

Christmas for the community

The Kingborough Helping Hands Sharing Tree was officially opened at Channel Court, Kingston on Friday, November 24.

This marks the seventh year the Sharing Tree has been in operation here.

Craig Lucas from Kingborough Helping Hands (KHH) explained that the Sharing Tree was initiated by some St Aloysius Catholic College students writing to Kingborough Council seven years ago, requesting a giving tree be installed at Channel Court.

Kingborough Council agreed and the Sharing Tree has been placed here annually since.

The students were tasked to complete a persuasive writing assignment but seized the opportunity to make their schoolwork have a real impact on their local community instead.

Craig said 80 hampers were made in the first year of the Channel Court Sharing Tree but this year they anticipate up to 350 hampers will be made and over 2000 gifts given to community members in need.

Craig described himself as the 'delivery guy' of KHH, being responsible for the transportation of many of the hampers.

"I'm going to houses at the moment that have no food in the cupboards," Craig said.

"Your support is supporting them."

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt attended the opening to give a speech and cut the ribbon.

Cr Wriedt thanked Kingborough Helping Hands, especially President Edna Pennicott as the 'heart and soul' of the operation.

Cr Wriedt said she was grateful to be the Mayor of such a caring community, with piles of gifts already at the foot of the tree on the day of its opening.

The Sharing Tree has grown since then, from its first year yielding 80 hampers to Craig anticipating up to 350 hampers and over 2000 gifts this year.

Bruny joins sculpture trail

Dan Tucker and Derwent Valley's Evie Silver will have their sculptures join Kingborough's public sculpture trail.

Dan's piece 'Even or Odd' will be positioned at the Gordon Recreation Ground.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt, who announced the winners, said that the Sculpture Prize exhibits a variety of works by local artists and different stages of their careers.

North West Bay River trail

The new North West Bay River shared-use trail (Stage One) is now open.

The trail is designed for walkers, mountain bikers and horse riders but unlike the majority of tracks in Kingborough, it does not allow dogs to be taken on the trail.

The track has determined no dogs allowed due to the abundance of wildlife and the wishes of landholders. Access is from either the Huon Highway/Sandfly Road junction or Riverdale Road.

Walkers can also access the track from Sandfly Oval, but this is not an appropriate access for horse or bike riders.

Kingborough has more than 40 different tracks and trails throughout the community that cater for a variety

of track users.

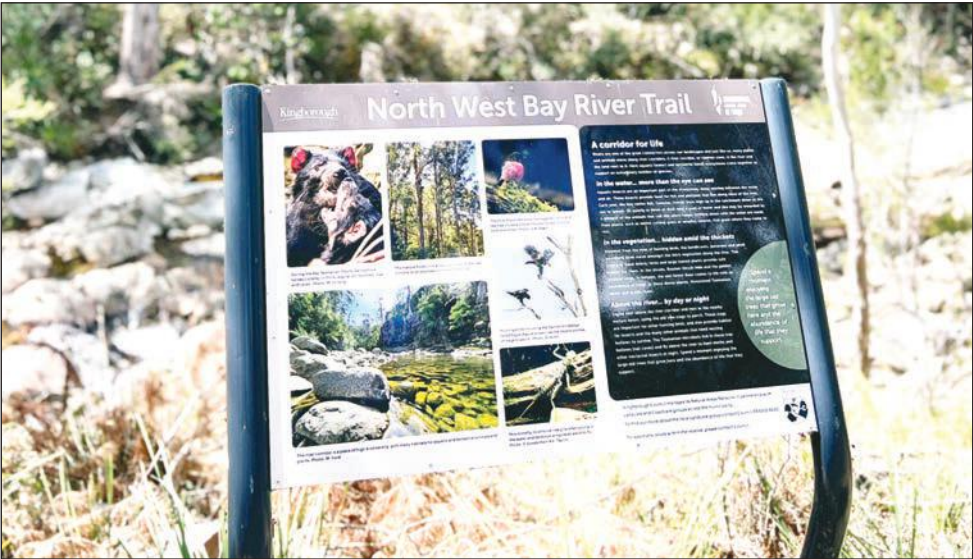
Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the beautiful 3.1 kilometre length of track along the North West Bay River was a great attraction for community members.

“There has been abundant positive feedback from the community regarding this trail,” Cr Wriedt said.

“The North West Bay River track is iconic and takes you to a number of waterholes with two river crossings over boulders and a new bridge over Cooke Rivulet.

“We would really like to thank the Trail Riders Action Club (TRAC) who have worked hard with Kingborough Council to get this first stage open for many years.

“Please be aware that this trail is not suitable for use after heavy rain and please follow shared used trail etiquette and enjoy.”

Marine pollution exercise in the Channel

On Thursday, November 16 the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and the Department of Natural Resources and Environment conducted a national emergency marine pollution exercise at Dru Point, Trial Bay, the D'Entrecasteaux Channel and North West Bay.

The boat ramp at Trial Bay was closed on November 15 and 16 while Dru Point boat ramp remained open.

This was a controlled exercise to practice responding to an emergency marine pollution incident.

All necessary steps were taken to make sure that there were no negative environmental impacts on the surrounding area or wildlife.

Exercise Thalassarche was named for the Shy Albatross, a Tasmanian endemic species listed as endangered under national law.

Each year the Australian Maritime Safety Authority joins with a host state or territory to practice implementing national oil spill response arrangements by simulating an oil spill scenario in a nominated area.

The exercise involved around 200 participants from across Australia, including those playing response roles plus expert exercise mentors, evaluators and safety and control personnel.

The participants practised the response to a significant oiled wildlife event involving setting up and staffing a wildlife hospital at Dru Point.

The EPA said that while the likelihood of a large marine pollution incident is low in Tasmania, the results can be catastrophic with impacts across the environment, human/social, economic, transport and infrastructure dimensions.

Therefore, it is critical to be prepared.

Tasmania last hosted a National Plan exercise in 2006 and has continued to invest in training staff from multiple agencies in oil spill response.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said that it was amazing to see all the organisations coming together for a very professional pollution exercise.

“We got to witness the incident teams in action and see what a real set-up would look like in a disaster situation,” she said.

“We also learnt that it takes around four litres of detergent to clean the oil of one large bird, like a pelican.

“Fortunately, the team had some very compliant toy pelican toys to practice on.”

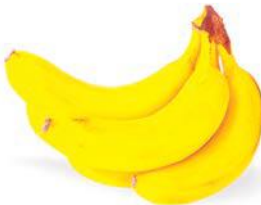

BeeTAS portal compulsory for beekeepers

The Kingston Bees community holds regular meetups, presents workshops on the art of beekeeping and has more than 600 followers on Facebook.

They and all other Tasmanian beekeepers are required to sign up to the new BeeTAS portal developed by the State Government.

Primary Industries and Water Minister Jo Palmer said the portal was developed to enhance the state's preparedness to manage hive health and respond to emergencies.

"To make beekeeper registration easier and help maintain important hive details, the new online beekeeper registration site is now live," Minister Palmer said.

"BeeTAS operates as an online user portal where beekeepers can register, maintain their hive and apiary site information, record inspection details, hive purchas-

es and disposals and upload training certification and lab results."

The data available through BeeTAS will allow the quick identification of beekeepers affected by pest detection and can distribute information to them to allow for an efficient response.

The BeeTAS website will also help increase Biosecurity Tasmania's ability to act swiftly during incursions or emergency responses.

Beekeepers who have registered in Tasmania since December 2022 will have their information automatically carried across to the BeeTAS online portal.

Beekeepers have been contacted and will continue to be contacted with information on how to access BeeTAS and log in.

Registration is compulsory and free of charge.

Film night for oceans

Scientists, divers, surfers and fishers were joined by 200 members of the Tasmanian public for a film night in Kingston recently.

Deputy Mayor Clare Glade-Wright and Councillor Amanda Midgeley were also in attendance.

The films celebrated our unique coastal backyard and shone a spotlight on the threats they currently face including from seismic blasting and marine heatwaves.

The large crowd gathered at Kingborough Community Hub in Kingston to watch *Reviving Giants* by Great Southern Reef Foundation about reviving giant kelp forests, and *Southern Blast* by Surfrider Foundation about the impacts of seismic blasting.

A panel discussion with questions from the audience ensued with Dr Scott Bennett from the Great Southern Reef Foundation and marine scientist Ethan Turner from the Surfrider Foundation.

The attendees cheered to rallying cries to 'Rise up for

Tasmania's oceans'.

"The incredible turnout in Kingston shows there is a huge amount of concern for our ocean environment and an appetite for change from our state and federal governments," said organiser and Environment Tasmania's marine campaigner Rebecca Howarth.

"The federal South East Marine Park Network review is a great opportunity to upgrade our offshore marine parks and lock out seismic blasting."

IMAS researcher and Great Southern Reef Foundation co-founder Scott Bennett said that community engagement is integral to the Great Southern Reef Foundation's objectives.

"Through creating and sharing original visual content, we're bringing the Great Southern Reef into focus, building public awareness and fostering grassroots involvement with temperate reefs," said Scott.

Open spaces funding

Kingborough is one of fifteen councils that will share \$2.9 million in funding through Round One of the Open Spaces Grants Program.

Funded projects include community sporting facilities, playgrounds, public barbecues, toilets, walking and cycling paths and skate parks.

Applications were assessed by a panel comprising representatives from the Local Government Association of Tasmania (LGAT), the Department of Premier and Cabinet and the Department of Health.

Minister for Local Government Nic Street said enabling Tasmanians to be connected, active and healthy in their local communities is something he passionately supports.

"Open spaces are really important to Tasmanian communities - these are places to exercise, gather, socialise and take part in community activities," Minister Street said.

"The program was established to support councils in their delivery of infrastructure that encourages local active

living and less structured or informal recreation pursuits.

"Councils across Tasmania provide much of the essential and well-utilised infrastructure that keeps our communities healthy, active, and connected and I am a proud supporter of their work to do so."

LGAT President Mick Tucker said that these grants support councils to enrich the lives of their residents.

"Communities and councils in all regions of the state will benefit," Mr Tucker said.

"Leveraging council co-funding, projects will deliver more than \$5 million in total infrastructure investment to support healthy and active communities.

"This is a fantastic result for successful councils and their local communities."

All councils, including those unsuccessful in Round One, are encouraged to apply for Round Two which will open in the coming months and provide a further \$2 million in funding.

Australian Antarctic Division tradies get surgical up-skill

A group of tradespeople wintering with Australia's Antarctica Program next year have completed two weeks of medical training to help the station doctor if there is an emergency when the research stations are isolated from the outside world.

Three carpenters, an electrician, two Bureau of Meteorology observers and two station supply officers completed the lay surgical assistant (LSA) training at the Royal Hobart Hospital recently.

The training culminates in a mock surgery, where a dummy patient has their appendix removed by the station doctor with the help of the lay anaesthetic and surgical assistants.

"This is the most likely operation under general anaesthetic the teams are to perform while in Antarctica," anaesthetist and LSA trainer Dr Jenny Fife said.

"Our doctors have their appendixes removed before they go down but if any of the other staff on the stations develop appendicitis, the team led by the doctor would be expected to do surgery to treat that."

Dr Fife said the scenario was staged to be as close to real life as possible.

"We use the same equipment and anaesthetic machines and surgical setup as the team have in the

medical facility down south," she said.

"Obviously, we've used a dummy rather than a real patient and the appendix was actually a gummy worm but they use sterile techniques, they scrub up and they inject real drugs in the patient."

Rochelle Clayton is heading to Subantarctic Macquarie Island as a Bureau weather observer but is now also trained as a lay anaesthetic assistant.

"It's something I'm really interested in," she said.

"My sister is a doctor so I hear a lot about her day at work."

"I don't think I have the ability to give a whole lifetime to being a doctor but this gave me the chance to experience a bit of it."

"During our training, we've seen brain surgery and dislocated legs, we've seen women give birth."

"It's given me a real understanding about why certain decisions are made."

Macquarie Island doctor Pat Campbell said she was very pleased with how the operation went and was confident her LSAs had the skills to help if required.

"It's been amazing to see them progress from never having laid hands on a patient to assisting with a full mock operation; they've taken it all in their stride," she said.

Development application lodged for irrigation scheme

The South Arm Irrigation Scheme has lodged a development application with Kingborough Council to build a recycled water treatment plant.

The \$6 million plant is to be built directly behind the existing TasWater treatment plant and will take one-third of the wastewater from the TasWater facility.

Rather than discharging it directly into the Derwent River, the new plant will further treat it to Class A standard, making it suitable for uses such as irrigation and fire-fighting.

The South Arm Irrigation Scheme is owned by Tasmanian company Mary Ann's Island Pty Ltd.

Mary Ann's Island Pty Ltd CEO Mary Massina said that once completed, the water will be piped to South Arm bringing water certainty to the notoriously dry peninsula for the first time in its history and turbocharging the local agriculture sector.

"Additionally, the scheme will provide irrigation water

to Arm End at Gellibrand Point Golf Course, ensuring it can be developed to its full potential without impinging on local water supplies," Ms Massina said.

"All up, in conjunction with the roll-out of the irrigation pipe itself, the projects are expected to create 150 direct and indirect jobs during construction and at least 100 jobs after construction through increased economic development due to water certainty."

The recycled water treatment plant is currently being tested ahead of being shipped to Hobart early in the new year, subject to development approval by Kingborough Council.

Practical completion of the scheme is expected to be mid 2024.

The total construction cost of the South Arm Irrigation Scheme is estimated to be \$17 million with \$5 million supplied by the previous Federal Government.

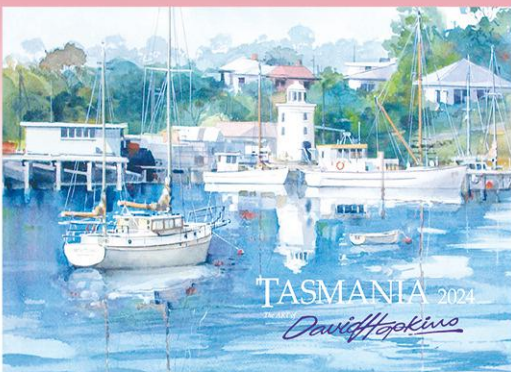

Night works originally advertised as taking place Tuesday, November 21 in the Kingston CBD have been rescheduled.

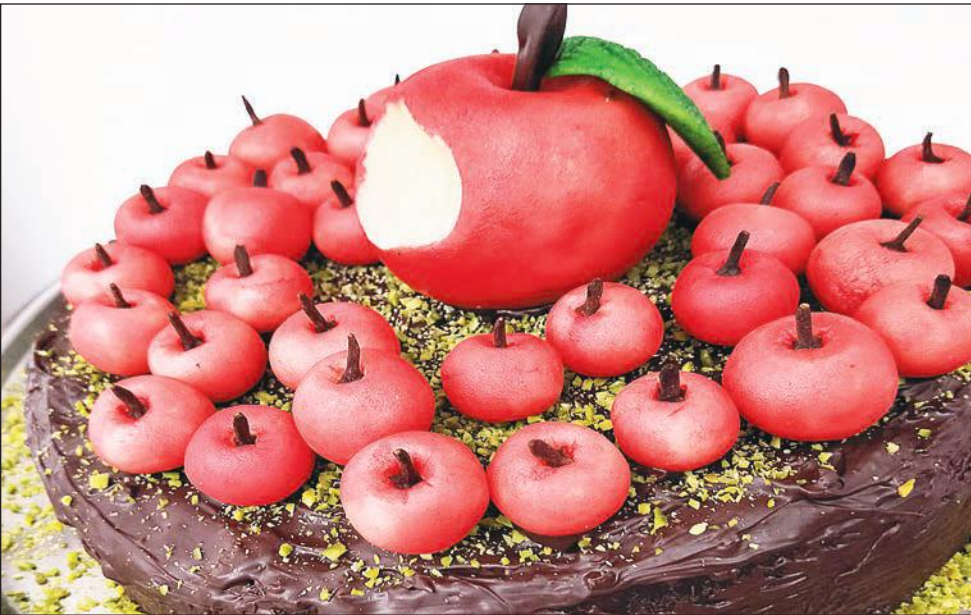

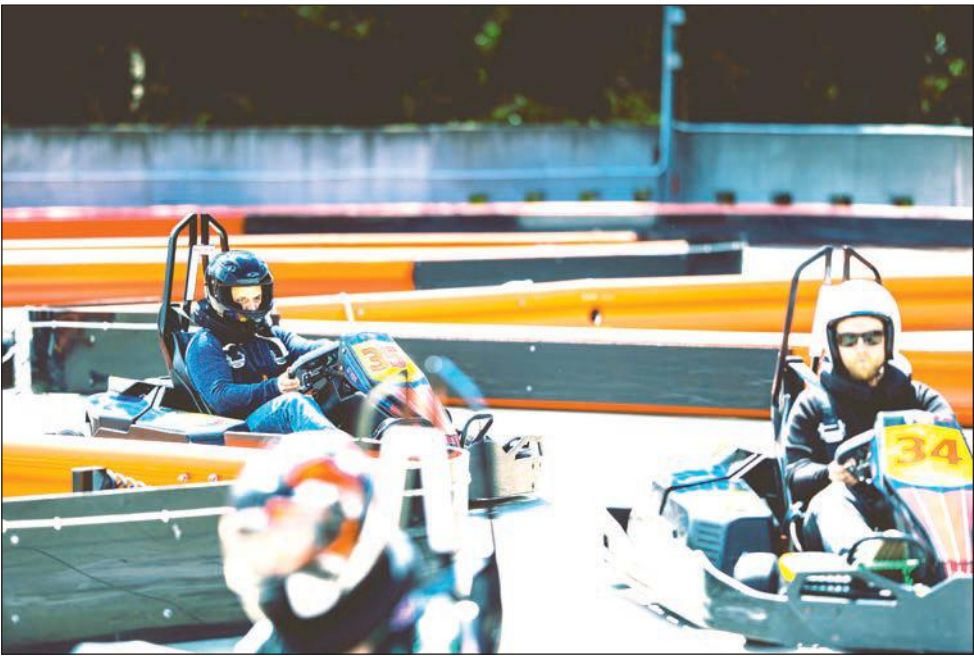

Lane Closures on Southern Outlet at Dynnryne

The Department of State Growth will be demolishing three properties on Dynnryne Road, Dynnryne, to ensure construction works for the Southern Outlet Transit Lane can commence as planned.

The new Southern Outlet Transit Lane will operate Hobart-bound between Olinda Grove and Macquarie Street. The 'T3' transit lane will be used by buses, private vehicles carrying three or more people, taxis, motorbikes, and emergency service vehicles.

Demolition of three properties has started and is expected to be finished by 20 December 2023. The bulk of the demolition will happen between 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and will not affect Southern Outlet traffic.

There will be some noise and dust, but we will ensure impacts are minimised as much as possible.

A 400-metre section of the left hand, Hobart-bound lane on the Southern Outlet (closest to Dynnryne Road) will be closed on the following dates and times:

Thursday 23 November 2023, 6.30pm - 8.00pm
Thursday 30 November 2023, 6.30pm - 8.00pm
Monday 4 December 2023, 6.30pm - 8.00pm.

There will also be a reduced speed limit in place. Road users should allow about 10 minutes extra travel time. Please keep to the posted speed limits and obey traffic management signs.

The closures are to ensure the safety of road users while three properties between the Outlet and Dynnryne Road are demolished in preparation for construction of the Southern Outlet Transit Lane.

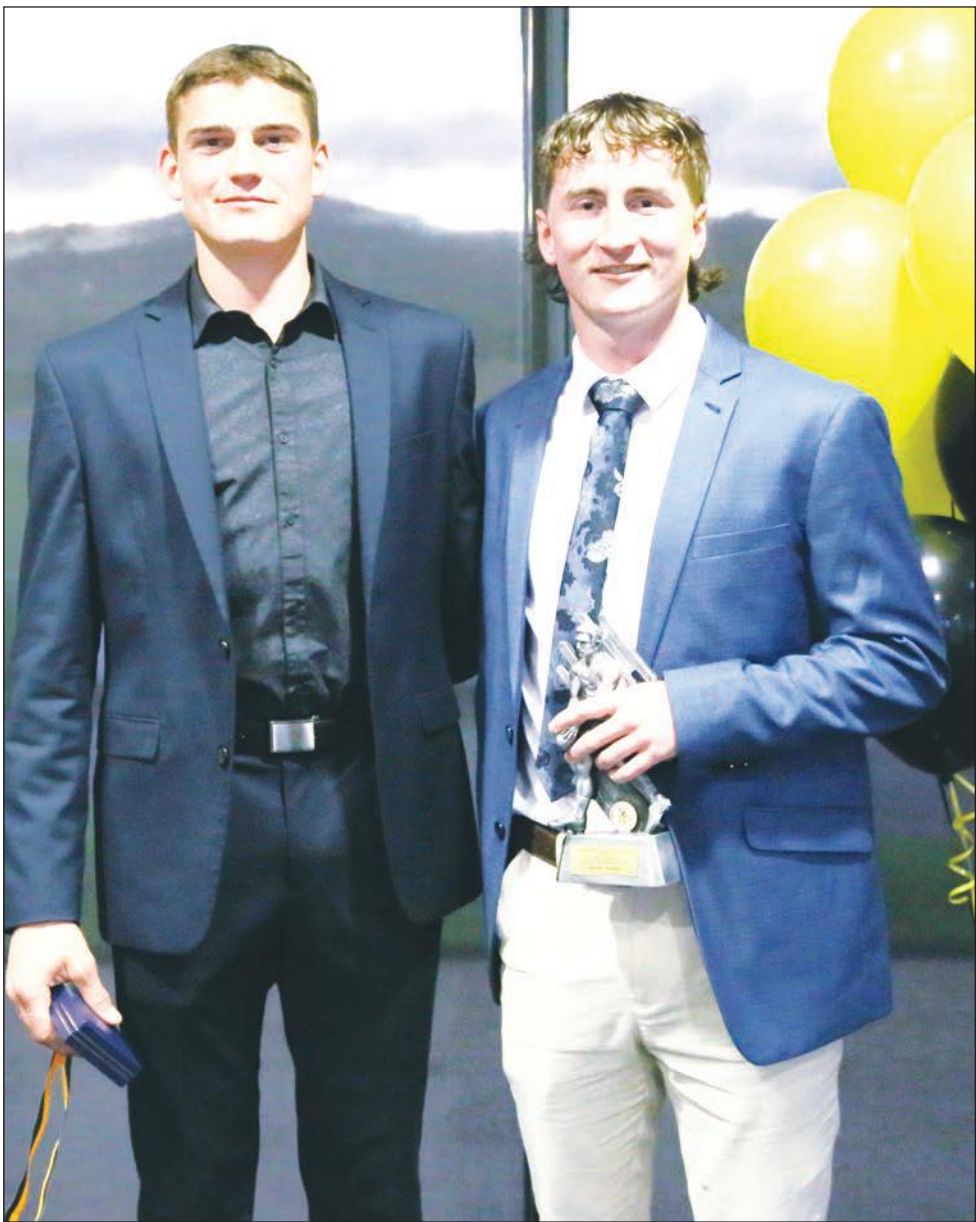
