Cuts to Metro bus services

Metro Tasmania indefinitely suspended 180 services on Monday, August 28.

CEO Katie Cooper said driver shortages were impacting service reliability.

Whilst there will be fewer services running, those in operation will be more reliable.

Ms Cooper said school bus services would not be affected.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said between Monday to Thursdays it seemed 26 bus services were removed and around 20 on Fridays for Kingborough.

"Whilst I understand that Metro is having difficulties recruiting enough bus drivers, there are many people around the municipality who solely rely on public transport to get to work and medical

appointments," Cr Wriedt said.


"These cuts will impact residents not only in central Kingborough but also services have been cut for Snug, Woodbridge and Margate.

"Unfortunately, some of the new express services that were heralded widely will be affected.


"If you take out 26 bus services from Monday to Thursday then people who have cars will use them which puts more strain on our already congested roads into Hobart."

Local dance student competing in London

Sarah's coach Shayne Davies hopes to fly up to London with her.

The competition runs for more than a week, with workshops followed by three days of semi-finals in which Sarah will perform a classical variation, an original contemporary piece and a new work commissioned by the RAD (to be learnt at the workshops), as well as taking class live on stage in front of an audience.

All these activities form part of the selection process whereby a small number of candidates progress to the final.

Surf Life Club of the Year

Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club (KBSLSC) received three awards at the Tasmanian State Awards night for Surf Life Saving Tasmania.

KBSLSC was recognised with Club of the Year, Innovation of the Year and a patrol member was awarded the National Medal for 15 years of continuous service.

KBSLSC president Danielle Campbell said it was “A weekend that we will never forget”.

“We are so humbled and honoured to be recognised and congratulate the other clubs who were nominees in this category.”

The club's Innovation of the Year was given for their ‘discoverable defibrillators, a community responder programme’.

In 2019 KBSLSC recognised there were no public 24/7 accessible defibrillators around Kingston.

Four units were available in the Kingston CBD, but only during business hours.

KBSLSC applied for a grant through the Tasmanian Government and Ambulance Tasmania to instal a defibrillator unit at Kingston Beach and another in Blackmans Bay.

KBSLSC are still hard at work making improvements to their community.

The club is commencing mental health First Aid training with one of their members already trained as an instructor ready to roll out a course for fellow members and potentially other small organisations.

KBSLSC are also planning to secure funds for more equipment to maximise water time in their Nippers program and purchase beach matting for the start of the 2023/24 season to make the beach more wheelchair accessible for the community.

Crowdfunding mural

Blackmans Bay Primary school is crowdfunding to raise money to commission a mural by Tasmanian artist Dr Jamin.

The project is designed to add beauty to the School, help people feel good and create an inspiring place to learn.

The mural will feature local endangered species and the vital habitat that Blackmans Bay provides to keep them from going extinct.

Dr Jamin is a well-recognised artist with a PhD in fine art.

His message of making an honest and successful life out of spray paints is an important one.

He will also be able to teach the students basics of spray painting and other art lessons.

Kingborough Council has agreed to provide talks to the school about habitat, the important trees in the area and how the bird species in the murals use the habitat.

These lessons will be tailored to Blackmans Bay primary school and will have art, biology and science components that all speak to our local endangered species, and our responsibility to create and protect their habitat.

Volunteers plant for the future

The Friends of Longley Area Group (FLAG) has been active in revegetating parts of Longley Park and recreation ground over the past two years.

In 2022 volunteers planted approximately 600 native grasses, rushes, bushes and trees.

Further plantings in June and July 2023 have brought the total to around 1000 plants.

This activity has been undertaken in partnership with Kingborough Council, which has provided all plants and materials.

FLAG president Mike Brough said “It’s great seeing the community come together with a common goal of

restoring some of Longley’s beautiful, lost native vegetation through the dedication and hard work of our volunteers”.

Mr Brough added that this work would complement the objectives and actions detailed in the Longley Recreation Reserves Master Plan, which was adopted by Council at its August 21 meeting.

“Both FLAG and local communities in the Longley area appreciate the support of Kingborough Council in improving the beauty and amenity of our natural places reserves for local residents and visitors alike,” Mr Brough said.

Fuel reduction program

This week advertising will begin about fuel reduction burning in spring, as the state-wide Fuel Reduction Program ramps up its efforts before the bushfire season arrives.

Minister for Fire and Emergency Management Felix Ellis said that a scientific and effective fuel reduction program is part of keeping Tasmanians safe.

“Tasmania is one of the most bushfire prone areas in the world and preparing for bushfires is everyone’s responsibility,” Mr Ellis said.

“Fuel reduction will not prevent bushfires from occurring, but the potential damage of fires will be reduced, making it easier and safer for firefighters to control fires.”

Since the Fuel Reduction Program began in 2014, 1340 burns have been completed across Tasmania, covering more than 180,000 hectares.

Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) acting Deputy Chief Officer Shane Batt said personnel at TFS, Tasmania Parks and Wildlife Service and Sustainable Timber Tasmania work diligently throughout the year to help prepare the state for bushfire season.

“We work year-round to manage bushfire risk, but spring is another chance for us to conduct fuel reduction activities

and make summer safer,” Mr Batt said.

“We’re expecting the next bushfire season to be drier than in recent years, and it’s likely we’ll have more extreme fire weather and bushfires.

“Over the last few years, we have seen firsthand how planned fuel reduction burning has reduced the impact of bushfires, either by preventing ignitions or making conditions safer for effective firefighting.

“Bushfire risk reduction is a shared responsibility between governments, industries, and the community, which means we all have a role to play.”

For spring 2023, plans are in place for more than 40 burns covering more than 3300 hectares and will go ahead subject to conditions being suitable.

The key fuel reduction burns that are being targeted in early spring (weather permitting) are: Binalong Bay, Bicheno, Scamander, Latrobe, the Lea (near Kingston) and Margate.

The government has invested over \$115 million into fuel reduction initiatives.

Minister Ellis said any landowners interested in learning what to do to reduce their fire risks should get in touch with the Red Hot Tips program to learn more.

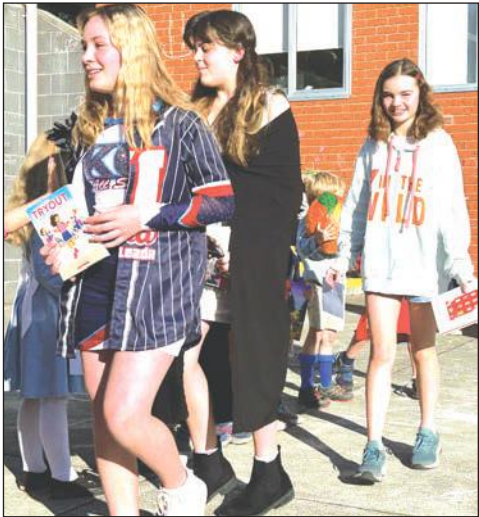

Operating your business through a company

Our business clients frequently ask if they should be trading through a company.

We often recommend a simpler structure at the beginning with the potential to progress to a company as business becomes more profitable and complex.

There are also situations where people who don't follow the rules should never be allowed near a company.

A company is a separate legal entity which has shareholders who own the show and directors who run the show.

Shareholders receive a return on their investment and directors are paid for their services.

In a mum and dad private company, shareholders and directors are typically the same people.

Companies that run small businesses have a flat income tax rate of 25 per cent which is advantageous when the business is very profitable.

We accountants enjoy spreading income amongst companies, super funds and individuals to minimise tax, build wealth and reduce risk for our clients.

There is a lot to learn about company structures and responsibilities of those involved and you should only take the leap after you have done your homework.

Here are some pros and cons to consider:

Company structures - the advantages:

- Flat rate of income tax. A business with healthy profits will pay less tax and have more funds to invest back into the business.
- Limited liability. If something dire happens within the company, you are less likely to lose your house than you are in a partnership or sole trader structure.
- Multiple owners and change of ownership. The underlying ownership can change while the company continues to trade as usual.
- Succession. Companies can be multi-generational because the survive the death of shareholders and directors.

Company structures - the disadvantages:

- More expensive. It costs more to set up and run a company than a sole trader or partnership.
- More complex. There are rules to learn and follow and more onerous reporting obligations.
- More restrictive. You can't take the profits and use them as you would via drawings in a partnership, company or trust. You can essentially only do this via salary or dividends.

Example

Gordon runs a home renovation business which is really starting to take off.

He kept it simple in the beginning, choosing to be a sole trader, but is heading for a \$400,000 annual profit and more than half of this will be taxed at the 47 per cent tax rate - ouch.

His wife Gemma pulls in \$60,000 from nursing, juggling her time between part-time work and motherhood, dumping the snotty-nosed kids on their grandparents whenever she can.

This young couple is starting to lose sleep over rising tax bills and unsavoury stories from the building industry concerning worker injuries, bankruptcies etc.

A trip to the accountant confirms that it is time to launch into a company to minimise tax and reduce business risk.

The \$400,000 profit eventuates. Gordon takes a wage of \$80,000 and Gemma is paid \$20,000 for admin duties.

The remaining \$300,000 is retained in the company and taxed at 25 per cent instead of mostly being taxed at 47 per cent.

They will save well over \$50,000 in tax.

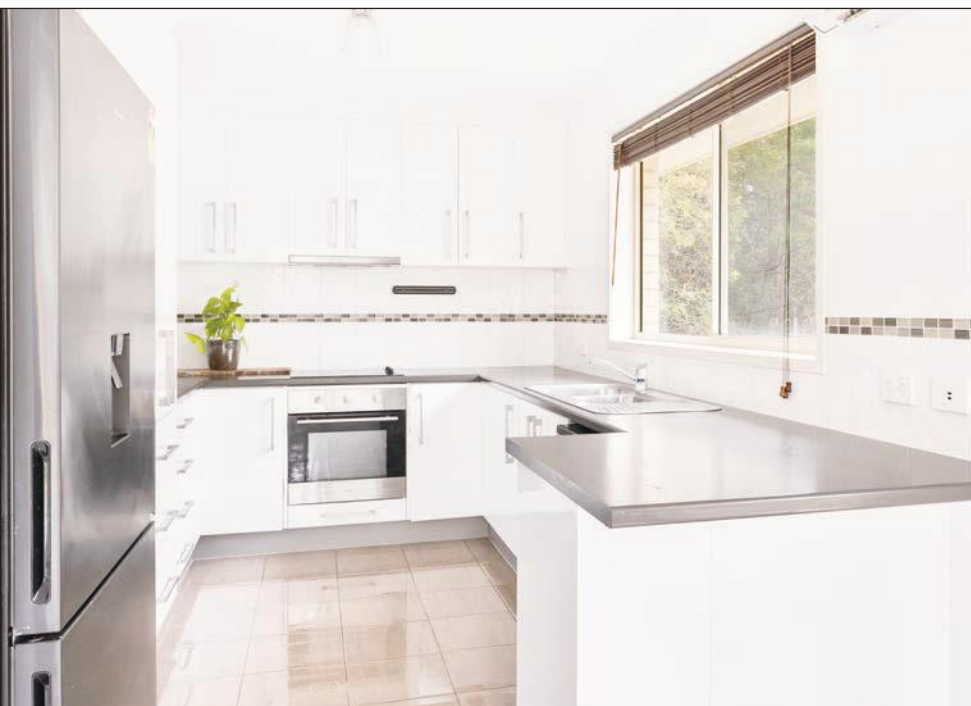

Click.Store.Go

The government and Road Safety Advisory Council's (RSAC) Click.Store.Go campaign, which was launched in April this year, will now see a new phase as mobile phone and seatbelt detection cameras have completed testing and begin enforcement in Tasmania.

"We've undertaken an extensive education and awareness campaign to let Tasmanians know these cameras are coming to our roads and many will have seen them on the roadside while they've been in their testing phase," said RSAC Chair Scott Tilyard.

The second phase of the Click.Store.Go campaign was launched last week in line with the commencement of enforcement.

This phase informs road users the detection cameras are now live in Tasmania and if you're doing the wrong thing, you will be caught.

"Drivers who are caught using their mobile phones or not wearing a seat belt correctly will not only be hit with a fine of \$390 but also three demerit points," said Mr Tilyard.

Distraction is a contributing factor in 24 per cent of fatal and serious injury crashed in Tasmania.

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said already this year we had seen 18 lives

needlessly lost on our roads. "We remain committed to improving road safety for all Tasmanians, saving lives and preventing serious life-changing injuries," Mr Ferguson said.

"The new mobile phone and seatbelt cameras will be located at hundreds of approved sites around Tasmania and operate both day and night and in all weather conditions.

"Just like our mobile speed cameras, they can be anywhere and at any time."

The increased use of mobile phones while driving is a type of distraction that has the biggest impact on driving behaviour.

Evidence shows distraction caused by mobile phones can impair performance in a number of ways, notably braking reaction time, reaction to traffic signals, ability to keep in the correct lane, shorter following distances, and an overall reduction in awareness of what is happening around you.

Unlike distraction, incorrectly wearing a seatbelt is not necessarily the cause of crashes, but it does increase the severity of the injury in the event of a crash.

Wearing a correctly fitted seatbelt reduces the risk of being killed in a crash by up to 50 per cent.

"The message is simple, click on your seatbelt, store your phone away, and you are good to go," Mr Ferguson said.

Robodebt Royal Commission report

The establishment of the Royal Commission into Robodebt was an election commitment of the federal government, with Commissioner Catherine Holmes AC SC recently delivering her final report.

Federal Member for Franklin Julie Collins said this is another step toward delivering justice for victims.

"The Royal Commission has been an independent process, carried out at arm's length from government," said Ms Collins.

"Throughout the Royal Commission process, we have seen courage, leadership, and ethics on display from victims, their advocates, and whistle-blowers.

"I'm proud to be part of a government that is standing up

for victims of this harmful scheme that disproportionately impacted Tasmanians."

New analysis shows that of the more 430,000 victims of the Robodebt scheme, approximately 11,300 were from Tasmania.

Approximately 1750 of those victims were people in the electorate of Franklin.

Robodebt raised almost \$1.8 billion in debts against hundreds of thousands of Australians.

The government is now considering the 57 recommendations presented in the final report.
