Cancellation of Targa 2023

Targa Australia recently announced it will suspend all future motorsport-based events until the full ramifications of Motorsport Australia's review into tarmac rallying can be quantified and assessed.

This means that Targa Tasmania and Targa Great Barrier Reef 2023 have been cancelled.

Leg six of Targa Tasmania has in the past gone through Longley and Peverata.

The safety review process has been going for 15 months, and the uncertainty and duration of this review process has seen a record drop in entry numbers.

Over 80 per cent of tour participants withdrew in response to the reduction of the Targa tour speed to 110km/h.

"Our events can only be run with the support of our loyal participants, and on the whole, they are understandably disenchanted with the current landscape, and we completely understand why," said Targa CEO Mark Perry.

"We have waited and been incredibly patient with the process put in place, however this process has now taken a year longer than similar reviews in the past.

"Competitors have little certainty with what the future looks like for them and are rightly holding off on entering our events.

"In turn, we have had to make the difficult but necessary decision to cancel our 2023 events and undertake our own review and assessment on the future viability of our iconic rallies.

"While it is another sad day for everyone involved in Targa, we must now explore every conceivable option available to us to ensure the survival of Targa and the return of the ultimate tarmac rally, Targa Tasmania in April 2024."

Targa Australia will make further announcements as they are finalised.

Taking the politics out of planning

In a recently released statement, Premier Jeremy Rockliff, the Acting Minister for Planning, said “The Tasmanian Government will take the politics out of planning decisions to improve certainty, transparency and the effectiveness of planning across Tasmania”.

New legislation will be introduced to allow some planning decisions to be made by independent expert Development Assessment Panels (DAP).

Under the proposal, proponents would be able to opt-in and choose whether a council or a panel makes the final decision on their project.

Similarly, councils would also have the option of referring the final decision, enabling them to better advocate for their community.

Panels would be determined by the independent Tasmanian Planning Commission.

“We will take the politics out of planning by ensuring that decisions are driven by the rules and not the vested interests or personal biases of individual councillors,” Premier Rockliff said.

“There’s too many examples where critical land, housing or other projects are being stopped or delayed by ideologically motivated, party-aligned councillors, and this is not good for Tasmania.”

The Local Government Association Tasmania (LGAT) also released a statement, saying “The government’s statement of significant changes to how some development applications will be assessed has come as a complete surprise to the local government sector”.

LGAT president Mick Tucker said “It is extremely disappointing that the Premier has made this announcement today with no prior consultation with our sector”.

“The high-profile cases of councillors making controversial decisions on development applications represent a very small proportion of total developments.”

The Future of Local Government Review, commissioned by the state government, reported that the proportion of council planning decisions that go to appeal is about one per cent state-wide and that the decisions made by elected representatives were no more likely to be appealed than those by council officers.

According to the Planning Matter Alliance Tasmania (PMAT) “Just three months ago, in the face of community and council opposition, the government committed to defer consultation over and consideration of this concept”.

Sophie Underwood, State Director of the Planning Matters Alliance Tasmania (PMAT) said “Bypassing council takes democracy and local decision making out of planning decisions”.

“This proposal is based on a flawed argument that planning is politicised by council and councillors.

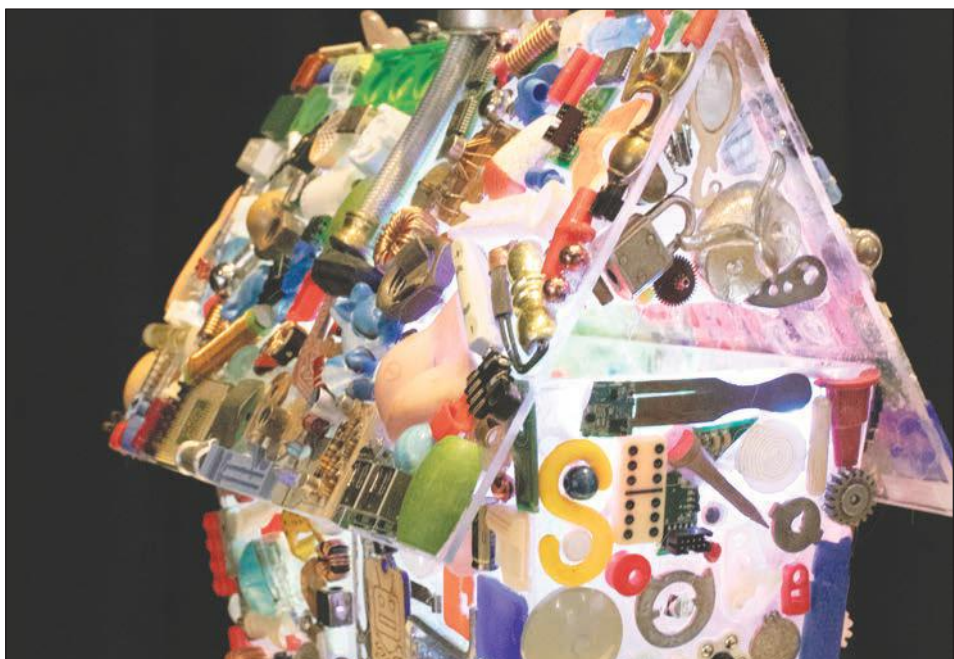
“Councils have diligently performed their role as Planning Authority and if a flawed decision is made, proponents and representors have the recourse to appeal.”

“This initiative will help us to deliver our target of 10,000 homes by 2030, and meet Tasmania’s affordable housing needs, by reducing unnecessary delays,” said Premier Rockliff.

The type and scale of projects eligible for the new process will be determined as legislation is developed, but are expected to include housing, social housing, large-scale developments and other proposals of community interest.

A value floor will also be implemented for non-prescribed project, including projects valued over \$10 million in urban centres and over \$5 million in rural areas.

Draft legislation will be out for consultation later this year, and it is anticipated it will be introduced to Parliament at the start of 2024.

“Council is calling for entries from all creative people, hobbyists, young people, community groups and schools who can redesign and repurpose waste materials into a piece of artwork,” Cr Wriedt said.

“The art exhibition’s theme this year is focused on the concept of Health and Wellbeing in Kingborough.

“Wellbeing includes those things that help you to feel healthy in your mind, body and heart.

“Things that provide a sense of belonging, purpose, joy, gratitude, hope and a connection to

nature.

“There will be prizes in the Open, Amateur, Young People, Children and Schools sections as well as a People’s Choice Award.”

The categories and prizes available include:

- Open Award - \$500
- Amateur Artist Award - \$250
- 13 - 17 years Award - \$150
- Up to 12 years Award - \$50
- Schools - \$250
- People’s Choice Award - \$100

Kingston to have second Coles supermarket

Previous reported as ‘Huntingfield Village’, the construction scheduled to commence in early 2024 (pending council approval) is now being referred to as ‘Spring Farm Village’.

Tipalea Partners has renamed its upcoming shopping centre to Spring Farm Village - a move that will better reflect what it will embody for the community, and as a nod to the neighbouring Spring Farm Road.

“We did some research, and on reflection we are really on the border of Kingston and Huntingfield, so decided that we wanted the centre’s name to be distinct from the suburbs themselves,” said Scott Spanton, CEO of Tipalea Partners.

“Spring Farm Village has a vibrancy that really resonates with the next-gen style shopping centre we will deliver,” he said.

The \$45 million Spring Farm Village will include a full solar array, EV charging stations, weather station, free wi-fi, wire-

less charging stations, a dedicated smart building app, cloud-based CCTV throughout, car counters, duress intercoms and a building information dashboard.

The site will have 16 supporting retailers and services including a medical centre and dental services, retail and take-away food outlets with a Coles supermarket taking up the largest footprint.

Coles has committed to open its largest supermarket in the region with a 4250 square metre store planned for Spring Farm Village.

Construction on the 3.7-hectare site and its ongoing management is set to generate more than 1200 jobs.

Tipalea Partners has a community information meeting planned for the evening of Tuesday, September 19 at the Kingborough Community Hub.

Indi Way arrives in Tasmania

A new way of doing politics hits the ground for the first time in Tasmania on July 30.

The Voices of Tasmania movement’s first public event will take place in Evandale.

It features guest speaker Mr Denis Ginnivan, the co-founder of the highly successful ‘Voices For Indi’ movement in rural Victoria.

He will speak alongside Voices of Tasmania convenor, Mr Michael Roberts, at six free public events called: The Indi Way - Let’s do democracy better.

The Kingston event will be held on August 3 at the Kingborough Community Hub.

Mr Ginnivan is also a co-author of the recently published book *The Indi Way* that describes the journey his commu-

nity went on to elect independents against the odds.

Michael Roberts said the time could not be better to launch the Voices movement in Tasmania.

“In Tasmania we have 10 new seats for the next state election, and this is the community’s chance to show how democracy can really work,” Mr Roberts said.

Voices of Tasmania will soon go public in calling for expressions of interest from prospective community independent candidates for the coming state and federal elections.

Mr Roberts said “Our community connection process for candidates is confidential and designed to support and develop prospective independents in the difficult choice of whether or not to run”.

WOODBIDGE

Speed reduction in Woodbridge

The speed reduction for Woodbridge Hill Road was followed up by Kingborough Councillor Amanda Midgley at the recent Kingborough Council meeting on Monday, July 17.

The Director of Engineering Services confirmed they contacted the Department of State Growth (DSG) with a submission to reduce the speed limit to 70 kms per hours.

Kingborough Council is waiting on a response from DSG, with the Director of Engineering Services saying “I think it’s fair to say that it’s not that they are not supportive of changing the speed limit, it’s just that they can’t come to a point of what the speed limit should be”.

Cr Midgley suggested the local community association could write a letter to help add weight to the speed limit change.

No forced amalgamations

Premier Jeremy Rockliff has said there will be no forced amalgamations. “We have listened to the concerns of Tasmanians and councils, and I want to end their fear and uncertainty,” the Premier said. “The Local Government Review Board is continuing their important work, but I want to make it clear this will not result in forced amalgamations. “Communities and councils will decide their own future.” Local Government Minister Nic Street said different communities have different needs, and the government’s process will ensure they have the final say. “I want to provide some comfort to Tasmanians by outlining the pathway that we will follow when the Board hands down its final report on October 31,” Minister Street said. “Each council will be invited to review the final report and make a submission to government about what they want. “Any plans agreed by councils will be taken to the community for a vote, to ensure it has community support to go ahead.”

This means Kingborough Council’s vote to merge with Huon Valley Council will be put to community members before it can be acted on. Local Government Association of Tasmania (LGAT) president Mick Tucker said “The commitment by Minister Street to work with interested councils and their communities through the next stages of reform will ensure the process delivers the appropriate change that is in the best interests of individual local areas”. “Local government reform should focus on delivering what communities need in a sustainable way. “The best way to do this is to create a more robust and capable system of local government.” Minister Nic Street said the level of community engagement and research undertaken by the Board had been exceptional, and their final report would provide a strong foundation for the future of local government in Tasmania. “I am confident that some councils will be eager to participate in this process, while others will not,” Minister Street said.

“But, importantly, it is for councils and communities to determine and they will have the final say.” Planning Matters Alliance of Tasmania (PMAT) held nine public meetings around the state and directly heard the concerns of the community, councillors and council staff about the direction the review process was heading. “This is a welcome announcement from Premier Rockliff, and we know there will be palpable relief in communities across Tasmania,” said state director of PMAT Sophie Underwood. “Experience interstate is that forced council mergers deliver poor outcomes for communities and local democracy. “The meetings PMAT held across the state heard community concerns about the loss of local representation, the sell-off of council assets, dismissal of staff and loss of local identity and local decision making.” What do you think about Kingborough Council’s vote to merge with Huon Valley Council? Out-of-hours care proposal

State Labor Leader and Member for Lyons, Rebecca White, and Member for Elwick, Josh Willie were in Blackmans Bay recently to announce Labor’s policy to extend After School Care.

The policy would see out-of-hours school care extended in 10 locations across the state to help Tasmanian families deal with the rising cost-of-living. This measure would come at a projected cost of \$0.9 million and the locations for the extension of after-hours care and would be determined through an EOI process based on local need. The commitment comes as part of a larger package to ease the costs parents face with education and training, which also includes increasing child-care subsidies for TAFE students, automatically allowing parents to pay school fees quarterly rather than all at once and providing more support to get kids playing sport.

Lower speed limit unlikely

Community requests to lower the speed limit on the Channel Highway, Davies Road near the bus stops in Snug are unlikely to eventuate.

The issue was discussed at the recent Kingborough Council meeting during Questions without Notice from Councillors and is an issue that is continually raised. The Department of State Growth (DSG) is responsible for the highway, and there have been several areas along the Channel Highway, including this area, that they have reviewed in the past that have not changed. Director of Engineering Services said “I don’t believe that they have provided anything back that has suggested a positive agreement to the changing of the speed limit”. “You could continue to petition with them for changes to speed limits but once they have made a decision in terms of what it happens to be, it is probably unlikely that they will change that decision, unless there are some other factors that come into play.”

Kingborough a big donor

DonateLife Week started on Sunday, July 23 and new data from the Australian Organ Donor Register (AODR) reveals the top five local government areas in Tasmania where the most people registered as donors.

In order, these are:
1. West Coast (62 per cent)
2. King Island (57 per cent)
3. Hobart (56 per cent)
4. Kingborough and Clarence (55 per cent)
5. Dorset (54 per cent).
A total of 4448 Tasmanians registered as organ and tissue donors in 2022, bringing the total to about 48 per cent of the Tasmanian population.
This above the national average of 36 per cent.
In Australia, families are always asked to support

someone's decision to be a donor before this goes ahead, so make sure your loved ones are aware of your wishes.
Sadly in 2022, around 30 Australians died while wait-listed for an organ transplant.
There are currently around 1800 people on the organ waitlist, and to help them, we need more Australians to register - and to tell their family their wishes.
57 Tasmanians received a transplant last year, and 18 Tasmanians who died became donors.
Anyone aged 16 and over can sign up online.
It doesn't matter how old you are, your medical history, your lifestyle, what country you're from or how healthy you are - you can still register as an organ and tissue donor in just one minute at donatelifet.org.au or with three taps in your Medicare app.

TINDERBOX

Baby kelp planting and study at Tinderbox

Project leader Professor Craig Johnson and the team are in full kelp farming mode following the Tasmanian Government issuing a scientific permit to deploy marine infrastructure and kelp species as part of a pivotal research program on growing kelp.
Professor Johnson said "If done correctly, growing kelp at a commercial scale can yield significant positive environmental outcomes as well as positive social and economic results".
The site is located south of Blackmans Bay and north of the Tinderbox Reserve in southern Tasmania.
This area is prime research real estate and adjacent to

a wastewater treatment plant so in nutrient-rich waters and is being used for research into developing new technologies and systems to support potential sustainable, commercial-scale offshore kelp production in Tasmania's temperate waters and beyond.
Phase One of the research was completed in June with infrastructure deployment consisting of three small rings and an underwater array, followed by the successful planting of microscopic kelp on lines.
Now the project team and local community wait for what is hoped to be 10-12 metres of kelp growth in just 12 months.

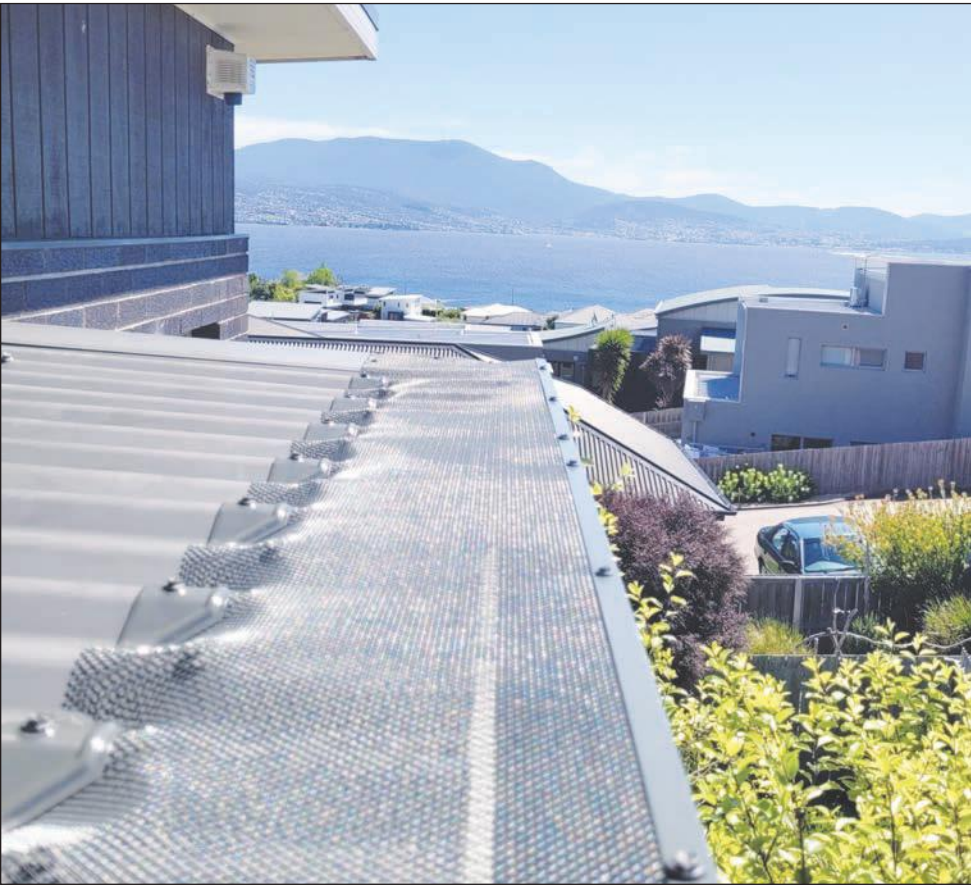

People call Gutter Knight Tasmania to solve many problems like improving tank water and installing effective ember guard, but mostly it's about keeping out the birds.

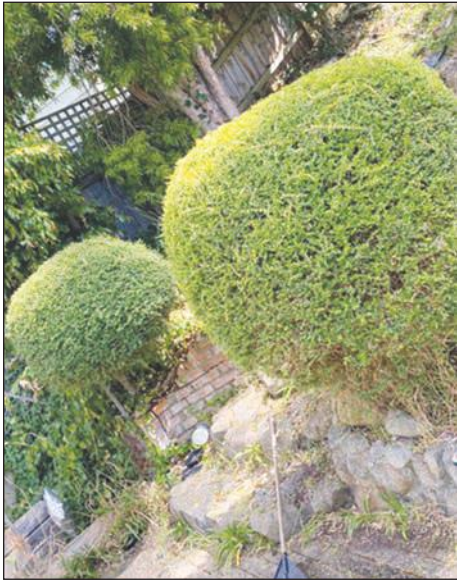

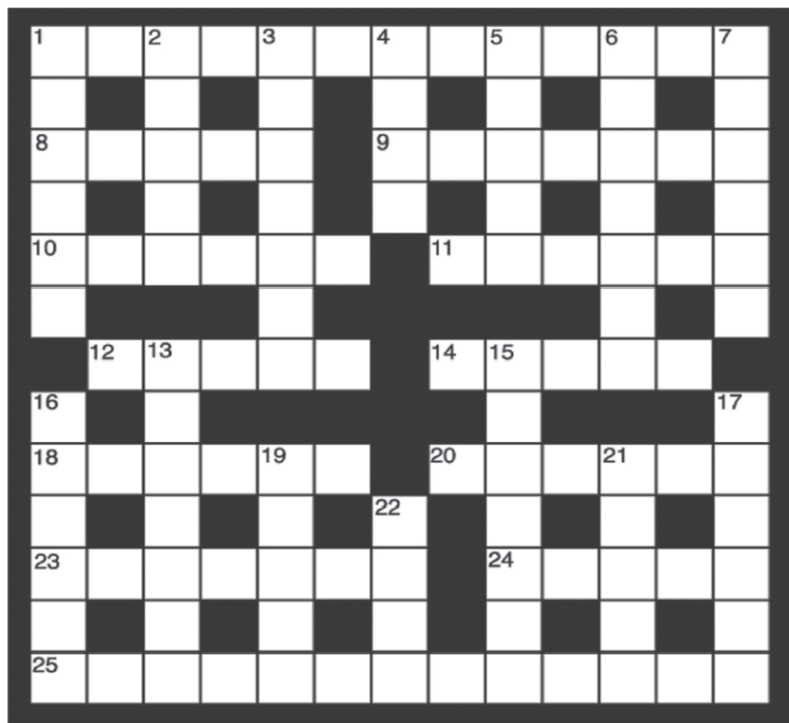
