

Huntingfield spirit Point to Pinnacle

A team from Huntingfield's Overeem Whisky will participate in the Point to Pinnacle fundraiser by pushing a barrel of whisky weighing a total of 145 kilograms on Sunday, November 19.

Point to Pinnacle is a gruelling 21 kilometre half marathon with most competitors either running or walking from Wrest Point to the pinnacle of kunanyi/Mount Wellington.

This is the first time a barrel has been introduced to this event, and it represents part of the start of a three-year fundraising effort from Overeem.

"It will be great to be part of such a long-standing community event, to honour and celebrate the race's history and its exciting future," Overeem Whisky co-owner Jane Overeem said.

The first known race to the pinnacle dates back to 1903 when it was held in the middle of winter in six inches of snow.

It had 39 participants and was originally sponsored by the whisky company Watkins and Co.

Participants were rewarded with a glass of whisky at the pinnacle, before venturing back down the mountain.

"On race day last year we donated a 50 litre tawny port cask to celebrate the Point to Pinnacle's 30th anniversary in 2025, but this year this cask will embark on the race itself as the first-ever barrel of whisky to attempt to complete the Point to Pinnacle," Mrs Overeem said.

Kingston Beach traffic solutions

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said Kingborough Council would conduct community consultation on the proposed traffic management solutions designed to improve pedestrian safety in Kingston Beach.

"Many people have spoken to me about how difficult it can be for pedestrians to move around Kingston Beach safely," Cr Wriedt said.

"Through this community consultation we are aiming to raise awareness about the possible solutions to improve traffic calming and pedestrian movement.

"There are six proposals for Kingston Beach including a wombat crossing near the carpark and business centre on Beach Road as well as a wombat crossing near the toilets on Osborne Esplanade.

"A wombat crossing is a zebra crossing that is placed on a flat top road hump.

"Once we receive community feedback Council will consider the works in our upcoming budgetary process."

Community consultation is open until Tuesday, December 12.

"Upon maturation of this cask in 2025, bottles of the Point to Pinnacle Single Malt Whisky will be auctioned with 100 per cent of the proceeds going to charity,"

Overeem Whisky co-owner Jane Overeem said.

The barrel will be pushed up in 2023 and again in the 2024 Point to Pinnacle.

This year 55 runners will help push the barrel up the

mountain on November 19, joining over 3000 other competitors.

"We have around 2100 entries for the full half marathon from the Point to the Pinnacle, and around 1200 entered to run from the Point to the Pub," race organiser Tim Smith said.

"We expect that number to continue to grow to around 3500 competitors as last-minute runners decide they will tick the race off their bucket list this year.

"Across the field we have entries from every Australian state and territory, and global competitors flying in from Britain, Canada, the United States, Hong Kong and New Zealand.

"But it's Tasmanians who still make up the overwhelming majority of competitors willing to take on the mountain, with around one in every five competitors hailing from across Tassie."

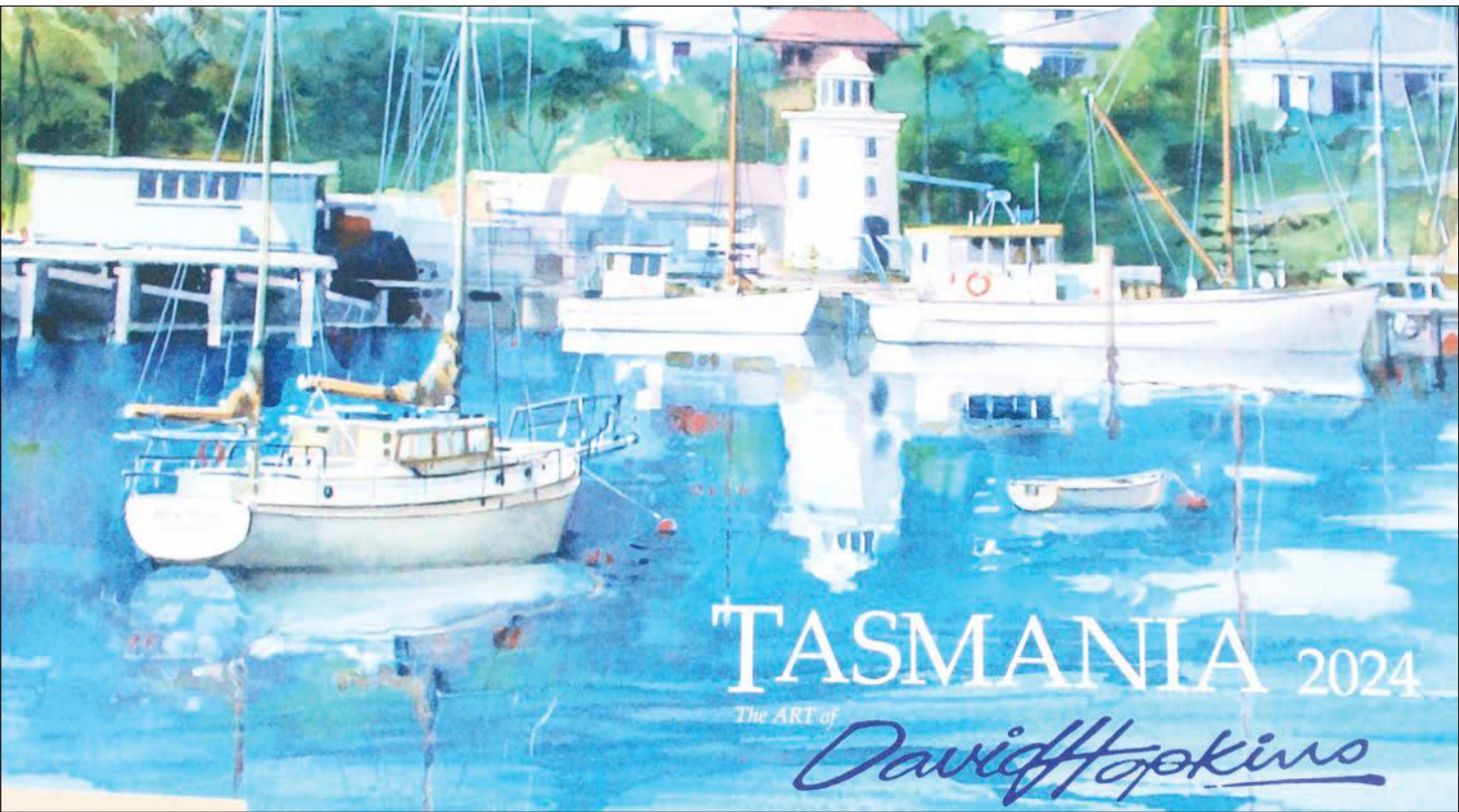

Local Lion paints a calendar for a cause

Lions Clubs across Tasmania are selling a 2024 calendar featuring iconic Tasmanian scenes reproduced from watercolours by well-known local artist, illustrator and author, David Hopkins.

David is a Past District Governor and a Lions Clubs International Life Member and has been a member of Lions Clubs for almost 50 years.

This project celebrates his achievements. Research into Parkinson's disease is close to

David's heart. His wife and close business partner for 50 years, Beverley, has been living with Parkinson's disease for the last 20 years. David has donated the art design, prepress, royalties and sales profits to improving the lives of those living with this debilitating disease. All proceeds from sales will be donated to research into Parkinson's disease in Tasmania at Menzies Institute for Medical Research.

Taroona skate breeding

The Taroona Institute of Marine and Antarctic Studies (IMAS) facilities are receiving \$2.1 million from the Tasmanian Government so they can begin captive breeding of the Maugean skate.

"We are well advanced with the necessary permits to allow skates to be collected by IMAS for the captive breeding population, led by some of the best and most experienced scientists in this field," Premier Jeremy Rockliff said.

"We are working closely with Salmon Tasmania, the companies operating in the harbour and the National Maugean Skate Recovery Team to develop a Conservation Action Plan that will guide our investment to minimise the impact on local communities and industries."

Neighbours of Fish Farming campaigner Jessica Coughlan said "The Maugean skate is an animal that has survived ice ages and mass extinction events, but it may not survive Tasmanian politicians".

"The science clearly shows the urgency of reducing salmon feedlots in the waterway to protect the final critical habitat for the skate for generations to come." "The captive breeding program is an insurance measure, but it won't ensure the survival of the species if the skate does not have a restored habitat to return to."

Minister for Environment and Climate Change Roger Janesch said "Our decisions about the skate must be underpinned by evidence-based science and considered advice, which is why our government is investing in targeted recovery measures".

"This funding will support immediate actions identified by the Recovery Team and the Conservation Action Plan.

"It will also support measuring, modelling and monitoring activities that will help inform decisions about how to sustain the aquaculture sector and the skate's survival in the wild."

Inquest into past tragedy

Late Blackmans Bay resident Helen Bird's apparent suicide of 2010 is being re-examined in a coronial inquest.

Helen Bird was tragically found deceased in a shed at the property she shared with husband Mark Bird.

Mr Bird is now being considered as a person of interest following inconsistencies in the evidence he gave at the time and because of his conviction history.

Mr Bird was convicted in 2020 of deliberately setting fire to a motor vehicle and his house sometime between 2007 and 2012, and setting fire to another house in Geeveston in 2017.

Mr Bird is due to give evidence this week.

Second urgent care clinic open

A new Medicare Urgent Care Clinic (Medicare UCC) has been opened in Hobart.

Ochre Medical Centre is the second Hobart Medicare UCC. The Medicare UCC is open for extended hours seven days a week, and offers walk-in care that is fully bulk billed.

Approximately 40 per cent of presentations to the Royal Hobart Hospital are for non-urgent or semi-urgent care.

This clinic joins two clinics already operational in Hobart and Launceston, and a clinic in Devonport which will open before the end of the year.

The two clinics that have been open only for a matter of weeks, Launceston and Hobart, have already seen over 3300 patients.

Across the country UCCs are reporting:

- Nearly a third of patients have been under 15 years of age
- Nearly a third of visits have taken place on weekends
- On weekdays, more than one in five visits have taken place after 6pm

"This clinic will ease pressure on the Royal Hobart Hospital, allowing them to concentrate on higher priority emergencies," said Australian Minister for Health and Aged Care Mark Butler.

Thoughts on rehabilitation

A letter to the Government and the legal system.

My name is Dr Colette Harmsen, I am a veterinarian, wildlife defender and peaceful forest protester, and I have just spent three months in jail at your expense for protecting Tasmania's native forests.

All my illegal activities are related to peaceful forest protesting and I conduct these activities because of my ongoing fear about the climate emergency and my love for wildlife, the national environment and wild places.

I wonder what kind of rehabilitation you, the legal and political systems that govern what we do and say, would suggest for me and my fellow environmental crusaders to prevent us from reoffending, given our fear of alarming climate change and our passion for the welfare of wildlife and protection of native forests.

Here are some ideas I thought you might consider implementing to prevent us from caring so much about the environment:

- Brainwash us to stop us from caring
- Tell us that climate change is not real
- Make money, capitalism and greed our only focus
- Make us believe that native forest logging does nothing to destroy endangered species habitat
- Explain to us how farming animals is good for the environment and that we must eat more meat
- Make us believe that fishing is sustainable and does not damage the environment
- Brainwash us into thinking that the only good forest is a 'working forest'
- Explain to us how farming, mining and forestry chemicals do not run into waterways and harm and kill fish and other wildlife
- Encourage us to fly in aeroplanes more frequently
- Show us that digging mines in environmentally sensitive areas is a good idea
- Tell us to watch more commercial, sensationalist, brainwashing television
- Teach us to be more apathetic, ignorant and selfish
- Show us how to shift the blame for our responsibilities and actions onto everyone else
- Make us angry at the state of things, but never angry enough to do anything about it
- Show us how we must do what our parents and their parents did, and that we have no choice but to make all the mistakes that generations have made before us
- Give us drugs to make us stop caring about anything other than our own self-interests
- Teach us how the environment is the enemy of jobs and growth and must be punished
- Teach us how the legal system is always right

Without the successful intervention of these methods, there is no way anybody I know is going to ever stop caring about the environment enough to conform to the legal system.

Tasmanian Seafoods in Margate and True South Seafood in Electrona were among 14 premium Tasmanian food and beverage producers showcased at the annual China International Import Expo in Shanghai last week.

This was the first time Tasmania had sent a delegation to this event, where products were on show to tens

Period poverty in Australia

The Queen's Guide award assesses character, creative thinking, community, commitment, collaboration and communication, and is the peak achievement in guiding.

As part of the community section, she has been working on advocating issues relevant to Girl Guides and women in the local community.

Ruby provided the following article for publication.

It's in the bag

Period poverty and stigma is an issue that is still present in society, even in the 21st century.

One in five Australian women experience period poverty, having to choose between buying food and period products, making do with paper towels in place of sanitary pads, or using a less suitable, lower quality brand of pads or tampons.

In many countries, sanitary items are taxed as 'luxuries,' and women who do not have access or the means necessary to procure these items must resort to unhygienic methods.

Poverty is not the only issue women face during their periods.

Despite changing times and a society that allows us to be more open on issues such as mental health and identity, the stigma around periods lingers.

Imagine how this impacts period poverty.

A woman on her period but without access to suitable products may feel as though she can't ask for help and may be too embarrassed to voice her struggles surrounding such a taboo topic.

Of course, there are organisations that can help.

Share the Dignity, Hey Girls Australia and Plan International Australia aim to lower period stigma and poverty.

As we head into the Christmas season, Share the Dignity's *It's in the Bag* appeal allows us all a simple, convenient method of giving much-needed sanitary products to Australian women struggling to afford necessities.

Simply fill a bag with items such as pads, tampons, soaps, deodorants, hairbrushes, toothpaste and toothbrushes, shampoo and conditioner, and take it to Bunnings Warehouse.

Donations opened on November 10.

Bruny Island loses all-terrain ambulance

It was announced recently that Bruny Island's all-terrain ambulance is no longer in service.

The all-wheel drive ambulance has been replaced with an urban vehicle.

Bruny Island Community Association President Tammy Price has raised the community's concerns about health services on the island with the State Government.

Local Bruny Island resident John Peterson shared his view on the issue.

"My honest opinion if the economics are there, I would prefer they keep the 4WD ambulance," John said.

"The services on Bruny have been very good, and I'm hopeful there is a contingency plan if there is an accident that requires 4WD access."

Many of the accidents occur in areas that require response from a four-wheel drive ambulance.

"It may also lead to the requirement of the rescue helicopter to access more remote areas if the 4WD is not available," John suggested.

Landcare Tasmanian information afternoon

Landcare Tasmania is hosting an information afternoon on Navigating Carbon and Biodiversity Markets on Saturday, November 25 from 12.30-4.30pm at the Huonville Town Hall.

There will be speakers from the federal Nature Repair Team (Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water), the Tasmanian Institute of Agriculture, Milford Farm, Tasmanian Land Conservancy and NRM South for presentations and questions.

The Australian Government is designing market mechanisms to encourage investment in carbon reduction and biodiversity.

The hope is that these markets will accelerate investment into addressing climate change and protecting and restoring Australia's rich biodiversity.

The markets are particularly valuable for land managers.

They may provide some economic return for good farm and land management practices and secondly, these good land management practices can lead to considerable co-benefits for biodiversity, productivity, efficiency and reduced carbon emissions.

Many farmers and land managers are trying to work

out how to be involved in these markets, how to register a project, who to turn to for advice and whether or not to sell the credits/certificates or whether to keep them to make their own farm carbon neutral and nature positive.

The Navigating Carbon and Biodiversity Markets event is funded by the Tasmanian Government through the Landcare Action Grants.

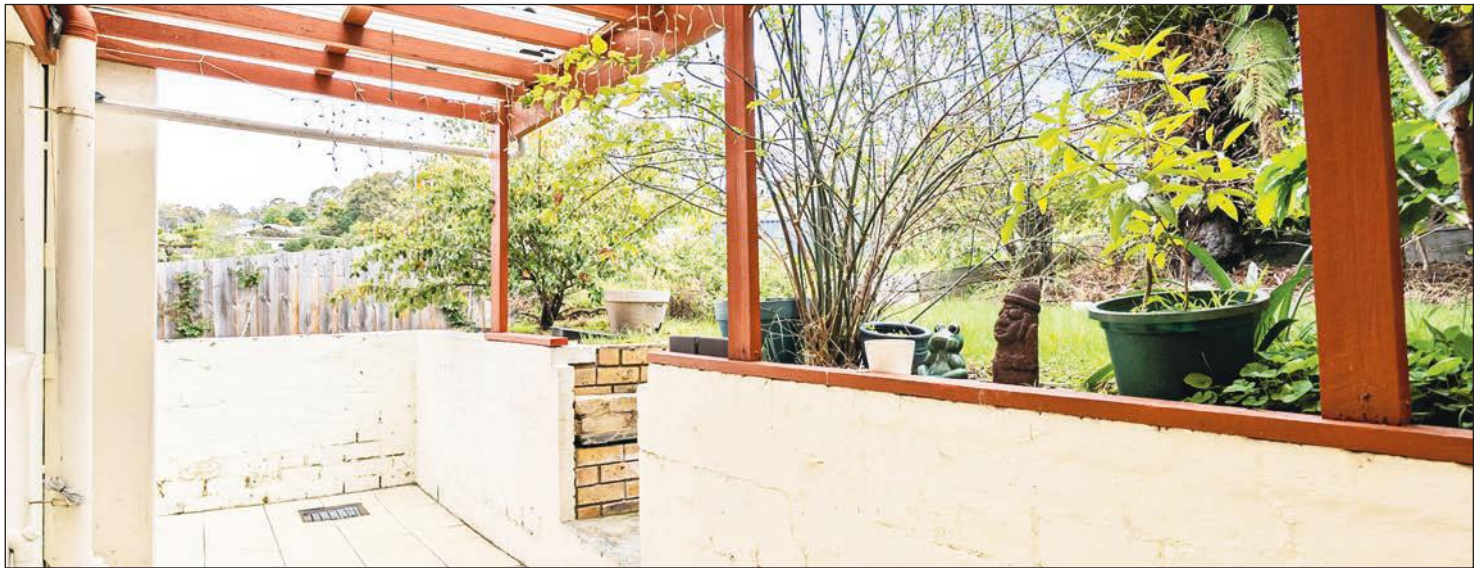

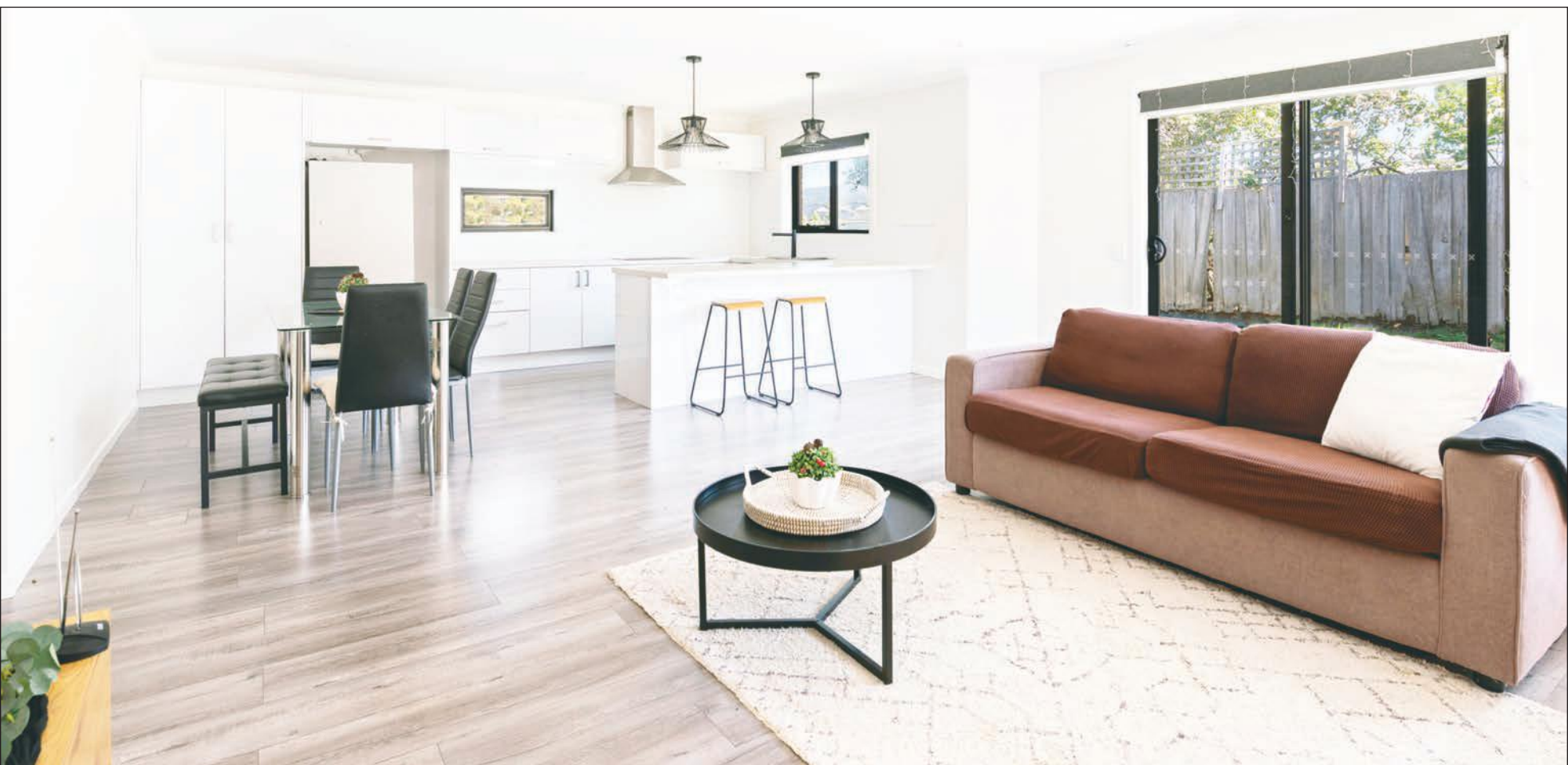

A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty six years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, Thursday, November 29, 1973.

Southern Outlet: 'HIGHWAY TO NOWHERE'

AN alleged statement by 'a Cabinet Minister' in which the Southern Outlet Road was described as 'Hobarts Highway to Nowhere' was the subject of strong objection by Esperance Council at its meeting on Wednesday, November 21st.

The story which appeared in the Sunday Examiner Express on November 3, was tabled by the Council Clerk (Mr C. J. Halton). It described the Outlet Road as 'a multi-million dollar extravaganza—a tribute to the political power of the apple growers of the Huon.'

The Huon was further described as 'a backwater, the centre of the declining apple industry', although it was admitted that the new road would be "a tonic to Huonville which, only 30 minutes from Hobart, will become an outer suburban area."

The public was further informed that a loop highway from Hobart through Cygnet and back up the Channel is under construction and almost completed—further evidence of the political power of the Huon.

The Tasmanian Apple Industry has always had the ear of the State Government and even in its twilight years it still has political pull.

However it was admitted, apparently on the credit side, that 'The Minister for Lands and Works (Mr Michael Barnard) is from Launceston and he at least is trying to redirect road spending to the Launceston area.'

Commenting on the article, Cr. D. Jackson said "The report is inaccurate and shows a woeful lack of research. Per head of population and of value of production the Huon has, in fact, been badly treated. This has been shown in figures tabled in Parliament and the accuracy of which has not been challenged."

Oddly enough, the extent to which lack of Federal political 'pull' has been responsible for

present problems in the apple industry was not mentioned in the article. Nor was there mention of the Huon's pre-dominance as supplier of whole milk and meat for Hobart, nor of its importance as a major timber producer and port.

Councillors felt that objection was justified. However it was obviously related to Launceston's own traffic density pressures.

Cr. J. L. Kile suggested that efforts be made to locate the Cabinet Minister allegedly responsible and that he be invited to discuss the matter. At the moment they did not know who he was nor the extent of his knowledge of the Huon.

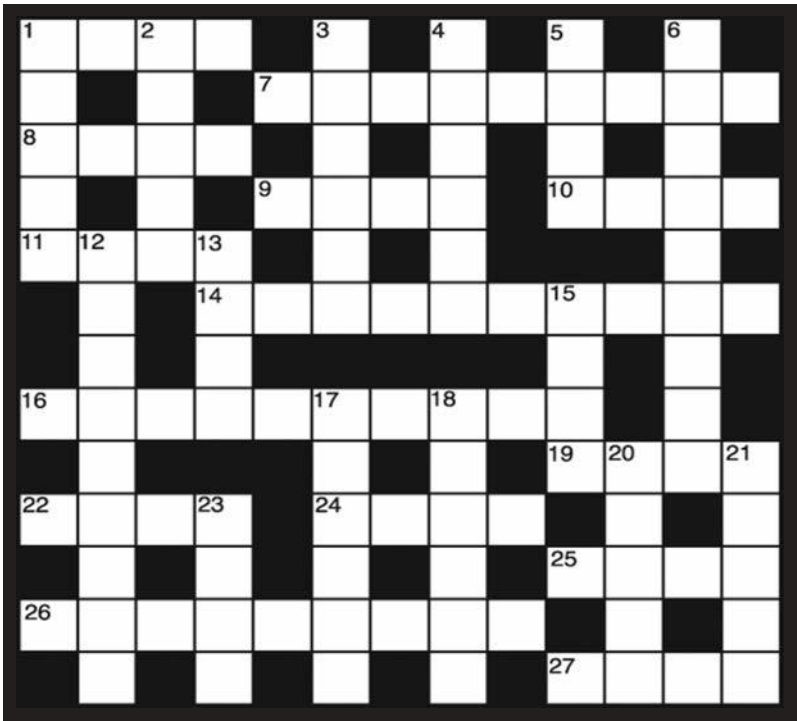
