Tough toddler fighting cancer

Last month Tyler and Alix Richardson suddenly left for Melbourne to take their one-year-old son Harris to a children's hospital for cancer treatment.

Harris has undergone his first round of chemotherapy and is responding well so far.

Family friend Patrick Marshall set up a GoFundMe page for the Richardsons with the aim to raise \$60,000 to help cover their mortgage and any other unforeseen costs.

Neither parent can work whilst Harris is being treated. Tyler is the Head of Metal, Design and Technology at Taroona High School.

The family received such overwhelming support that they have suspended further donations after a staggering \$167,670 was raised. They now ask if you would like to donate to contribute to Red Kite

and Challenge as their preferred charities instead. Patrick Marshall said Harris is "Thriving like the legend he is".

"We've still got a long road ahead, but it's so amazing to see his tumour shrinking already and his pain easing. "Seeing that bloody smile return to his face is the best thing

Car thief trapped in Kingston garage

Police have charged a 26-year-old man from Geeveston with motor vehicle stealing, attempted carjacking, aggravated burglary and driving offences after he was arrested at a residence in Kingston last week.

Around 8.00pm on Monday, August 28 the man reportedly stole a maroon Subaru Forester from Huonville before driving at speed on the Huon Highway towards Sandfly and Kingston.

He was allegedly involved in several incidents along the highway before being located by police in the garage of a Kingston residence. The man was reportedly attempting to steal another car from the

residence's garage but instead accidentally trapped himself inside. Thankfully, no one was injured as a result of the incidents.

The man appeared in Hobart Magistrates Court on Tuesday, August 29.



Cancelled bus services

Last week Metro Tasmania cancelled 26 services every day that will affect Kingborough travellers as part of their 'temporary service adjustments'.

The main routes impacted in Kingborough are: X01, X07, X13, 407, 408, 412, 413, 415, 426, 429, 500.

"While I appreciate that there is a shortage of bus drivers, I hope these service changes are only temporary and don't become permanent, as they will impact our residents who live in all areas, but particularly the Channel," Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said.

Voice campaigners in Margate

Yes23, the campaign for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament enshrined in the Australian Constitution, hit the streets of Margate for a day of door-to-door conversations. The team of Yes23 volunteers were joined by Federal Labor Member for Franklin

Julie Collins MP and Labor Senator Catryna Bilyk. On October 14 Australians will have the opportunity to vote on whether Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people should be recognised in the Constitution through a

Voice to Parliament. Senator Bilyk said the doorknocking campaign was about providing a greater understanding of the referendum, what is proposed and why it is being held.

"The team of Yes23 volunteers were able to speak to hundreds of Margate residents and enjoyed getting out and about in the town I was raised in as a child," Senator Bilyk said. "Through these conversations we found that people still have a lot of questions about the referendum.

Sadly, there is a lot of misinformation around about the referendum proposal, and the benefit of these conversations was to clarify what is actually proposed and answer

auestions

"We were able to explain that the idea for the Voice did not come from politicians, but from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders and elders as the result of many years of work and countless conversations throughout their communities.

"We were also able to explain that the Voice was about recognising Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, listening to them and getting better results on closing the gap in disadvantages faced by Indigenous people."

Federal Member for Franklin Julie Collins said the referendum is about recognition, listening and better results for all Australians

"This is our opportunity to recognise 65,000 years of history, tradition, and culture," said Ms Collins.

"It was a privilege to volunteer alongside a team of Yes23 volunteers in our electorate and help to answer questions on what voting yes is all about.

"The result of this referendum will not affect many of us but for those that it will impact a yes result will improve lives and opportunities.

Support for quoll habitat

The Tramway Hill Landcare Group (THLG) recently spent nine hours working on the Tramway Hill Reserve.

One of the issues under discussion included the federally funded Saving Native Species (Priority Species) grant and the possibility of THLG using it to incorporate more quoll habitat on the reserve.

Multiple possible sites for the construction of quoll habitats have been identified.

The presence of the weed Kunzea ericodies (burgan) was confirmed.

This plant is easily confused with the native tea-tree. Cat management, camera monitoring of the reserve and the possible removal of fences that hinder free movement of native animals from adjacent bushland were also discussed.

Rubbish removed from the site included lengths of electric fence tape, torn plastic tree guards, general plastic and a broken folding table and chairs that was left in the shelter.

Susan Quinnell, who will be heading up the quol habitat project, feels she will be unable to complete a grant application by the due date of September 7.

THLG is looking for any organisation or person who can assist with grant writing.

Should the grant not be submitted, THLG will assess where else assistance can be sought to progress this project.
