Kingborough health and wellbeing check

Kingborough Council is beginning a public consultation on the health and wellbeing of the Kingborough community. Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Council had received a state government grant to develop and implement a health and wellbeing

plan for the community. "To help us develop the plan, Council will be running public engagement with the Kingborough community," Cr Wriedt said.

"The engagement will involve a community survey, consultation with health professionals, public workshops and events over the next eight weeks to gather and determine the community health and wellbeing needs before developing the plan.

"Events and workshops will provide 'taster' sessions like healthy cooking on a budget, low impact bootcamp sessions at Kingston Park, community yoga, nature activities and various health talks.

"Through this engagement Council will investigate ways of increasing social inclusion and connectivity through our nature, arts and cultural programs."

The surveys will help to identify gaps in community participation in health and wellbeing programs and finding the barriers to involvement will be a priority for Kingborough Council.

A particular focus will be on ways to connect with those who are isolated or not currently participating in health and wellbeing programs. Kingborough Council hopes to launch the health and wellbeing program for World Health Day in April 2024.

Council considers housing reforms

The Tasmanian Government has welcomed more funding for housing in Tasmania announced at National Cabinet last week. "Tasmania is strongly placed to secure its fair share of the newly

announced \$3 billion New Home Bonus," Premier Jeremy Rockliff said. The New Home Bonus will be awarded to states and territories if they help reach a new target of 1.2 million new homes over five years.

"A nine-point Better Deal for Renters was agreed at National Cabinet, and I am proud to say that Tasmania largely already delivers on seven of these measures," Premier Rockliff said.

The Better Deal includes measures such as reducing rent increases to once a year and considering options for better regulation of short-stay rental accommodation.

The latter has also been considered by Kingborough Council. Council's Monday meeting discussed the impact of short-stay accommodation on the local rental market.

"Council resolved that a report be prepared assessing this impact and considering options for ameliorating any such impact on housing and rental affordability in Kingborough," the meeting agenda read.

Debating short-stay accommodation

From front page

Data obtained from the Tasmanian Government indicates there are 464 short-stay accommodation facilities in Kingborough, with over half (246) of these being primary residences, as of September 2022.

Approximately half of all Kingborough short-stay accommodation is on Bruny Island.

There are also 45 properties being used for short-stay accommodation in Blackmans Bay, Bonnet Hill, Taroona, Kingston and Margate.

Council's meeting agenda suggested there are a range of advantages and disadvantages to short-stay accommodation.

Kingborough, for example, has limited commercial accommodation options for tourists.

Short-stay accommodation encourages tourists to spend more time and money in Kingborough. Concerns include local impacts such as parking, traf-

fic, noise and privacy. The biggest concern, however, is the potential to divert accommodation from the long-term rental market, subsequently decreasing rental availability and increasing rental prices.

There is no data available to assess whether this is occurring in Kingborough.

Given this lack of evidence, Council's meeting agenda proposes it is unnecessary to implement approaches to regulate or discourage short-stay accommodation at this time.



Tragedy far away hits close to home

The disastrous and deadly Maui wildfires are a grim reminder of what happened to southeast Tasmania on Tuesday, February 7, in 1967. On an extremely hot summer's day a series of wild bushfires left a trail of destruction;

62 people died, 900 were injured, and over 7000 were left homeless. The region around Hobart saw fires fanned by high winds so horrific that the coun-

tryside was laid bare, homes, factories, and infrastructure ruined. Snug, along with many other small towns, suffered irreparable damage.

"Residents today of the Huon and Channel region need to remember what damage a wildfire can do, creating havoc and destruction to the fabric of life as we know it today," David Hopkins from Lions Club of Kingborough said.

"This year the island of Maui, Hawaii on Tuesday, August 10 saw the deadliest US wildfire in more than 100 years.

"It broke out in the region suffering from drought conditions, the fires fanned by the vicious high winds of Hurricane Dora saw the dry grasslands and housing settlements transform the island into a tinderbox."

The Lions Club of Kingborough are seeking the support of the local community to

send funds to Maui.

There are six Lions Clubs in Hawaii already helping, and every dollar and cent raised through the Lions Club of Kingborough will be sent to assist them with aid and rebuild what was lost.


"Power and communications were lost, exacerbated by the ferocious winds fanning the fires unabated, destroying buildings and vehicles with people fleeing to find safety," continued David.

"The historic township of Lahaina, a popular tourist destination with buildings of cultural significance, was significantly destroyed, leaving an estimated destruction bill of many billions.

"Officials with cadaver dogs continue to search the wreckage for unaccounted victims of this tragedy, now at more than 100 people.

"In the aftermath of Maui, which is so close to what we suffered some 56 years ago, Lions Clubs locally and worldwide will endeavour to provide relief funds to assist in the rebuilding of the island's communities.

"To this end, the Lions Club of Kingborough seeks your donation in support," said David.

Tarremah students cook for community

Recently five Year 9 students from Tarremah Steiner School, Huntingfield cooked 40 meals to be frozen for Kingston Neighbourhood House (KNH).

The ingredients were kindly donated by Year 9 families.

Year 9 had studied *The Simple Gift*, a collection of fictional poems about a young boy experiencing homelessness in regional Australia.

They began looking into the experiences of people during the current cost of living crisis and thinking about what they could do.

The next day, a teacher heard David Morse from KNH

speaking on ABC Radio.

KNH provides frozen meals directly to members of the community who are in need, as well as distributing meals to local shelters assisting people facing homelessness.

David spoke about how KNH really needed food donations and meals. Each class at the school will bring in the ingredients

to cook 50 meals for one week in the term. Year 9 collect these ingredients and cook with them

on a Thursday to then donate to KNH. They are planning on continuing the program until the end of the year.

Consultation underway on AFL team home

The Tasmanian Government has begun discussions with Greater Hobart councils to find a home for Tasmania's AFL Team.

The team's training and administration facility will underpin the attraction and retention of high-quality players, coaches, support staff and administrators to the club. Minister for Stadia and Events Nic Street said the site selection was a vital step towards our own team.

"The state government is working closely with councils and the communities they represent as well as other key stakeholders to find suitable sites across Greater Hobart for the Tasmanian AFL team Training and Administration Centre," he said.

"A preferred site hasn't been determined yet, but as we work with councils towards finding the ideal location, we will be sure to engage the community on what this opportunity can deliver for them.

"Not only will the centre provide players and staff every opportunity to be successful on and off the field, it will be an important community asset and a beacon of health and wellbeing in the state.

"This is Tasmania's team, and we want all Tasmanians to feel welcome at its home."

The state government has committed up to \$60 million for the centre, with a further \$10 million investment having been committed by the AFL.

It is anticipated that the process to be used for site assessment and selection of the preferred site will be announced in September after completion of initial consultation with councils.

Kettering to Deep Bay speed limit

The Channel Highway will become 80 kilometres per hour all the way from Kettering to Deep Bay from September.

The Commissioner for Transport has approved a speed limit reduction on four sections of the highway to provide a consistent speed limit for the entire length. The decision to lower the speed limits was based

on the characteristics of the different sections of the road, including the winding nature of the road and to improve safety.

Drivers will now know that the speed limit along this whole stretch is 80km/h when previously Kettering to Woodbridge, Woodbridge to Middleton, and Gordon and Verona Sands were 90 km/h and Charlotte Cove to

Deep Bay was 100 km/h.

Middleton to Gordon and Verona Sands to Charlotte Cove were already 80 km/h.

The speed limits on these sections were reviewed after a motorcycle road safety audit of the Channel Highway from Margate to Verona Sands and a request from the community.

The changed speed limit will come into effect once the new speed limit signs have been installed, which is scheduled for August 21-25.

'New speed limit ahead' signs will also be placed to warn road users of the change. Road users are reminded to follow the posted speed

limits and always drive to the conditions.



Bushfire Ready Neighbourhoods

Tasmania's Bushfire Ready Neighbourhoods (BRN) program is being rolled out in 15 more communities this spring, to engage with local people about bushfire prevention, preparedness and response.

Tasmania Fire Service Acting Director of Community Fire Safety Chris Collins said the program was first piloted in 2009.

"The BRN program uses a community development approach to encourage shared responsibility between individuals, communities, and emergency management agencies when it comes to bushfires," he said.

"The program taps into risk communication research and expertise to best educate people and encourage them to adopt personal preparedness measures for bushfire emergencies.

"The BRN team actively works with identified commu-

nities across Tasmania, based on a rigorous risk management assessment."

BRN aims to raise community bushfire preparedness levels by promoting local resilience strategies, including building community capacity to prevent, prepare for, and respond to bushfires.

Program activities include meeting with residents and community groups, focus groups, field days, property assessments, public forums and workshops, as well as the provision of community engagement information to local volunteer brigades.

Native garden opening for spring

Inverawe Native Gardens is preparing to open on September 1 after a winter close. There are plants in flower throughout the garden

thanks to an early spring. The grevilleas, who do well traditionally, are flowering,

as are the wattles who beat Wattle Day, September 1, by a couple of weeks.

Scarlet blaze, an unusual wattle, is blazing away in scarlet already.

Plants are selected for the garden that suit the often dry and occasionally very wet climate, that resist frosts, and that provide year-round colour when collected in the garden.

With native plants there is plenty of choice. Native plants attract 111 species of birds to the garden. They range from sea eagles and wedge-tails, often seen overhead, to tiny thornbills, darting in and out of the grass.

New Holland honeyeaters, all boldness and swagger, own the central part of the garden.

They take insects for protein and nectar from the flowers for energy.

Along the way they help by transferring pollen from plant to plant.

Better still, with spring growth the pademelons will switch from pruning garden plants to eating grass. Inverawe invites you to visit sometime soon.

"Last year's grant recipients included the Kingborough Bowls and Community Club who received \$4200 to purchase exercise equipment and instructions for seniors, and the Kingston Neighbourhood House received \$4385 to promote intergenerational home food gardens.

"These are great examples of how the grant program brings together communities, services and different levels of government to work hand in hand in the best interests of the community.

"I encourage community sector organisations, community groups and local government to apply for a grant if they see an opportunity to improve the health and wellbeing of Tasmanians."
