Former City of Hobart Alderman Simon Behrakis has been confirmed to the seat.


Simon's family are well-known in Kingborough, being the previous owners and developers of Channel Court Shopping Centre.

Register for speed cameras

Kingston Police Inspector Colin Riley said he is frequently asked how to get a speed camera on a certain road to deal with speeding.

'The stationary speed cameras are not operated by Tasmania Police," Inspector Riley said.

"They are a service managed by the Department of State Growth

"Tasmania Police receives the data for the detected offences and then sends out the infringement notices to the registered owner.

"State Growth have a register for speed camera locations and a form that community members can complete to request a location.

"If members of the public have any specific locations for speed camera requests, I suggest they complete the form in the first instance.

Members of the community can recommend locations for speed cameras by filling out a form in the 'Camera locations' tab of speedcameras.tas.gov.au

Inspector Riley said he has provided this to a number of residents and has noted speed cameras have then been located at sites requested.

A speed camera was placed at the Sandfly Road intersection along the Huon Highway at the suggestion of community members.

"From a police perspective, with operational taskings permit, we do try and establish a police officer mobile presence interdict offending drivers, however, it is difficult to be everywhere all the time," Inspector Riley

"The cameras are a fantastic way to aid to shape positive driver behaviour."

Bypass for local highways

A new bypass is being constructed to ease the connection between the Channel and Huon highways.

The new road will start near the junction of Orchard Avenue and the Huon Highway and connect with Flood Road near the corner of Sale Street.

Roundabouts will be constructed at the Orchard Avenue and Huon Highway junction, and at the intersection with Sale Street and Knights Road.

The Huon Link Road will open to traffic in early 2025, once construction of the entire project, including upgrading Flood Road, is finished.

"The new link road will provide a more efficient route for traffic connecting between the Huon and Channel highways," Federal Assistant Minister for Infrastructure and Transport and Senator for Tasmania Carol Brown said.

"This vital project will improve traffic flow and enhance pedestrian safety in the Huonville town centre and provide traffic a reliable alternative route when part of the Channel Highway is flooded."

Federal Member for Franklin Julie Collins said "I was proud to previously commit to this project back in 2013 and it's great to see works finally getting underway."

Cultural burn local vineyard

Winemaker Dick Meure in Flowerpot partnered with James Shaw and the South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation (SETAC) team for a cultural burn at his vineyard and house.

Initially Mr Meure contacted the voluntary fire brigade for some backburning, but then thought of SETAC and approached them.

Mr Meure said they were very happy to do it.

"I thought a cultural burn was the way to go, and I'm very happy with what they've done," Mr Meure said. "They burn very sensitively.

"It doesn't damage the wildlife, and the smoke they use is white smoke, rather than the blue smoke."

Mr Meure reflected on the 2019-2020 bushfires which had a massive impact on the Channel region.

"Once the smoke gets on the grape there's nothing you can do," Mr Meure said.

"Every year Forestry Tasmania does burns and vineyards get ruined by smoke taint.

"Local wine growers want Forestry to know about this hazard to their business."

SETAC is providing cultural burns for many other properties around Kingborough and Hobart.

SNUG

Community meet to discuss road safety

Approximately 60 people attended a community meeting in Snug about road safety concerns recently.

The meeting was convened by Member for Franklin Dean Winter to discuss safety flashpoints along the Channel Highway and share ideas for improvements.

Common themes residents raised included speed limits, pedestrian safety and accessing public transport.

The Government's study into safety issues between Algona Road and Margate was released more than three years ago.

The report recommended lowering the speed limit from 90km/h to 80km/h on a stretch that includes the Howden Road intersection.

Mr Winter said that in Kettering and Snug, the locals have been pushing for lower speed limits but these concerns have been rejected.

"While some improvements require major changes, that does not apply to ensuring speed limits are appropriate," Mr Winter said.

Channel residents are also calling for safe pedestrian crossings along the highway, especially for accessing bus stops, local shops, and other services.

A particular worry for many is Margate, where a new shopping centre will bring in more traffic.

Kingborough Councillor Kaspar Deane told the meeting that safety measures required the Government to work together with the council and a master plan was to be developed for Margate.

Residents are currently campaigning for a shared path to be continued south of Snug, with many parents saying they feel cycling or walking to school is too dangerous for their children even though they live not far away.



Sports carnivals across Kingborough have been postponed due to the significant rainfall on Sunday, October 22. Several primary schools have postponed their sports carnivals including Snug Primary, Kingston Primary and Margate Primary. Most will take place this week. Parents are encouraged to check with schools to make sure their information is up to date. (PS)

Tree by-law public consultation

Public consultation is now open for the *Trees on Private Property By-Law* that will regulate the removal of important trees on private property in Kingborough where a planning permit is not required

Acting Mayor Clare Glade-Wright said that for 20 years, Kingborough Council has had a by-law to regulate tree removal on private property.

"This by-law has now expired and a new one has been drafted," Cr Glade-Wright said.

The by-law was first introduced to reflect the significance of the natural values in Kingborough and the

community's desire to protect these values. "Trees on private land play a significant part in our communities," Cr Glade-Wright said. "They provide food and shelter for wildlife, they capture and hold rainfall before it hits the ground, limit soil erosion, and reduce the impact of heat, wind, and

Kingborough is the only municipality in Tasmania where endangered forty-spotted pardalotes are found on private land.

Kingborough Council has created a Q and A document that explains how the proposed by-law will work and will assist the community in understanding and engaging with the consultation

Community engagement is a critical component used to review policies, strategies, and projects at Council. Public input into this consultation will be used to inform the *Trees on Private Property By-Law*.

Fire levy changes

Changes to the Fire Levy proposed in the new Fire and Emergency Services Bill could see significant increases for Kingborough residents and businesses.

Information released by the Local Government Association Tasmania (LGAT) showed that many residential properties in rural districts are seeing a doubling of the levy.

Commercial properties in Kingborough currently paying a fire service rate of \$17,000 would be increased to \$22,000

LGAT said that while work has been done over some years, many of the details in the bill have come as a complete surprise to local government, with no prior consultation on the implications for councils or their communities.

LGAT President and Break O'Day Council Mayor Mick Tucker said that councils are disappointed with the lack of consultation, particularly given councils play a significant role in responding to emergencies.

"These significant changes to the cost for many households have not previously been discussed with the community and now we have been given only five weeks to digest the options and provide feedback," Mayor Tucker "To make matters worse, there are a lot of details not contained in the new bill.

"This feels like a half-baked bill, that has been rushed

out after the Government has gone slow over the past six years."

The Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management Felix Ellis said there is no new levy being

proposed.

The Government is proposing to abolish one levy entire-

ly and reform the remaining two.

There are currently more than 29 different rates and multiple levies for households and businesses across

"The proposal will better equalise rates across the state to make it fair," Minister Ellis said.

"Some businesses have avoided paying the insurance levy by not taking out insurance or buying from an over-

"It is unfair and anti-competitive to only charge a fire levy to businesses that take out insurance when it is a service we all need and rely upon."

Minister Ellis said that multiple reviews, including a parliamentary committee, have recommended the proposed changes.

Parrots and wattlebirds are busy sorting out the red

flowering gums.

New Holland honeyeaters own the central part of the garden, with its many spring flowering plants.

Still, the crescent honeyeaters and yellow throats seem to survive, even prosper.

The native hens, or turbo-chooks, are making a tremendous racket.

They keep spotting two white-breasted sea eagles in that gum tree on the water's edge.

They don't like sea eagles because the eagles, don't just stick to a fish diet.

Thornbills dart through the lower shrubs.
