Bringing water to Kingborough

The upgraded Bryn Estyn water treatment plant recently opened with Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt saying the plant will supply 60 per cent of Greater Hobart's water supply needs.

"This state-of-the-art facility will enable the reliable supply of 160 million litres of water per day," Cr Wriedt said.

During construction the project employed around 1500 people directly, and 500 indirectly.

At its peak around 150 people were working on site every day.

"The upgrade of the Bryn Estyn water treatment plant ensures safe, clean drinking water will be available for generations of Tasmanian from Bothwell to Blackmans Bay, and New Norfolk to Sorell," TasWater CEO George Theo said.

Water from Bryn Estyn travels through 433 kilometres of water mains and into 145 reservoir tanks before reaching the taps of customers in Kingborough, Hobart, Glenorchy, Brighton, Derwent Valley, Southern Midlands, Sorell and Clarence.

TasWater's Head of Water and Environment Services Fran Smith said the upgrade expanded the capacity for the organisation to deliver greater volumes of high-quality, safe drinking water for Kingborough.

"Each drop of water that has passed through Bryn Estyn has been subjected to a treatment process that includes filtration, ozone, absorption using activated carbon, chlorination, and now UV disinfection for an extra layer of treatment," Ms Smith said.

Ms Smith said opening the upgraded plant was an exciting day for the entire team.

Local Inspector commemorates

Five police officers have passed away in the line of duty in the last twelve months, including Tasmania Police Constable Andrew Loring.

Housing climate is prohibitively expensive

Dear Editor,
Your correspondent Michael Whayman does not think that building high density housing will help solve Australia's housing crisis, largely because, in his opinion, such developments don't foster social amenity for the folk who live in them. I disagree.
The Aussie dream of a quarter acre block with a house for the nuclear fami-

ly and the consequent suburban sprawl is no longer a realistic option.
It is best for big cities like Greater Hobart to look towards high density housing models, in my opinion.
However, there are ways to build high density housing complexes.
There must be conservative height limits, provision for green spaces and community spaces, access to amenities and

easily accessible public transport options.
Since I moved to Kingston six years ago, I have noticed a pretty random approach to the building of some new unit developments here.
Move onto a vacant block, chop 99 per cent of the trees and other vegetation down and build as many units as possible on the land looks to be the preferred development approach of the

Kingborough Council.
As Mr Whayman points out, renting privately in the current housing climate is prohibitively expensive.
I live in a unit and find there is a sense of community in my strata development which I did not experience when I was living in houses on quarter acre blocks.

Stolen property

Two Risdon Vale men, aged 32 and 27, were recently charged with stealing property from across southern Tasmania, including as far down south as Kettering.

Other suburbs that were targeted were Sandy Bay, Hobart, Glenorchy, Austins Ferry, New Norfolk, Geilston Bay and Seven Mile Beach.

Police executed search warrants at three addresses in Risdon Vale, seizing a stolen firearm, firearm parts, a substantial amount of stolen property including three E-bikes, three motorcycles, a ride-on lawnmower, tools and jewellery.

Police also seized various illicit and prescription-only drugs and drug-related items.

Both men were charged with numerous burglary, stealing, property and drug offences.

The 32-year-old man was also charged on other matters and was detained to appear in in the Hobart Magistrates Court.

A third man from Campania, aged 32, was arrested and was also detained to appear in court.

Investigations are continuing regarding the seized firearm and firearm parts.

Dog Management Policy Consultation

Public engagement on the updated Kingborough Dog Management Policy began on Saturday, September 30 and runs for four weeks until Saturday, October 28.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Kingborough Council is committed to creating a community that is inclusive, safe, welcoming, and respectful for all.

"The Dog Management Policy regulates the control of dogs in public spaces, determines the locations for off-lead exercise areas and outlines other declared areas in the best interest of the community and environment," Cr Wriedt said.

"I know Kingborough has many passionate dog owners, with nearly 6000 registered dogs, so this consultation will be an important review for the community to contribute to.

"Community engagement is a critical component and Council will use this process to receive submissions and update the policy following the community's responses."

Feedback can be provided through the public survey or by presenting a more comprehensive response through a written or emailed submission.

Various stakeholders were consulted with across the development of the updated policy and one, new off-lead dog exercise area is proposed.

This potential new off-lead area is the sandy area of the southern end of Snug Beach and has been included in the updated policy document now out for consultation.

There is also another dog exercise area proposed for the community to consider - Blackmans Bay Beach, starting from south of the stormwater outlet (sand only) to the end of the beach area.

The Blackmans Bay Beach potential off-lead dog exercise area was not placed into the

policy document as the request came through to Councillors from the Kingborough Dog Walking Association just prior to the meeting at which this policy was considered.

"Council has decided to insert both potential areas into the survey to find out what the community thinks of these ideas," Cr Wriedt said.

"I want to assure everyone that the decision to introduce more dog beaches would not be taken lightly, there would have to be substantial public support for any new areas introduced, but we also appreciate that Kingston's dog beach is becoming very crowded and so we should consider other options.

"As Chair of Council's Disability Inclusion Access Advisory Committee, I'm aware that there are likely to be people without access to transport, who are elderly or who have mobility issues, who aren't able to get to Kingston to take their dog to the off-lead beach area, or who can't access the Suncoast off-lead track.

"This would provide those locals with another opportunity in an area of Blackmans Bay Beach that isn't as popular as other parts.

"The question of whether dogs should be allowed off lead on the southern end of Blackmans Bay Beach has been discussed for well over a decade and I know there are varied opinions on this matter, so it would be useful to ask the community what they think."

In the lead up to this public engagement staff have worked with stakeholder groups such as Kingborough Dog Walking Association and the Kingborough Disability Inclusion and Access Committee to determine the proposed new areas and updates in the policy.

Fast charging for Kingborough

Two fast chargers have been installed for the public to use in the Kingborough Council carpark.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the chargers would deliver 40 kilowatts of fast charging capacity each and enable people to charge their car while visiting Kingston.

"This is much needed infrastructure in our community and since these chargers came online a few weeks ago they have been well used by the community already," Cr Wriedt said.

"The chargers are owned by Electric Highway Tasmania and operated through the Chargefox network.

"Currently, users are able to access the system through the downloadable Chargefox app.

"Charging times will vary according to battery size and the level of charge.

"When the battery is low, typically the charger will add

about 30 kilometres of range in 10 minutes.

"As supply and variety of available Electric Vehicles (EV) improves and as State and Federal incentives such as stamp duty relief and grants for charging infrastructure circulate, it is expected there will be an improved take up of EVs."

The Council currently has three EVs in the fleet, plus eight hybrid vehicles.

Their turf cutting fleet now also includes two hybrid reel mowers located at Twin Ovals.

"Council's support of an electric vehicle future is a demonstration of our ongoing commitment to addressing climate change and reducing carbon emissions," Cr Wriedt said.

"Our intention is to move towards more EVs in the fleet based on availability, suitability and price point."

Metro Tasmania support package

An estimated \$8.1 million support package has been announced for Metro Tasmania.

The package covers a range of initiatives including personal safety, a pay rise, and more attractive rosters to recruit and retain bus drivers.

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said that he'd like to see full services restored as soon as possible.

"Metro has told us these initiatives will best assist with its bus driver shortage, and we are strongly responding," Mr Ferguson said.

"The Government is prepared to fund a pay rise of \$2 million this financial year, outside of the current enterprise agreement for Metro's bus drivers.

"This is subject to Metro reaching agreement with its bus operators that is reasonable and affordable."

"Low unemployment is a good thing, but it's made it harder for employers like Metro to recruit.

Metro is currently investigating security screens to provide a protective barrier for drivers, and the Government is committing \$2.1 million to implement them.

They will also take a tougher position by banning troublemakers who flout the rules.

"Phase two of our transit officer deployment will now be accelerated, which will see individual officers autho-

risied by the Transport Commissioner to have new, tougher powers including issuing infringement notices and removing disorderly passengers," Mr Ferguson said.

"The pilot of transit officers in the south of the state has been met with positive feedback since their introduction in early April, bringing comfort to drivers and passengers.

"The deployment of body-worn cameras acts as a deterrent and provides crucial evidence when passengers do the wrong thing."

The Government will provide a further \$2 million to enable Metro to implement an improved IT system to replace its ageing rostering system that currently limits flexible working arrangements.

This will enable Metro to offer flexible and more attractive rosters to attract more drivers.

Member for Franklin David O'Byrne said he found it disappointing that nearly a thousand weekly services were cancelled before this support was announced.

"The announcement of a one-off Metro funding boost does not make up for years of this Government's deliberate lack of investment into Tasmania's public transport network," Mr O'Byrne said.

"Metro bus operators are some of the lowest paid bus operators in the nation, which has contributed to the mass exodus of drivers over the last few years."

Employment white paper response

National Seniors Australia's submission to the Government's employment white paper called for the Government to adopt policies that support greater workforce participation.

This included reducing the income test taper rate from 50 cents on the dollar to 32.5 cents on the dollar for pensioners who want and need to work.

National Seniors Australia Chief Advocate Mr Ian Henschke said "National Seniors welcomes the permanent increase in the work bonus from \$7800 to \$11,800".

"It shows the Government is willing to listen, but it must go further."

Mr Henschke said National Seniors Australia's policy has the full support of the Australian Council of Trade Unions (ACTU), the Health Services Union, and the National Farmers Federation.

"Demand for care and support workers is set to double by 2050," Mr Henschke said.

"Older people are dealing with these desperate shortages now.

"They deserve to know someone is going to be there for them at a time when they need it the most.

"If the carers aren't there, the care isn't there.

"The consequences of this are far more costly than implementing our policy."

The question of the Twin Ovals track

The Twin Ovals track was referred to as a sloppy gravel mess at a recent Kingborough Council meeting.

Mr David Griggs said "This track is totally unusable with any rainfall".

"The track urgently needs a bitumen surface, with proper drainage on the topside of the track.

"I realise this is a funding issue, but it is a major public safety issue for Council".

Director of Governance, Recreation and Property Services Daniel Smee acknowledged that it would be desirable if the access path around the western side of the AFL ground at the Twin Ovals was finished in concrete or bitumen rather than gravel.

"This matter has been the subject of previous budget submissions and can be listed again for consideration in the 2024/25 capital works budget," Mr Smee said.

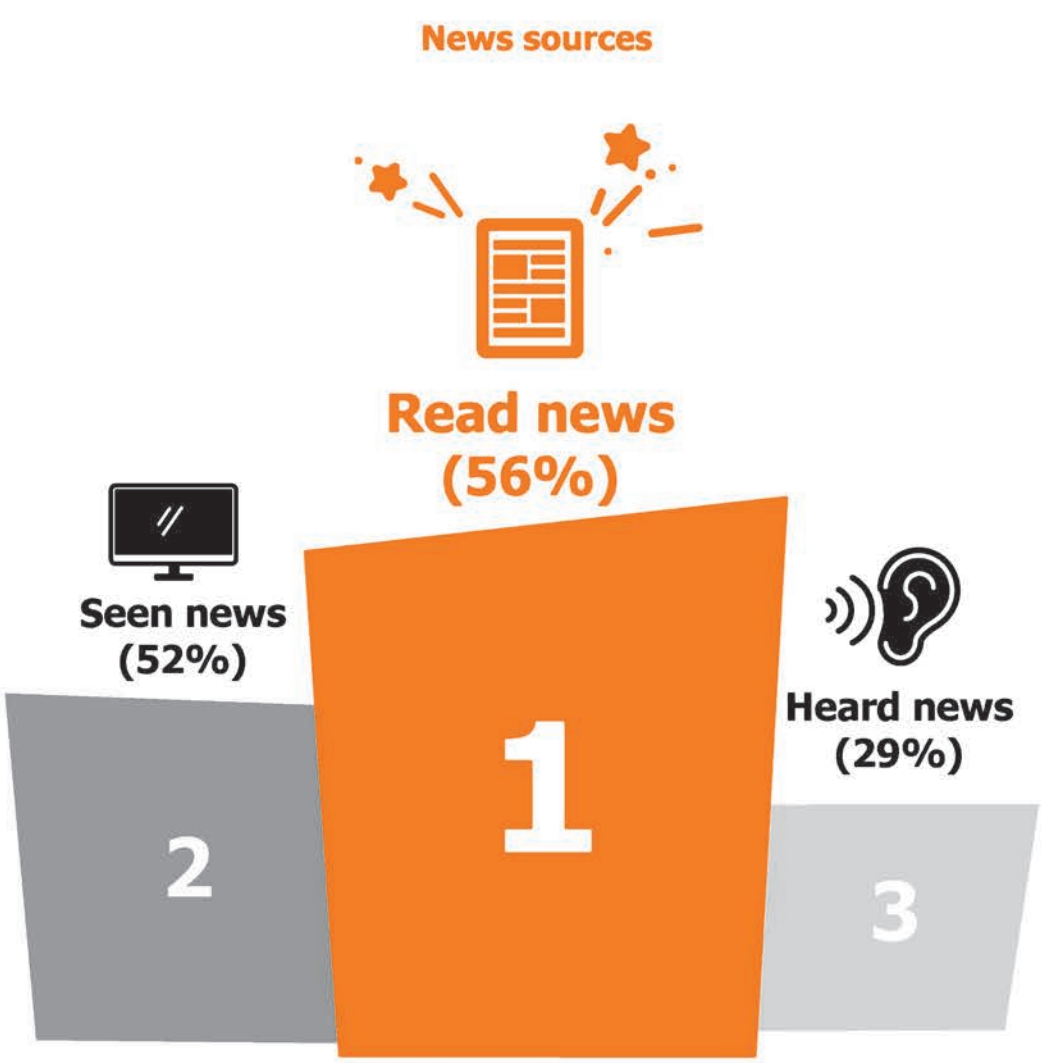

Kingston Gets its First Restaurant

THE 'Chef's Den', Kingston's first specialist restaurant, was officially opened on Tuesday, September 18th.

The restaurant, at the entrance to the Channel Court Shopping Centre, was officially opened by Warden Hodgman at a gala opening which was attended by almost one hundred guests.

Before declaring the restaurant open, Warden Hodgman said that for years Kingborough had needed a restaurant like the 'Chef's Den' and he praised the developers (Mr R. Doedens and Mr C. Overeem) for their courage and foresight.

The Warden indicated his confidence that the venture would attract support both from locals and tourists.

Mr R. Doedens, in thanking the Warden, stated that he was also pleased to be able to provide public toilets for the Shopping Centre. He went on to point out that this was the third official opening of major premises in the Channel Court Shopping Centre, recalling the earlier opening of Purity and the Channel Hardware Store.

Mr Doedens, in offering the Warden a gift of a massive bottle of whiskey, drew attention to the public's need to 'bring your own liquor.'

The restaurant will be managed by Silvana Aspradakis, a former airline hostess with Olympic Airlines of Greece.

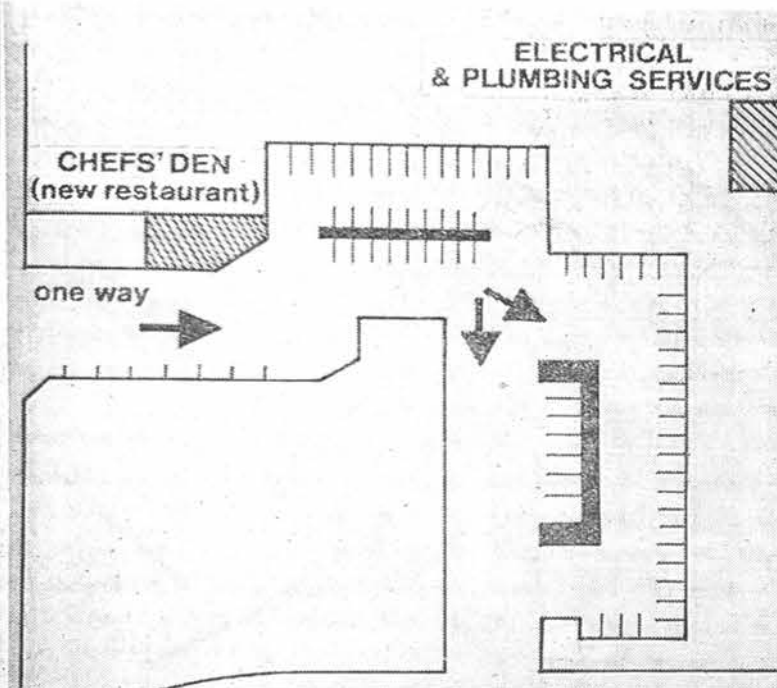
She confessed that, although the menu was designed for Australian palates, she has inserted on the menu a favourite dish of her own—'Pastitsio'.

The staff will be trained by specialist chef John Rainbird who is on loan from the 'Penny Farthing Restaurant' in Hobart, following his successful opening of the 'Medallion Restaurant.'

The 'Chef's Den' development is valued at \$32,000, including \$12,000 in fittings.

Hours of business are: Mon.-Wed., 9 a.m.-7.30 p.m.; Thursday, 9 a.m.-11 p.m.; Fri.-Sat., 9 a.m.-12.30 p.m.-1 a.m.

The restaurant, seating 70 people, has a petitioned off section for meetings of up to 35 in number and is dominated by a picture by local artist Bart Folkerts.
