Stolen safety mirror

The safety mirror which I had spent time, effort and money on to install on the roadside wall at the end of my driveway that connects with busy Summerleas Road at Kingston between Channel Highway and Huon Highway has been removed.

The perpetrator(s) trespassed on my property and removed the mirror and frame, leaving behind one of the screws and its wall plug.

The safety mirror assisted me with visibility, so I had warning and time whilst going on the driveway which is steep and sharply U-turns, then continues running parallel to the road.

There is a safety mirror further along the road, high on a pole at the entry to the walking path, which has not been removed.

Please could the safety mirror be returned, as without it there is reduced safety and more risk of damage to objects and people, which I wouldn't want to happen.

Would the person(s) who removed the safety mirror want that to happen?

Man charged with burglary and stealing

Police have charged a 29-year-old man with several offences following burglaries in Hobart and Kingston.

Police will allege that around 1.15pm on Saturday, October 21 the same man unlawfully entered a shed at a residence in Kingston.

Police will also allege that prior to this on the evening of Friday, October 20 the man unlawfully entered a building on Macquarie Street and stole a significant amount of property including electronic items, 26

computers, iPhones, a significant quantity of specialist engineering equipment, tools, furniture, and a silver 2017 Volkswagen utility.

The 29-year-old man has been charged with a number of offences including burglary, stealing, trespass, breach of bail, drive while disqualified, threaten police, and resist police.

Police conducted a search at a Kingston property linked to the man and located a significant quantity of the stolen property.

You may see emergency responders wearing personal protective equipment such as high visibility clothing, on water and aviation activity at Dru Point, Margate



Bruny hard cheese a big winner

Bruny Island Cheese Co. has won a Super Gold Medal and Trophy for Best Australian Cheese for their Raw Milk C2 cheese at the World Cheese Awards.

The 35th World Cheese Awards, hosted in Norway, saw an impressive 4502 entries from 43 countries, with a panel of 264 experts from 38 nations determining the outcome.

Bruny Island Cheese Co.'s Raw Milk C2, the first raw milk cheese made in Australia, was judged as amongst the best-of-the-best hard cheeses in the world and then went on to become the trophy winner for Best Australian Cheese.

Nick Haddow established Bruny Island Cheese Co. after a decade of global exploration and collaboration with specialist cheesemakers and emphasises the importance of time-honoured methods in crafting and maturing cheese.

"For Bruny Island Raw Milk C2 to be named as one of the few Super Gold cheeses out of over 4500 entries is a real honour and once again shows that Tasmania's premium produce is the best in the world," Mr Haddow said.

"This was the first raw milk cheese to be approved for production in Australia back in 2009 which was the result of several years of hard work, lobbying and trialling.

"To have C2 recognised as one of the best in the world means a lot to me and my team.

"We are all feeling very proud that a cheese made from raw milk has been recognised on the world stage."

Head cheesemaker Luke Jackson said "Winning this award is recognition of all the hard work that our team puts in both at the farm and the cheesery".

"All of the team are incredibly excited for something we made with our own hands being recognised on an international stage."

Premier, Minister for Trade and Minister for Tourism and Hospitality Jeremy Rockliff said it's no secret that



Reviving Giants by Great Southern Reef Foundation and Southern Blast by Surfrider Foundation will be shown at Kingston Community Hub on Wednesday, November 15 at 6pm.

The Great Southern Reef Foundation developed Reviving Giants in partnership with Sea Forest and the Eaglehawk Dive Centre to inspire and educate people about Australia's kelp forests.

The ten-minute film, directed by marine biologist and filmmaker Stefan Andrews, dives into the mission to restore Tasmania's rapidly declining kelp forests.

It follows the life and work of Mick Baron and Karen Gowlett-Holmes, owners of the Eaglehawk Dive Centre, who have been front-line witnesses and activists to the massive destruction of the giant kelp forests

"Through Reviving Giants, I wanted to tell the story of Mick and Karen's tireless efforts to revive Tasmania's kelp forests while highlighting the urgent need for all of us to engage in protecting these precious ecosystems," Mr Andrews said.

Tasmania's kelp forests face the threat of extinction due to warming sea temperatures.

The film illuminates this underreported issue and serves as a rallying call to protect and rehabilitate these endangered ecosystems before it's too late.

The restoration efforts highlighted in this film are a collaborative initiative by the Institute for Marine and Antarctic Studies (IMAS), Sea Forest and Eaglehawk Dive Centre.

These organisations amalgamate innovative science, passion, and a deep understanding of giant kelp biology in their commitment to restoring these underwater forests. IMAS researcher and co-producer of Reviving Giants, Scott Bennett said "Community engagement is integral

to the foundation's objectives". "Through creating and sharing original visual content, we're bringing the Great Southern Reef into focus, building public awareness and fostering grassroots

involvement with temperate reefs. Southern Blast is a beautiful cinematic celebration of the wild landscapes, abundant marine ecosystems, and local communities that call the Southern Ocean coastlines home.

Featuring footage shot on location in Lutruwita (Tasmania), the film connects with local personalities, from surfers to crayfishers, sustainable ocean businesses, and traditional custodians.




