

Taroona teacher's son shock cancer

Tasmanian musician and Head of Metal, Design and Technology at Taroona High School Tyler Richardson had to suddenly pack up for Melbourne with his wife, Alix, and their one-year-old son Harris, who was diagnosed with cancer.

Tyler and Alix will not be able to work for the next six to 12 months whilst Harris is being treated in the children's hospital.

Tyler's best friend Patrick Marshall set up a GoFundMe page for the family with a target to raise \$60,000.

Over twice that amount has been donated, with approximately 1700 donations adding up to an impressive \$152,403 raised for the Richardsons.

"Tyler and Alix took Harris to the doctor as he had been really unsettled and unwell for a number of weeks," Patrick said.

"Luckily the doctor they saw on the day referred them to a paediatrician, who quickly realised something wasn't right.

"Upon arrival at the hospital they discovered a growth in his abdomen, which turned out to be cancerous.

"Tyler and Alix have done so much for so many people, they are generous with both their time and money, and this fundraiser was a way for everyone they have touched to return the favour."

Support for the family has come from across the state, both near and far. Taroona High School principal Charles White said "The Taroona High School (THS) community are actively supporting the Richardsons".

"Students and staff are raising awareness of their situation, the related charities that support childhood cancer and the families of those affected.

"Members of the THS community have been active in their support of the GoFundMe page and the THS staff have the opportunity to support the Richardson's through a range of social and fundraising initiatives." Channel Highway landscape works

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt has confirmed now both lanes of the Channel Highway in Kingston's CBD are open the remaining work will focus on landscaping.

"Over August there is likely to be small interruptions to traffic flow whilst large pieces of street furniture and trees are installed," Cr Wriedt said.

Part of the construction work also includes an upgrade of the stormwater system underneath Hutchins Street and a bus interchange on the corner of Goshawk Way and Channel Highway.

"Until the whole project is complete the temporary bus stops will remain in Goshawk Way to reduce any further confusion with commuters," Cr Wriedt said.

The recount to fill the vacancy in the House of Assembly created by the resignation of Cassy O'Connor MP has been completed.

Greens Member for Franklin Rosalie Woodruff served as acting Greens leader until Vica Bayley was elected.

He will represent the division of Clark until the next general election. In a press release Mr. Bayley said "With the recount now complete, we're really excited about heading into parliament and making the most of the opportunity presented by

the balance-of-power in the House"

"It's an incredible privilege and a great responsibility to have been elected to the parliament."

Former state and federal Greens leader Bob Brown said he is jubilant at Vica Bayley's election to represent Clark in the House of Assembly.

"Vica is a worldly-wise man, born and bred in Tasmania, who sees our island state as a beacon of natural goodness in a rapidly deteriorating global environment," Mr Brown said.

Robotic technology developed in Kingston

Huon Aquaculture has joined forces with local tech business, Southern Ocean Subsea (SOSub), to launch a ground-breaking underwater robotic stitching tool that is set to revolutionise the aquaculture industry worldwide.

Developed by Kingston business SOSub and tested extensively on Huon's marine farms, this world-first technology employs state-of-the-art remotely operated underwater vehicles (ROV) to repair fish farming nets.

The innovative stitching tool enables accurate and efficient repairs to be carried out while the nets remain underwater.

Huon Aquaculture's subsea development manager, Dr Shea Cameron has been involved in extensive trials of the new technology and sees it as a gamechanger for the aquaculture industry.

"For the aquaculture industry the holy grail is net repair," Dr Cameron said.

"Traditional net repairs often necessitate bringing the nets to the surface or deploying a dive team to fix, leading to time-consuming disruptions in operations.

"However, the advent of underwater robotic stitching eliminates the need for net removal, enabling the repairs to be conducted in situ and freeing up the divers to work elsewhere.'

The remotely operated underwater vehicles are piloted by land-based operators who utilise cameras to identify breakages in the nets and conduct repairs.

The ROVs can travel faster than divers and operate at depths well beyond human limitations, reaching depths of up to 300 metres.

They are also designed to thrive in murkier conditions and stronger currents, ensuring optimal performance even in challenging environments.

SOSub co-founder Kelsey Treloar said the innovative technology represents a significant step forward for the aquaculture industry.

"The capability of the ROVs to work in deeper waters and in harsher conditions will support the growth of the aquaculture industry," Kelsey said.

"As the underwater robotic stitching technology continues to evolve, ongoing efforts are being made to optimise stitching techniques and enhance the efficiency of the ROVs."

Huon Aquaculture and SOSub believe that this ground-breaking technology will revolutionise net repair practices in the aquaculture industry, driving operational efficiency and promoting the long-term viability of sustainable aquaculture practices.

Game-changing approach to cardiovascular disease

Health and Aged Care Minister Mark Butler recently launched the country's new Cardiovascular Disease (CVD) Prevention Guideline and accompanying CVD Risk Calculator - a 'tool kit' that sets improved clinical standards for the prevention of cardiovascular disease before it takes hold.

The new guideline and calculator were developed by the National Heart Foundation of Australia on behalf of the Australian Chronic Disease Prevention Alliance (ACDPA) represented in this project by Diabetes Australia, Kidney Health Australia, and the National Stroke Foundation.

National Heart Foundation CEO David Lloyd said "The new Australian CVD Prevention Guideline is a tool kit for doctors, nurses and other healthcare workers to more accurately predict and prevent cardiovascular disease in as many as 8 million Australians".

One of the highlights of the new guideline is that it is calibrated specifically for the Australian population. The updated algorithm replaces one that was based on a town in the United States more than 60 years ago.

Other important updates to the guideline include updated risk categories, improved guidance on how to communicate CVD risk to patients, specific considerations for First Nations peoples who experience heart disease at higher rates than non-Indigenous Australians, and the inclusion of female specific risk factors.

Australian Chronic Disease Prevention Alliance Executive Officer Lucy Westerman said "Many of the actions recommended to reduce CVD risk have wider health benefits; for example, healthier diets, more physical activity, limiting alcohol and not smoking also help to reduce the risk and impact of several cancers, lung disease, and other chronic conditions".

"With up to 40 per cent of chronic disease burden preventable, helping people to better understand and manage factors contributing to chronic illness is essential for longer and healthier lives."

Kingston's floating wetlands

Kingborough Council has installed the first floating wetlands stormwater treatment system in Tasmania.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said with the development of Kingston Park and the increase in residential development in inner Kingston, Council needed to upgrade the stormwater treatment system.

"Floating wetlands have not been used previously in Tasmania but are becoming widespread across Australia as an innovative water treatment solution," Cr Wriedt said.

"The floating wetlands, designed by Atlan Stormwater utilises natural and sustainable technology to treat polluted stormwater collected in surrounding areas.

"They remove excess nutrients and eliminate sediment from the water column and have allowed the retrofit of the existing stormwater ponds with a positive environmental solution."

Operations and Maintenance Manager Oscar Salisbury said the wetland platforms allowed for the uptake of pollutants and toxins through natural processes.

"The wetlands systems were constructed with

carefully selected vegetation sitting on top of 600m² of recycled plastic pontoons," Mr Salisbury said.

'The technology is a sustainable, long-term solution that allows for continued growth and management of existing waterways, improving the quality of life for the surrounding ecosystem.

"The plants grow through the rafts and the water column, creating a large treatment mat which is 300 per cent more efficient than a standard wetland treatment system by equivalent area.

"In addition to the environmental benefits, the floating wetlands also contributes to the sustainability movement by supporting recycled products and promoting native plant life."

Cr Wriedt said the innovative wetlands design was by far the most cost-effective and efficient way to treat the stormwater and negated the need for large scale earthworks in the wetlands.

The upgrades are being co-funded by Kingborough Council and Traders in Purple, who are currently delivering 80 homes at Kingston Park as the first stage of the overall Kings Quarter master planned development.


Free talk on post disaster mental health

Some of these experiences and images have laid the foundation for Fiona's current exhibition at CuckoO etc. in Cygnet this month.






