The transformation of Kingston CBD is underway with the southern lane of Channel Highway now open to traffic.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said some of the new footpaths had been poured which had improved access to many of the restaurants and cafés in

"Work on the upgrade is continuing with new footpaths, garden beds, and some small art pieces are starting to appear along the main strip," Cr Wriedt said.

"There is still footpath work to do at the end of John Street, Hutchins Street and outside Commonwealth Bank, but over the next few weeks much of the large work will be completed.

"Once the footpaths and road works are finished, landscaping will commence, and installation of street furniture will follow.

"The north bound lane of Channel Highway is likely to be opened for vehicle traffic by the end of July."

Kingston Park receives architect award

Kingston Park has won an Excellence Award at the State Awards Ceremony for the Australian Institute of Landscape Architects (AILA).

"This year's entries demonstrated some big learnings across the industry in cultural engagement and value," said AlLA jury chair Naomi Barun.

"There was a real maturity both in the engagement and respect that landscape architecture practices had for Traditional Owners, and the cultural connection they have with these places.

"This is a clear reflection on the advocacy and leadership of landscape architects in this space and the acceptance and willingness of clients."

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Kingston Park had topped the Parks and Open Space category at the AlLA Tasmanian State Awards on Thursday, July 6.

"We've tried very hard to build Tasmania's best playground

here in Kingston, so it is wonderful to see our hard work recognised with this award," Cr Wriedt said.

"Kingston Park was acknowledged for the way the designers, Playstreet, incorporated Aboriginal history and culture into the playground's features.

"Working with Tasmanian Aboriginal artist Allan Mansell, Playstreet designed nine distinct areas of play, inspired by our community and the native fauna and habitats within Kingborough.

"Extensive community engagement was conducted with over 1800 members of the public providing feedback on the design elements they wanted to see in the playground.

"This award recognises all the beautiful stories and artwork that have gone into the design of the park.

"Kingston Park sets a new standard for urban and play-space development in Tasmania and Council is really proud of the enjoyment it provides for many in our community."

This 4100 hectare coastal property was the birthplace of Truganini and holds great cultural significance to the Indigenous community.

More recently it has been used as a working sheep station. weetapoona intend on continuing to run the sheep station to produce Merino wool to be sold under the new brand name of 'Longwinny' which translates to 'fur' in the local Aboriginal language.

Murrayfield Station will also become a site for Aboriginal education programs and to train up Indigenous station hands.


"We were thrilled when Finn and Nahuel's project was award the peer prize at the end of the judging.

This display includes some amazing railway models of street scenes, town and village stations, railway viaducts, locomotive vards, goods depots, city landscapes and country railway lines.


These have all been meticulously detailed in every sense.



Milestone for Australian Antarctic Division

Senator Catryna Bilyk toured the Australian Antarctic Division on June 30.

"Huge thanks to the Australian Antarctic Division (AAD) Director, Emma Campbell, for giving me a tour, together with my colleagues (Member for Franklin) Julie Collins MP and the Australian Minister for Environment and Water, Tanya Plibersek," Senator Bilyk said.

"It's a privilege to have the AAD just a stone's throw from my Kingston office."

The day before, Senator Bilyk, Minister Plibersek and Senator Carol Brown had been guided through the RSV Nuyina, an Antarctic supply and research vessel.

This year the Australian Antarctic Program celebrates 75 years of tradition - from humble beginnings as Australian National Antarctic Research Expeditions (ANARE) in 1947, to today's modern Australian Antarctic Program.

The first ANARE landed on Heard Island on December 26, 1947.

Three months later, Macquarie Island was established

ANARE led directly to the formation of the 'Antarctic Division' in May 1948 and the appointment of Dr Phillip Law as its first 'Director' in January 1949.

"It's incredible the research that's going on in the Australian Antarctic Program," Senator Bilyk said.

"Some of these world-leading research programs are making a massive contribution to marine conservation, to gathering evidence for the International Whaling Commission and to understanding the impacts of climate change on Antarctic and Southern Ocean ecosystems.







Who you going to call? Will-myth busters!

There are many myths to be busted when considering wills.

It may be that your spouse is entitled to your estate, should you die 'intestate' (without a valid will) but the process for them receiving their entitlement under your estate is much more complicated and costly when you die without a will.

• If I die without a will the government gets everything, so why worry about it? This myth probably dates back to a time when there were 'death taxes'. However, there are no longer 'death taxes' in any Australian state and the government does not receive your estate.

If you die without a valid will, you are said to die 'intestate'

Your estate may not be divided according to your wishes because the law (in Tasmania this situation is governed by the Intestacy Act 2010) sets out how your estate will be distributed.

• I don't own anything, why would I need a will?

Even if you do not own any large assets, like a house or land it is still important to have a will so that any other assets such as cars and personal items, for example, are directed to the right beneficiaries and to give certainty to your family members at a stressful time.

• I wrote my own will and have it stored at home, so don't need a will written by a lawyer - It is recommended that you attend to having a lawyer draw

There is a risk that if you write your own will that it may be deemed to be invalid and/or ineffective once you die, because for example it may not be executed and witnessed correctly or it may not correctly dispose of

So, no matter what stage of life you're in or if you became incapacitated, with a valid will, power of attorney and enduring guardianship, you can take comfort knowing that you've appointed someone you trust to make decisions about your financial affairs or medical treatment and lifestyle issues with your best interest at heart.
