Council's response to housing stress

Kingborough Council discussed adopting a Statement on Housing in their recent Council meeting, which was carried.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Council developed the statement in recognition of housing stress being experienced by local residents.

There is an estimated population of 40,979 people living in 15,600 households in Kingborough.

Recent data suggests Kingborough has become one of the least affordable areas to rent in Australia.

Higher than Average Growth has created a 'years to own' metric which estimates the number of years it would take to completely own a property considering current house prices, interest rates and median family income.

It would take 39.7 years to own a house in Kingborough, according to this metric.

"In recent years, we have seen significant increases in house prices and rent in Kingborough," Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said.

"This is putting increasing pressure on Kingborough residents, in addition to other rising costs such as for food, petrol and utilities.

"Council's Statement on Housing sets out our strategies for encouraging safe, affordable and accessible housing in Kingborough, including advocating for increased investment.

"Our number one strategy is to drive increased investment by the Tasmanian and federal governments in social and affordable housing and supported accommodation in Kingborough.

"We will also continue to encourage increased housing density in areas close to services, jobs and facilities through appropriate zoning.

"By working with housing providers and developers, we will encourage housing that is assessable and liveable for people with disabilities in Kingborough.

"We will also consider Council land that might be developed or sold to enable housing developments.

"The Statement on Housing will be implemented through an action plan that sets out actions, responsibilities and timelines for each of the strategies included in the statement.

"Council officers will regularly report back to Council on how the Statement on Housing is being implemented."

Councillor Gideon Cordover suggested a further strategy be adopted in the action plan to encourage improvements to Kingborough's long-term rental market and discourage the use of entire dwellings as short-stay accommodation in areas where the residential rental vacancy rate is less than 2 per cent.

This motion was lost.

Considering energy support for Kingston business

Labor Member for Franklin Dean Winter joined Kingston Drycleaners' owner David Parkinson to discuss the Large Business Customer Electricity Support Scheme.

The scheme offers up to \$20,000 assistance to eligible larger businesses.

Kingston Drycleaners had a 30 per cent increase in electricity

costs last year, bringing its total annual power bill to \$36,000.

"The government promised they would reintroduce the rebate scheme to help businesses like this, but instead they have the new Large Business Customer Electricity Support Scheme, which doesn't work," Mr Winter said.

"Like many businesses, Kingston Drycleaners don't meet the crite-

ria for this scheme because they don't use enough power to qualify."

"The grants are designed to help those who have experienced financial strain due to contracting at a higher weighted average electricity price than their previous agreement," Minister for Energy and Renewables Guy Barnett said.

Debates over water debt report

The Economic Regulator recently released a report stating the number of Tasmanians paying a water debt has increased, with more than 5000 Tasmanians now paying an average debt of \$1300.

The Economic Regulator report states that TasWater's process for water and sewerage services increased by 3.5 percent in 2021-22, having been frozen for the previous two years.

TasWater CEO George Theo said "going forward, our customers benefit from water price certainty with modest 3.5 per cent increases each year for the next four years".

"In the context of escalating cost of living we are proud to deliver affordable services to our community."

Labor Member for Franklin Dean Winter questioned the rising water price.

"TasWater prices are going up because that's what its Memorandum of Understanding with the Liberal

Government demanded," said Mr Winter.

"As we've seen with power, and now water, Tasmanians are being ripped off under this Liberal Government."

Liberal Member for Franklin Dean Young said "It is Mr Winter's Labor Party that blocked the Liberal Government's plan to take control of TasWater - a plan that would have led to infrastructure upgrades being completed sooner and prices being kept lower".

"Mr Winter has been entirely misleading and deceptive when he suggested that the government has required TasWater to increase prices by at least 3.5 per cent or that the government can direct them to charge less.

"As a former local government owner's representative, he knows full well that TasWater determines its pricing within the limits set by the regulator, and in

accordance with its legislation."

Mr Winter also took aim at the Macquarie Point treatment plant relocation project which he said was paid for by rising water bills.

"Five years later, absolutely nothing has happened," Mr Winter said.

"We don't even know what the project will cost, let alone when it will be done."

Mr Young said Mr Winter was misleading Tasmanians by suggesting the project is being paid for by consumers.

"In fact, the Tasmanian Government is providing \$100 million to TasWater for the cost," Mr Young said.

"The Tasmanian Government is also investing heavily in TasWater to support its capital program, providing \$200 million in equity contributions over the life of its works program."

“I’d also like to give a very special thanks to the 60 subcontractors and suppliers who donated labour, materials or their time and skills to build this home.”

The Madison House charity project was built in memory of Madison Lyden, the daughter of Lyden Builders owner Andrew Lyden, who died in a tragic cycling incident in New York in 2018.

Exploring energy support options

Minister for Energy and Renewables Guy Barnett said Tasmanian businesses with an annual contracted consumption greater than 150 megawatt hours, who entered or enter into a new fixed price electricity agreement with a Tasmanian retailer between April 1, 2022 and now extended to June 30, 2023 are eligible for the Large Business Customer Electricity

Support Scheme.

So far 10 businesses have been approved grants under this scheme for a combined total of approximately \$160,000.

Kingston Drycleaners does not qualify for this scheme, but Minister Barnett discussed other options.

“These larger businesses will also soon be able to access a \$50 million Energy Efficiency Loan Scheme,”

Minister Barnett said.

“The government will support loans of up to \$10,000 available interest free, with a further \$50,000 available at low interest rates.”

Minister Barnett advised small businesses and Tasmanian households in need may also be eligible for assistance through the National Energy Bill Relief program from July 1.

Premier’s Reading Challenge

Youth across Tasmania are taking part in this year’s expanded Premier’s Reading Challenge.

Beginning on June 26, this year’s challenge included students from Years 7-10 for the first time.

Premier Jeremy Rockliff said the challenge was a great way to encourage children to read regularly and, in turn, set them up for the lifelong benefits that reading brings.

“It is very exciting that this year more students can take part than ever before,” the Premier said.

“This year I am setting participants a personal challenge, so whether you are an avid reader or you are

just starting out on your reading journey, I want you to read as much as you can during the 10 weeks.”

Premier Rockliff, Education, Children and Youth Minister Roger Jaensch, and Reading Champion Dr Lucy Christopher joined students at Kingston High School to talk about their personal reading challenge this year.

“Reading is a skill for life, and I congratulate Kingston High School for getting on board with the reading challenge,” Premier Rockliff said.

“The challenge promotes the importance of reading and encourages families to be more involved with sup-

porting reading at home.

“There is no limit to what you can read, pick something that interests and excites you, picture books, short stories, poems or non-fiction books in any language can be part of the challenge.

“There are prizes on offer, including book vouchers for submitting a book review.”

The Premier encouraged students to visit their school or local libraries as part of the challenge.

Kingborough athlete’s first global games

In early June Rebecca Mathers represented Australia at the quadrennial Virtus Global Games in shot put, discus, javelin, and hammer.

The Virtus Games is the largest sporting competition for intellectually impaired athletes in the world.

This was Rebecca's first overseas competition representing Australia, after competing for Australia in Brisbane late last year.

After traveling for over two days from Hobart to France, she had two days to settle in prior to competing.

The athletics events started in earnest on June 6 and Rebecca competed in the qualifiers for shot put and discus.

These two events were within an hour.

The shot put was used as a warm-up for the discus.

In the discus Rebecca qualified for the 12 person final after finishing 11th in the preliminary.

The final was held the following day.

In the final for the discus, Rebecca stepped into the ring and threw her best series of throws ever in that event to finish 10th with a new state record.

On the third day Rebecca headed into her favourite event, javelin.

This event was a straight final, and Rebecca fouled her first throw but on the second throw she found her radar and for the next three rounds she pushed hard to increase her distances.

Her best throw had her placed in eighth position.

This is where she finished.

Two of her throws bettered the previous state record.

On day four Rebecca competed in the hammer to assist her teammate Lillee Wakefield who was an out-side chance for a medal.

Lillee with assistance from Rebecca medaled with a two metre personal best and an Australian record.

Even though Rebecca put aside her own competition performance she still managed to break the state record and finish eighth.

Rebecca competed sensationally well in her first overseas trip, met new friends and showed what she is capable of.

Update on Margate development

Kingborough Councillor Aldo Antolli asked for an update on the proposed developments in Margate at the recent Council meeting.

General Manager Gary Arnold said he had a recent discussion with Corey Bygraves from Kalis Group, the developers of this project.

Mr Arnold said Mr Bygraves noted the first stage, the shops fronting the Channel Highway, are under construction.

“Some tenancies have been locked in,” Mr Arnold said.

“Some are still being negotiated.

“In terms of the supermarket, which I know is a question that the locals always ask, the Kalis Group is still negotiating with a prospective tenant.

“The other point of discussion in that regard was the ability to get the high voltage transmission to the supermarket site which is at the rear of the shops that are currently being built.

“I’ve hand balled that one to my colleague, Mr David Reeve, because one potential alignment would see it come through a short section of the Council road reserve, not the asphalt but the actual footpath part of the road reserve.”

Volunteer Marine Rescue Kingborough receives grant

WOODBIDGE

Memorial wall proposed

The Woodbridge Community Association are considering placing a memorial wall in Woodbridge Cemetery on the corner of Potters Road and the Channel Highway.

This is for Channel residents whose family would like a memorial for them in the Channel, rather than at Kingston or Huonville, or another more distant suburb.

The proposed memorial wall would be approximately 1.5 metres high and 6 metres long, made of dressed sandstone blocks upon which brass memorial plaques can be fixed.

At this stage it is proposed the memorial wall be built on the flat ground behind the church.

Funding repairs to roads and tracks

An additional \$1.57 million is being made available to complete repairs on roads and walking tracks damaged by the 2018-19 Tasmanian bushfires in the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area.

The assistance is being provided by the Australian and Tasmanian governments through the jointly funded Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).

Federal Minister for Emergency Management Murray Watt said the funding is in addition to the \$8.3 million provided under the Community Recovery Fund set up in response to the 2018-19 Tasmanian bushfires.

“This announcement enables the Tasmanian Parks and Wildlife Service to complete essential repairs on roads and tracks damaged by the Tasmanian bushfires in 2018-19 that provide access to Tasmania’s wilderness areas,” Minister Watt said.

“This is another example of both governments working collaboratively to provide practical on the ground assistance to support communities as they recover.

“We know that recovery is not just about the short-term, and we’ll continue to work with the Tasmanian Government to support their efforts.”

Tasmanian Premier Jeremy Rockliff said the repair and restoration of more than 116 kilometres of tracks and 119 kilometres of roads will allow continued access to our world class wilderness areas.


“Tasmania’s parks are some of our best natural assets that attract thousands of tourists each and every year to our state, and this funding will continue the ongoing recovery from those devastating bushfires,” the Premier said.


“Repair work can now be completed on the Cracroft and Farmhouse Creek Tracks, and roads within the East Picton, West Picton and Weld clusters in southern Tasmania.


“Restoring public access to these facilities will support the ongoing social and economic recovery of the affected communities, particularly as our parks and reserves are so important to bring visitors to the affected areas.”

MARGATE

Environmentally friendly mooring

Over the past three years National Resource Management (NRM) South have partnered with CSIRO and OzFish Unlimited to implement an Environmentally Friendly Mooring (EFM) program in North West Bay, near Margate.

North West Bay is a popular and important recreational fishing area - and also an important area for seagrass habitat.

By winter 2022, 11 EFMs had been installed across North West Bay and as part of this CSIRO completed dive surveys to collect data on changes after EFM installation.

Divers had to undertake specific training due to the cold water, task-heavy work, high silt and low visibility of this section of the waterway.

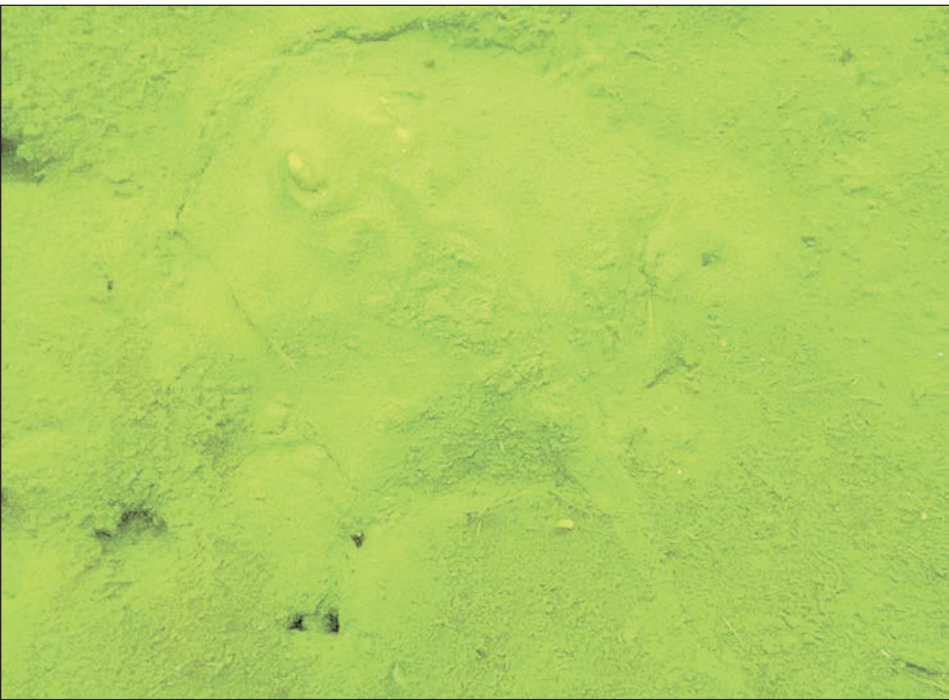
Divers recorded fish and macroinvertebrates, took photos of habitat and plant cover and collected sediment samples.

The sediment samples are analysed to monitor infauna (small animals that live in the sand and mud) and carbon, to assess the potential for the EFMs to support carbon sequestration (the long-term storage of carbon dioxide in vegetation) in seagrass habitats.

Although not enough time has passed since the EFMs were installed to see any measurable difference, it is hoped that results from follow-up surveys scheduled for autumn 2024 will start to show signs of early recovery.

SOUTH BRUNY

Protecting local birds

The biodiversity of Bruny Island is exceptional.

Amongst other things, the island provides important habitat for two species of birds currently threatened by extinction - the swift parrot and the 40-spotted pardalote.

Bruny Island is one of only two places where swift parrots can breed without facing predation by sugar gliders. For 40-spotted pardalotes, the island is one of only two remaining viable populations, the other being on Maria Island. Bruny Island Environment Network, Tasmanian Land Conservancy, and Friends of North Bruny are currently working together on a project aimed at enhancing the habitat and breeding outcomes for both species on the island.

The project involves planting forage trees and installing nest boxes for both species and deploying feather dispensers to reduce mortality in pardalote nestlings caused by parasitic fly larvae.

These steps are being taken at no cost to landholders and are tailored to suit their individual needs. For example, plantings may entail anything from broadscale revegetation to planting windbreaks or amenity trees. The project has led to the planting of 388 trees already this year on two properties on South Bruny. Further plantings will soon take place on two properties on North Bruny. Other property owners have recently come forward, asking for their properties to be included.

KINGSTON

Winter with a splash at Kingston Beach

The Winter Solstice Splash is an annual fundraising challenge by Loaves and Fishes Tasmania.

Participants raise money to plunge into the water at either Greens Beach, West Tamar or at Kingston Beach. The money then goes towards supplying winter meals to Tasmanians in need. Loaves and Fishes Tasmania is an emergency food relief service, rescuing and redistributing surplus and donated food across the state.

On Sunday, June 25 brave swimmers took on the freezing River Derwent water at Kingston Beach. Labor Member for Franklin Dean Winter was one of the participants this year. See next week's issue for photos.

Reducing fire risks for winter

Tasmanians are urged to take action to reduce fire risks to their home and to stay safe this winter.

“Each year between May and September the Tasmania Fire Service responds to an increased number of house fires,” Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management Felix Ellis said.

“While the dangers of fire are very real, there is a lot you can do to protect yourself, your family and your home.

“Our home fire safety message is simple - protect what you value.

“That means protecting your family, pets, home and belongings by following the Tasmania Fire Service’s fire safety advice.”

An advertising campaign raising awareness of home fire safety is being run across the state this winter.

The campaign advises people to have their chimneys cleaned every year, to keep anything flammable two metres from a heater, not to overheat wheat bags and to ensure every house has working smoke alarms installed in the recommended places.

Minister Ellis said making sure the youngest community members were informed about home fire safety is a priority for the Tasmania Fire Service.

“The School Fire Education Program is delivered to almost 20,000 students in more than 90 primary schools each year,” Minister Ellis said.

“The program is designed to teach children from Prep to Grade 6 about basic home fire safety and to empower them to make safer choices about fire risk.”

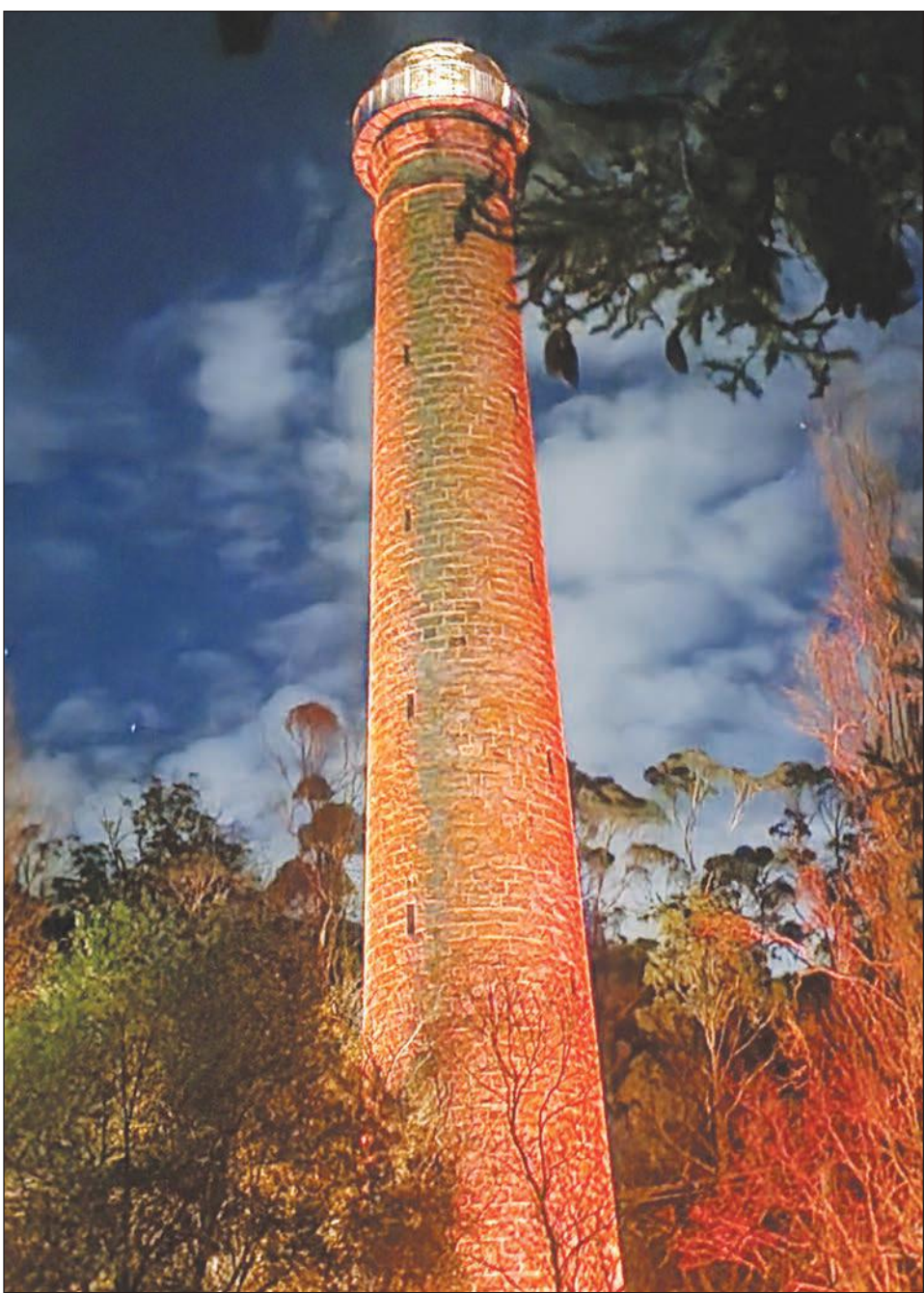

A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty-five years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1968. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, June 27, 1968.

BOWLS GREEN FOR KINGSTON

THE prospect of a bowling green at Kingston Beach was advanced a further stage at a public meeting in the Beach Hall on Monday night, when a committee was appointed to investigate the site, draw up a constitution, and discuss the raising of finance.

The committee appointed comprised Messrs E. C. Edwards, K. Baynton, B. J. Thompson, Ayers, Gordon and Millhouse.

They will inspect the proposed site, which is on the Kingston Commis-sion's land immediately north-west of the pre-school on Sunday, and will report to another general meeting to be held on Tuesday, July 9.

Mr Edwards, who presided, produced plans that indicated there was sufficient room for a green in the proposed area.

Mr Keith Baynton outlined the proposal, and said he had been told the commission would co-operate.

Speakers were keen about the proposition, and said that good support was forthcoming for the establishment of a green at Kingston Beach.

Mr Baynton and other speakers were opposed to the establishment of a bowling green and general sports ground on an area that the commission had suggested on the western side of the Channel Highway near Brown's River. It was stated that this was a wet, soggy area, and subject to flooding.

Mr Baynton has been the prime mover in the effort to obtain a bowling green at Kingston and, although aged 81, he has been most energetic, and obtained nearly 300 signatures to a petition to the commission.

Officers of the Kingborough Bowls Club at Margate admit that there is scope for a green that would be within easy reach of prospective players at Kingston Beach.

The Kingston Beach Development Association also is behind the move, and associates with it the establishment of a youth sporting centre to provide for badminton, basketball, table tennis, boxing, and similar indoor games.

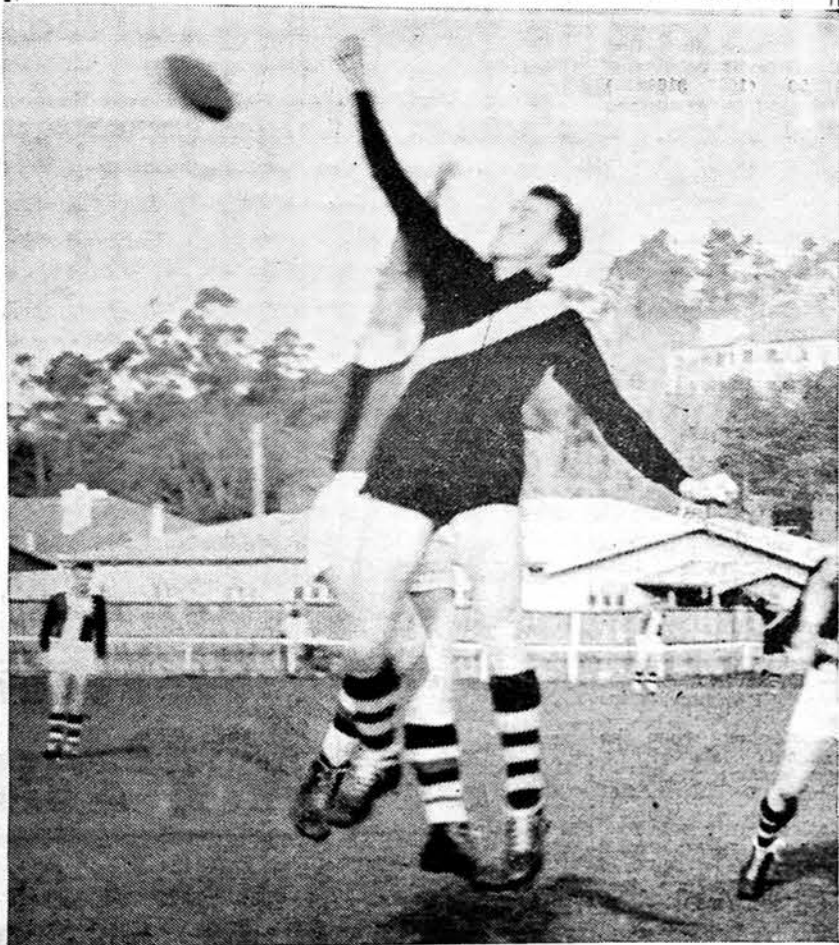
Mr Colin Walton, a member of the association has contacted the sporting bodies concerned, and found all very interested. He said that discussions had been held with mem-

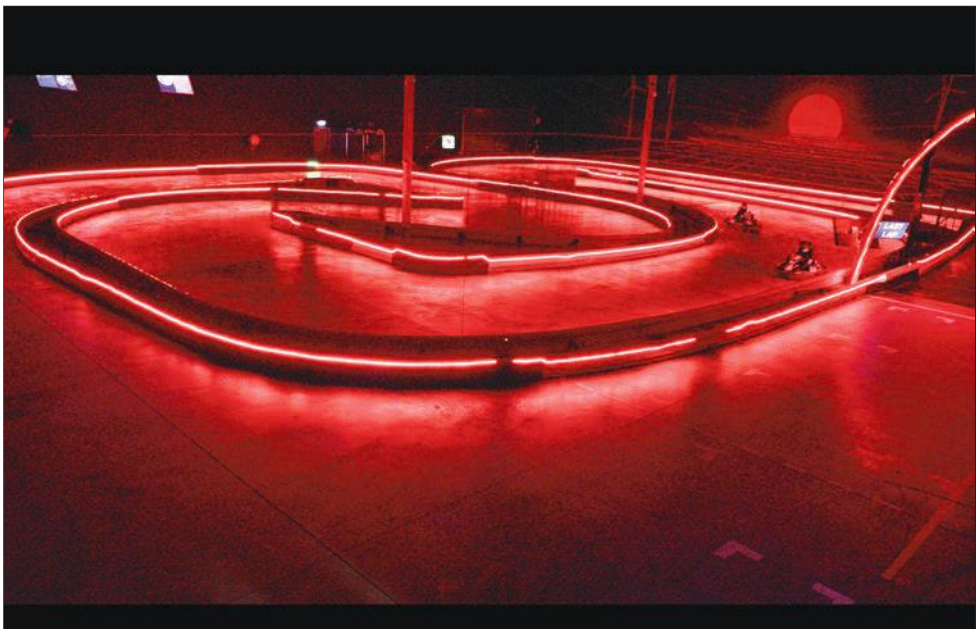

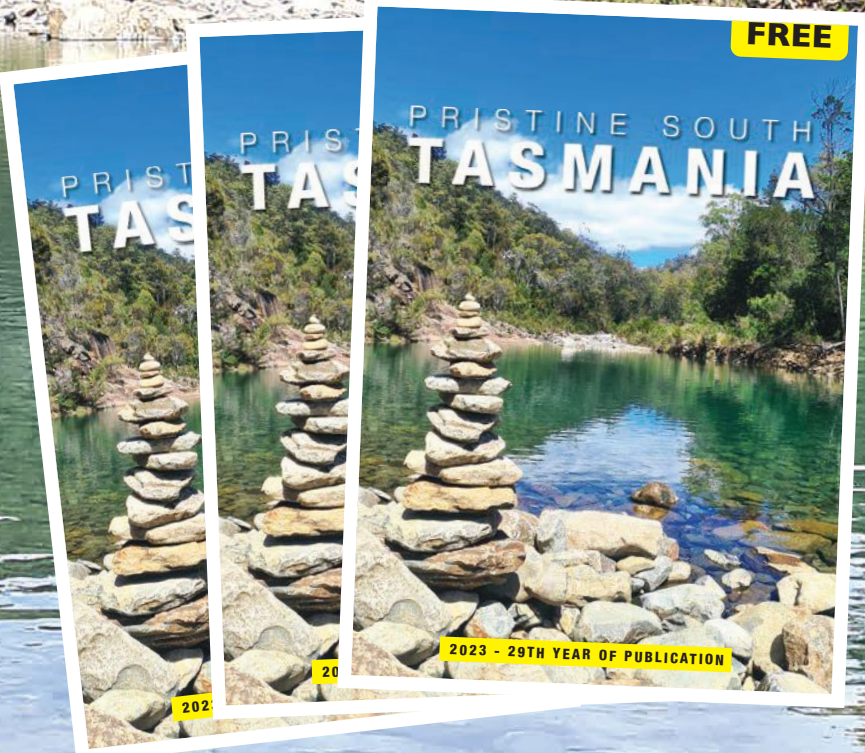

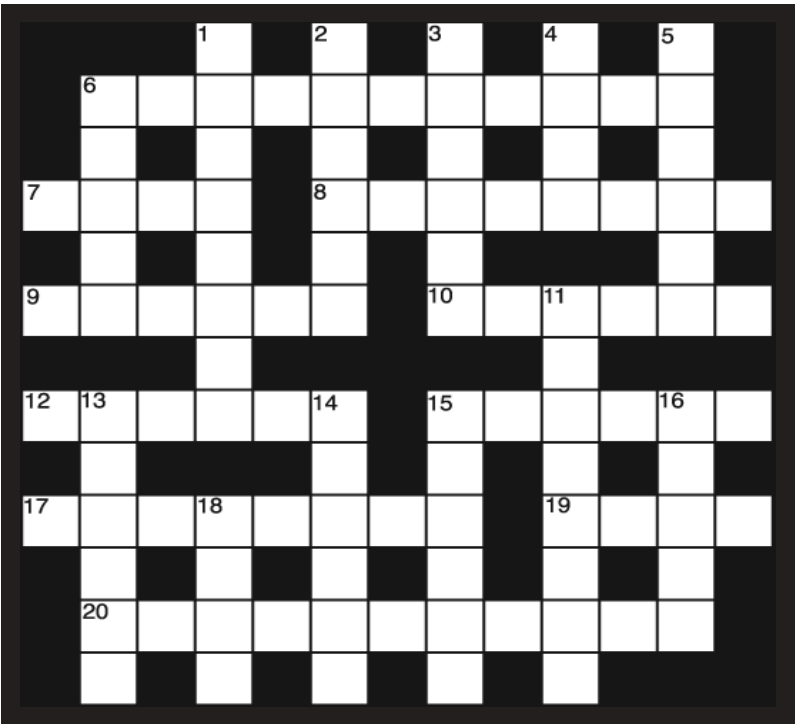
