

Discussions on council budget

Kingborough Council has adopted its 2023/24 budget which will see a 4.5 per cent general rate increase and a 7 per cent commercial and industrial rate increase.

"Kingborough Council ran a six-week consultation with the community on the draft 2023/24 budget which yielded feedback from 107 people through submissions and survey responses," said Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt.

"In our public consultation process 50 per cent of survey respondents said the rate rise was about right and 5 per cent of community said it was too low.

"The consultation also highlighted that road construction and maintenance was one of the most important roles for Council.

"This year, Council has allocated approximately \$6.8 million for capital projects in road construction, resheeting, footpath upgrades and kerbing across Kingborough.

"We've also adapted our budget response to address issues raised through our public consultation process.

"Public consultation highlighted that Council's \$100,000 Margate Masterplan, planned for 2024/25, needed to be brought forward."

Survey respondents were asked if there was anything they would like to add about the budget.

60 responses were received, 18 of which pertained to Margate.

16 of these comments raised concerns about pedestrian and road user safety in the area.

"I want to thank the community for their honest and clear responses through our consultation, which influenced Council's decisions on the budget," Cr Wriedt said.

Feedback on Kingborough Council budget

The Kingborough community was invited to submit feedback on the 2023/24 budget. President and secretary of Blackmans Bay Community Association (BBCA) Louisa d'Arville asked whether Kingborough Council would bring compostable dog poo bags to Kingborough in the next budget round.

"We are pretty sure we can already predict the responses we will receive," Louisa wrote in the submission.

"Ones such as 'compostable bags won't fit in the newly fabricated bins' or 'the FOGO collection service can't access the bin locations' or 'this is not in the FOGO bin collection contract until 2030'.

"There are so many questions around this - are compostable bags okay in the FOGO system (other councils say yes), is the risk of contamination with non-compostable bags too high?"

"The BBKA implores Councillors to actively get answers from the General Manager about what the Council's end/future game is here."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* reached out to Kingborough Council for response.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said that compostable dog poo bags and bins around Kingborough would be considered in a future report.

"Whilst reducing plastic waste is wonderful and part of Council's waste strategy, there are many financial and resourcing costs that would need to be considered before any new service could be created," Cr Wriedt said.

"To add a FOGO collection round onto the public place bins would mean that new trucks and service routes would have to be integrated into operational costs.

"Currently, our FOGO bin collection service is a fortnightly amenity that would be insufficient to deal with the dog poo waste in public bins.

"Council would have to create a new service collection, especially for the dog poo bins, which would come at a cost of around \$220,000 a year to service.

"This is an extra cost to our ratepayers and Council is very conscious of trying to keep costs down, especially with cost-of-living pressures only increasing for everyone.

"If Council wanted to use compostable bags in replacement of the plastic ones currently used in our public place bins they would come at an extra cost of \$28,000 yearly and only go into landfill.

"Compostable bags cannot break down in landfill, they need the right composting conditions to work, so until we have a full service, we would only be adding cost without the environmental benefit.

"Currently, Council is trialling stand-alone dog poo bins in Kingston Park, in the new open area, which will provide us with options in the future should a decision be made to invest a new service.

"In order to make the right decision for everyone a Council report will be provided to a future Council Meeting, where Councillors can consider the economics and serviceability for installing compostable dog poo bags and bins around the community."

SOUTH BRUNY

Upgrades to Cape Bruny

Works on the Cape Bruny Lighthouse Car Park and Access Project at South Bruny National Park will begin this month.

“Our government is investing \$1.7 million as part of the Parks Powering Regional Economies plan, to provide improved access to the historic site’s museum and amenities via a new car park and all-abilities walkway,” Minister for Parks Roger Jaensch said.

“The new car park features improvements in traffic flow and pedestrian safety, as well as providing increased parking, including disability parking spaces, and provision for coach and motorcycle parking.”

Tasmanian civil construction company Andrew Walter Constructions (AWC) has been engaged to deliver the civil works.

These works will support 15 Tasmanians employed by AWC and another 25 sub-contractors from up to seven Tasmanian businesses.

“The works follow the completion of new public toilets at the site in 2019 and other works at the Bruny Island Neck, which delivered a new public toilet, car park and beach access walkway,” Minister Jaensch said.

Cape Bruny Lighthouse will remain open during the works however visitors should expect the chance of minor delays.

BLACKMANS BAY

Learning to make biochar

The Blackmans Bay Community Association (BBCA) invited Cristina from 'The New Black Biochar' to help them run a small workshop in Blackmans Bay. The group made hundreds of litres of biochar from the she oak prunings collected at the community garden. Biochar is made by layering wood in a kiln and restricting oxygen to the fire so that it burns hot with almost no smoke. Before it turns to ash it is completely doused in water, leaving behind useful charcoal or biochar. "The charcoal is then 'charged' with nutrients, perhaps from weed tea, worm castings, seaweed or fish fertiliser," said Louisa d'Arville, the president and secretary of the BBKA.

"It can be used to add to your compost, or straight into your garden beds. "In sandy soil like we have in Blackmans Bay it helps by holding a huge cache of nutrients for your plants that the silica in sandy soil just can't hold onto." Other applications include using it before it has been charged to feed to livestock and to line rubbish bins. "Coming up to winter solstice, people might like to think about how they go about their bonfires, maybe they can get more out of it than a pile of ash at the end," Louisa said. Making biochar is a way to lock up carbon rather than releasing it into the atmosphere as you would in a normal, backyard bonfire.

Landcare Action Grants now open

Landcare Tasmania is delivering the next state-wide round of Landcare Action Grants opening in June.

These rounds of on-ground funding were set up by the state government in 2018 with the support of the Tasmanian Farmers and Graziers Association and Landcare Tasmania and will now offer vital support for landscape restoration projects across the state.

Applications will open from June 16 to July 31 and are open to a range of applicants including community groups, primary producers and landholders and land managers.

A further application round may be opened in late 2023 subject to funding availability.

In the first round, landscape restoration projects are a priority. This includes projects which protect and enhance on-farm native vegetation, including planting new areas of native vegetation, protecting habitat, and maintaining and improving ground cover.

Other community projects, such as weed removal, fencing, fire management regimes and habitat augmentation are also eligible for funding.

The themes for projects in this grant round are: supporting enhanced land

management practices, assisting the community to holistically manage natural and productive land and waterways, and providing opportunities for landholders to implement carbon farming initiatives.

Funding is available for projects that can be completed by June 2025.

The preferred funding amount is \$5000 to \$20,000 per project, but projects of outstanding merit requiring up to \$40,000 of funding will be considered.

Lifting literacy rates in Tasmania

The Tasmanian Government is investing in improving literacy outcomes in Tasmania following the government's Literacy Advisory Panel's final report.

Premier Jeremy Rockliff said the report outlines 23 priority recommendations for lifting literacy in Tasmania and provides a community-wide framework, which community organisations and others can use to align their literacy efforts and work.

“Our government wants every Tasmanian child to have the best possible opportunities in life, and our clear goal is for Tasmania to have 100 per cent functional literacy,” the Premier said.

“That's why we have accepted all of the priority recommendations, with \$6.5 million over four years allocated in the 2023-24 budget to start this important work.

“An independent Literacy Outcomes Monitoring Group, including a person with expertise in outcomes measurement, at least one Tasmanian with lived experience and a representative from the Australian Education Research

Organisation, will be established to monitor progress and outcomes.

“Members of this group will be selected through an EOI process, which I expect to be finalised by September 2023.

“The Department of Premier and Cabinet will develop the first three-year implementation plan by later this year, in close consultation with the education and community sectors.

“The government will also ensure that 25 per cent of primary schools across Tasmania are implementing structured literacy for K-2 in 2024, with all primary schools to be implementing structured literacy by 2026.”

The report made further recommendations to be considered in future years including: ongoing professional development in literacy for every teacher every year, giving Libraries Tasmania a bigger role in literacy development, and encouraging the Australian Government to develop and implement a national strategy to renew the adult language, literacy, numeracy and digital literacy education workforce.

Stroke education campaign launch

International Men's Health Week ran from June 12 to June 18 and the Stroke Foundation has launched a campaign to educate Aussie blokes about stroke.

In 2020, 2153 people per 100,000 living in the Franklin electorate had experienced a stroke, 1204 male and 948 female. This is notably higher than the national average of 1922, and Tasmania's average of 2088 per 100,000.

The Bloke Beside You campaign highlights the **F.A.S.T** message, referring to the three primary indicators of stroke: **F**acial droop, **A**rms not working, and **S**lurred speech.

The **T** is a reminder that there's no time to waste calling an ambulance.

Successful treatment for stroke is time critical as without it, people can be left with permanent disabilities or may even die.

Stroke Foundation surveys 5000 Australians every year to gauge awareness of stroke.

When looking closely at each demographic after the most recent survey, Stroke Foundation CEO Dr Lisa Murphy said her team was surprised how far men lag behind women in recognising stroke.

“We now know that almost half of the men in this country would not know they were dealing with a stroke if they saw someone displaying the main signs,” Dr Murphy said.

“That means roughly five million blokes may be a hindrance rather than a help in what is always a medical emergency.” “Men are quite often in need of a nudge when it comes to thinking about their health,” said Director of the Centre for Male Health at Western Sydney University, Emma George.

“This International Men's Health Week we're encouraging men to make regular health checks a habit, and that includes the habit of educating themselves about stroke and other chronic diseases.”

She said the Stroke Foundation campaign is a simple way to encourage men to lift their game.

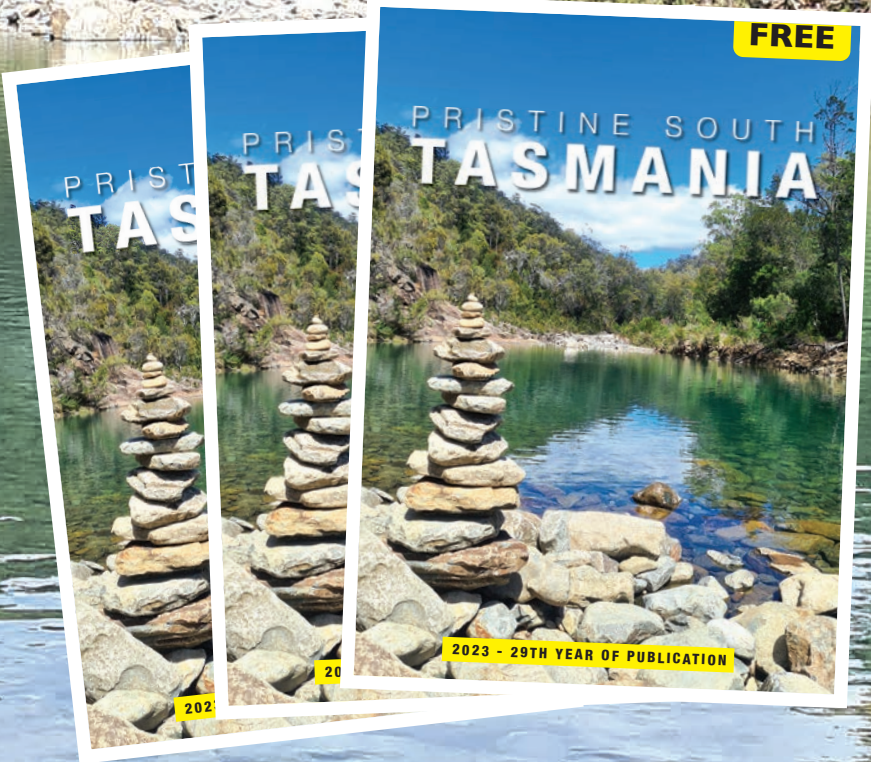

The Inaugural SFL Women in Football breakfast on Friday, June 9 was a resounding success, with an impressive turnout of 300 attendees at Wrest Point.

The event provided the perfect opportunity for players inducted to the All-Stars Series games to be formally recognised and awarded their playing guernseys before games on Saturday, June 10 and a double-header on Monday, June 12. Kingborough’s Marley Beaven, Priscilla Odwogo, Stacey Fox and Hailee Baldwin were selected for the initial squad.
