Kingston Fire Brigade Kingston ferry proposed state championships

Kingston Fire Brigade triumphed at the State Firefighter Championships held in Launceston's Invermay Park recently.

A total of 27 teams competed in the senior and junior sections over two days.

Kingston Fire Brigade's juniors finished first place overall for the Junior State Aggregate Award.

Their seniors came third place for the Division 2 Aggregate, which meant with juniors and seniors combined Kingston Fire Brigade took out first place for the entire event with the State Aggregate Award.

Kingston Beach has been nominated as a potential new site for a ferry service.

The Tasmanian Government has identified six possible locations that have been released for public consultation in the River Derwent Ferry Service Masterplan.

Lindisfarne, Howrah, Wilkinsons Point, Sandy Bay and Regatta Point have also been nominated as the best places to add ferry services.

The masterplan proposes that a ferry service in Kingston Beach may help ease congestion along the Southern Outlet during peak traffic.

"Once finalised, the masterplan will guide the expansion of ferry sites and services on the river, mapping out where sites will be and what they

will look like," Premier Jeremy Rockliff said. "Careful analysis of 33 sites from New Norfolk

to Woodbridge to Nubeena has determined the locations of six new sites in addition to the existing Hobart and Bellerive locations.

"The proposal is based around an expansion of ferry services to be based initially on easing congestion between Hobart's eastern and western shores, before building connectivity along the river." The first ferry expansion proposes to provide

direct ferry links to Hobart from Lindisfarne. The next step of expansion would build

connections along the river, including between Sandy Bay and Kingston.

Feedback is open until Monday, January 8, 2024. Following consultation, more planning will be undertaken, including development of a more detailed timeline and a preferred next site for an expanded network.

TAROONA

Bike lane upgrade funded

The Taroona bike lane upgrade project has received \$350,000 under round one of the Better Active Transport in Tasmania grant program.

Seven other projects were funded under the program in Clarence, Devonport, George Town, Launceston, Northern Midlands, Southern Midlands and Waratah-Wvnvard.

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said \$15.5 million in direct investments has been made since 2015 to activate transport infrastructure project.

"These eight new projects will see almost \$6 million worth of cycling projects this financial year through this program alone," Minister Ferguson said. "We recognise the role that improving our active

transport infrastructure plays in shaping health, safety and well-being.'

Round two of the state-wide and Greater Hobart cycling infrastructure grant programs are now open and will close in January.



Kingborough mum wins **local hero for Tasmania**

Founder of Tassie Mums Clair Harris has won the 2024 Local Hero for Tasmania, part of the Australian of the Year Awards.

Clair hopes that through this award she can shine a light on childhood poverty in Australia, particularly in Tasmania.

Supporting children's charities like Tassie Mums can help support some of the state's most vulnerable children.

Tassie Mums began at Clair's kitchen table in Hobart in 2018 to help families with essentials. The charity now assists more than 1800 children a

year with clothing bundles, nappy packs, activity packs, prams and car seats.

Tassie Mums supplies items to 70 social service organisations across the state working with refugees and families escaping domestic violence or being affected by mental health issues and financial stress. Last year Tassie Mums' winter coat and pyjama drive collected more than 800 coats and vests and 600 pairs of pyjamas to ensure Tasmanian children are warm in winter.

The group also helps schools with new socks and underwear to distribute.

National Australia Day Council CEO Mark Fraser AO CVO congratulated the Tasmania recipients. "The award recipients for Tasmania remind us we

all have greatness within us," said Mark "They all share a sense of caring - for others, for

the way we see the world, for those in need, for culture and for better futures.

"They've all stepped up to become leaders because they care.'

The current Tassie Mum's campaign, Packs of Love, will run over the Christmas period and encourages the community to donate much-needed essential items to support Tassie kids.

TFS Acting Director of Community Fire Safety Chris Collins said it was important for people to be prepared for when a bushfire threatens their community, regardless of whether they choose to stay and defend their homes or leave early

"Understanding the risks of bushfire and taking steps to mitigate these risks is important for everyone, but especially those living in bushfire-prone areas," he said. "We want to make sure people are informed, prepared

and ready for when a bushfire threatens.' There are currently 139 community bushfire protection plans in place across Tasmania, with five new plans recently developed for the areas of Smithton, Ridgley, Irishtown and Edith Creek, Geilston Bay - Mornington and Primrose Sands.

Additionally, nine existing plans have been updated in the areas of Margate, Sandfly, Middleton, Rosebery, Lady Barron, Derwent Bridge, Nubeena, Molesworth and Cradle Valley



Super vs mortgage

It's the great Aussie debate - do I pay down my mortgage faster or make more super contributions? Both are sensible options that can help put you in good stead for a comfortable retirement.

But which is more financially beneficial and why? We generally see people rushing to pay down their mortgage and then find they try to shovel money into super later in life.

The argument for paying more off your mortgage has become stronger in recent times with increasing interest rates, however, you still might be better off financially in the long-term if you contribute more to your super. The following will discuss the differences between both options.

Firstly, let's look at the difference between personal marginal tax rates (MTR) and superannuation tax rates. Marginal tax rates vary from 0 per cent to 45 per cent (excluding Medicare), while pre-tax concessional contributions to super such as your employer's superannuation guarantee contributions (SGC) and salary sacrificing are generally taxed at a rate of 15 per cent.

Investment earnings inside super also attract a 15 per cent tax

Conversely, the savings you make on your mortgage do not attract any additional tax.

Secondly, the other variable to consider is the return on your money.

As of October 30, the average mortgage rate for a standard variable home loan was 6.32 per cent (CANSTAR, 2023)

On the other hand, the average return on a growth investment option in super was 9.2 per cent net of tax for the 2022/23 financial year (Chant West, 2023). When considering returns, we need to consider the

potential risks involved. By paying down your mortgage, you're guaranteed to

receive a saving equal to the rate on your mortgage. However, when investing in super, depending on how your money is invested your returns can fluctuate up and down and returns are never guaranteed.

EXAMPLE

Let's look at two basic hypothetical scenarios based on someone who earns \$80,000 per annum (MTR 34.5 per cent including Medicare), has a mortgage with an interest rate of 5.5 per cent and a super fund that provides a return of 7 per cent.

This person has received a \$10,000 bonus but isn't sure whether they should direct it to their mortgage or super. Which option would provide the best financial outcome after one year?

	Extra mortgage repayments	Salary Sacrifice into super
Gross amount	\$10,000	\$10,000
Net amount after tax	\$6,550 (\$10,000 – 34.5%)	\$8,500 (10,000 – 15%)
Income tax saved	Nil	\$1,950 (\$8,500 - \$6,550)
Potential savings/ earnings	\$360 (\$6,550 x 5.5%)	\$595 (\$8,500 x 7%)
Tax on savings/ earnings	Nil	\$89 (\$595 x 15%)
Net savings/ earnings	\$360	\$2,456 (\$1,950 + \$595 - \$89)

*All figures rounded

Using this example, investing the additional \$10,000 into their super instead of the mortgage provides a better financial outcome.

The sweet spot for making more pre-tax contributions to super instead of your mortgage would be for those who earn between \$45,000 and \$250,000.

If your income is less than \$45,000 per annum it might be difficult to find surplus cash to contribute and the tax benefits aren't as great.

Conversely, if your income is around \$250,000 per annum your annual \$27,500 concession contribution cap will start to fill up.

While investing more into super might be a good option, it is highly important that vou understand how your super is invested prior to making additional contributions.

Further consideration must be given to your situation including age, risk profile and liquidity needs.


