortages, so public transport may not be a good option either.

Australia is very lucky to have one of the best healthcare systems in the world, but within Australia, Tasmania has one of the worst.

We not only need a better healthcare system, but we also need another emergency hospital

Many people already have to wait up to two weeks to see a general doctor.

Someone in my family needs urgent care but they can

only get an appointment with the specialist, not surgery, but just an appointment, in about three months' time.

This is because there aren't enough hospitals, doctors or beds, and too many patients.

With both AFL and the government putting money towards the stadium, it will end up being over \$700 million and they will also have to spend a lot more overtime to keep it.

There are many other issues that the money could be put towards to help our community instead.

Here are just some of them: housing, climate change solutions, education, health, parks, nature conservation, decreasing poverty and hunger.

I hope the government can appreciate the problems that need solving now, and why we should hold off on the football stadium.

If I, as an 11-year-old, am concerned about these issues, I think the decision makers should be as well. Thank you.

## **Prepare for winter**

Tasmanians are urged to prepare, plan and protect themselves and their families as respiratory illnesses are expected to increase across the state as we head into winter.

The Department of Health says people can take simple actions to protect against the severe harms of respiratory infections.

These include getting the annual flu vaccine and 2023 COVID-19 booster if eligible, and for people at higher risk of severe illness to plan with their GP to get tested and access to antiviral medications if they test positive.

"As is the case each winter, we expect the colder months to bring a substantial increase in one or more common respiratory infections," said Director of Public Health Dr Mark Veitch.

"Prepare by getting your annual flu vaccine and, if you are eligible, your 2023 COVID-19 booster.

"These will boost your immunity against the flu and

"Both vaccines are available at GPs and most local sharmacies.

"If you're at higher risk of severe illness, plan with your GP how you will access testing and antiviral medication if you do get sick.

"Protect your community, workplace, and others by staying at home if you're unwell.

"Keep up the simple behaviours we've used these recent years like washing your hands and covering your coughs and sneezes."

The Department of Health also released details of its 2023 Winter Plan outlining how the hospital and health system would manage expected peaks in demand caused by acute respiratory illnesses.

Secretary and State Health Commander Kathrine

of funds to be used for infrastructure development at the site.

Morgan-Wicks said the Winter Plan applied learnings from previous winters and previous waves of COVID-19.

"While our primary care sector will continue to be the key clinical providers to Tasmanians with respiratory illnesses, we have prepared Tasmania's public hospital system to maintain capacity and manage anticipated increases in activity during the winter months," said Ms Morgan-Wicks.

"Demand management strategies prepared across our public hospitals that have shown to be effective during earlier waves of infection include escalation planning, statewide access and flow coordination, short-term increases or adjustments to bed capacity, and brokered access to private hospital or residential aged care beds.

"The successful COVID@homeplus program will also continue to play an important role by supporting Tasmanians who test positive to COVID-19 to receive virtual care in the community, as well as eligible Tasmanians who have symptoms of flu and other respiratory infections and are at higher risk of severe illness.

"Tasmanians are encouraged to know what to do if they become sick this winter.

National Medals recognise those who risk their lives to protect others in the community.

Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) volunteers with a minimum of 30 patrolling hours over a minimum of 15 seasons are eligible for this award.

Sandra Gadsby received her award for 15 years of

Sandra is the first female member and the second ever member from the Kingston Beach Surf Life Savers Club (SLSC) to receive the National Medal.

She joined the surf lifesaving movement back in 2005 when Kingston Beach SLSC was an arm of Clifton

Sandra remained a member when the club became fully affiliated and achieved her Bronze Medallion in 2006 so she could assist on the beach with her children, who were participating in Nippers at the time.

Sandra was a key leader of the Junior Nippers program

for over six years and she helped many young children in Kingborough achieve key water safety education lessons on the beach.

More recently, Sandra has taken the lead on the Silver Salties program which is a participation program for older Australians (65+ years) promoting physical activity, social connections and involvement in the surf

lifesaving community. "On behalf of Surf Life Saving Australia I would like to congratulate the 156 Surf Lifesavers being awarded National Medals for outstanding service," said SLSA President John Baker ESM.

In 2014, the Lions Clubs operated the sale to assist the local schools, other emergencies and community projects. All of the Lions Club Book Sales were held in the old supermarket, until it changed to Kingston this year



A Wireless and Electrical Club was formed in Hobart as the Tasmanian Division of the Wireless Institute of Australia (WIA) on February 21, 1923.

The group now operates as the Radio Electronics Association of Tasmania (REAST) within the national structure of the WIA.

REAST has members across Tasmania, including an amateur radio station at the Margate Men's Shed.

REAST will be celebrating their centenary by holding open days throughout the state.

## **Education reforms**

The Tasmanian Government is investing in major education reforms, including \$148.32 million in 2023 to support students with disability (an increase of \$11 million from 2022), \$19.6 million for education support specialists, \$24 million to support students impacted by trauma and \$6.2 million for increased access to school health nurses.

"We know education is the single most powerful driver for improving economic and social outcomes in Tasmania, including health, life expectancy, happiness and productivity," Education, Children and Youth Minister Roger Jaensch said.

"Our government has and will continue to listen closely to the needs of educators and their views on in-class support and how to free up our teachers so they have more time to teach.'

The Tasmanian Government has also recently agreed to offer a fair and affordable pay rise for Tasmania's education workforce.

Minister Jaensch said there will be a 9.5 per cent pay increase over three years and a \$1000 cost-of-living

Eligible staff will also receive a lower-income payment of \$500, as well as one-off lower income payments over

"The award will also include state service standards such as an increase in paid parental leave and family violence leave, the introduction of paid foster leave, surrogacy leave, Aboriginal cultural leave, disability leave and gender affirmation leave," Minister Jaensch said.

"These benefits will be felt throughout schools with an additional 170 full-time equivalent in-class support staff."
