Mural, mural on the wall

Blackmans Bay Primary School will be receiving a makeover with a \$3000 community grant to create an extensive mural.

The mural will cover a large, blank wall space spanning two classrooms that overlooks the school's courts and is visible to anyone who walks through the school grounds to or from the Opal Drive car park.

Jamin Kluss has been commissioned to paint the mural.

Jamin said he is excited to create a sense of play, transforming the dull, grey wall into a vibrant and colourful space.

The mural will see large scale depictions of some local birds, such as the swift parrot, the forty-spotted pardalote and the yellow-tailed black cockatoos.

The project will also combine whole school learning activities focused on sharing art skills delivered by Jamin and ecology and habitat conversations delivered by Kingborough Council's Natural Areas Interpretation Officer, Bridget Jupe.

The school community is still seeking donations to get this major project off the ground, and they have a GoFundMe page currently taking donations.

Bruny Island marathon

The Bruny Island Ultra was held on Saturday, December 2 with a range of teams and solo competitors.

The course is a total of 64 kilometres, starting at the Dennes Point picnic area and moving down south to end at the Cloudy Bay Lighthouse.

Competitors can either tackle the 64 kilometres

This is most evident by one of the photos featuring a Santa who miraculously has six fingers on his hand. This particular poster seems to have been removed

since I made note of it on their Facebook page. However, there is another set of images which also contain oddities.

A Santa with four fingers, holding a child who doesn't appear to have any legs, sitting on a couch that miraculously changes style from behind.

There is also a Santa holding a greyhound, and in the background lies the skin suit of a previous Santa. Every one of these images has been created using

some form of Al image generator. The "creator" of these images gives a prompt to one of the many AI image models out there.

The generator then spits out images based on the prompt given.

In this case, perhaps the prompts were "Santa riding in a car full of presents" or "Christmas photo of Santa and a dog.' This is innocuous enough, however, the method by which the AI creates these images is through data scraping, where it pulls data from millions and millions of files uploaded online and uses the data from those images to create whatever you ask it for.

The problem is that this data scraping is done without consent for those whose work it trains on, and is often categorized by individuals in third world countries paid absolutely trivial amounts of money, and uses a huge amount of processing power to run.

While an individual can utilise these tools for personal use, they often have rules when used in a commercial



Kingborough Council endorsed the updated Dog Management Policy at their December 4 meeting. Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the policy regulated the control of dogs in public spaces, determined where the locations for off-lead exercise areas were and outlined declared areas.

"Council ran a very successful public consultation on the proposed changes to the Dog Management Policy," Cr Wriedt said.

"The consultation attracted over 1100 responses from community members, 61 per cent of which were dog owners who shared their thoughts and views on the various proposed changes

"The consultation asked if the community wanted to see new off-lead dog exercise areas added to the southern ends of Snug and Blackmans Bay beaches.

"There was a positive response from the community to the Snug Beach south proposal, with 66 per cent of participants supporting the inclusion of an additional off-lead area

"Accordingly, Council has agreed to formally declare this an as an off-lead dog exercise area.

"However, Council has agreed to keep the southern end of Blackmans Bay Beach restricted from dogs at all times, with 56 per cent of respondents opposed to the idea and written submissions raising valid concerns in relation to the proposal.'

Celebrating accessibility

New accessible beach matting was launched at Kingston Beach as part of the celebrations for International Day of People with Disability on Sunday, December 3.

The matting will be rolled out each weekend and on public holidays from December to March by the Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club volunteers and will be available from approximately 12pm until 4.30pm on these days.

The matting will go on a national register linking everyone investigating accessible sites to Kingston Beach. The beach matting is a capital works project from Kingborough Council costing

\$10,000. The Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club also received grants for two beach

wheelchairs that are now available for public use. Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said it was great to celebrate this special day by improving access to the beautiful Kingston Beach.

"Council understands that people living with disability or with limited mobility should have equitable and easy access to services and facilities," Cr Wriedt said. "The matting will enable wheelchair users' better mobility on the beach with the option to reach the sea depending on the tide.

"Council would like to thank the volunteers of Kingston Beach Life Saving Club for assisting with this community service."

Cr Wriedt is also Chair of Kingborough Council's Disability Inclusion and Access Advisory Committee.

"I would like to thank all the members of the committee for their drive and support during this process, as well as our council staff who worked on finding the best way to make this happen," Cr Wriedt said.

"Kingston Beach is our most popular beach in Kingborough, and this beach matting will ensure equitable access to all residents."

Kingborough is the second council in the state, behind Sorrel, to install beach matting.



Local nurse to join the Mercy Ship

Kingston Beach local Phoebe McIntyre will join a Mercy Ship mission to Sierra Leone for two weeks at the end of February.

She will be taking leave from her current role as a registered nurse in operating theatres at the Royal Hobart Hospital for the trip.

Mercy Ships deliver a total healthcare program to some of the world's poorest people.

Specially fitted-out hospital ships are manned by a full team of medical staff, backed up by a crew of technicians and organisational volunteers that keep them running smoothly.

This will be Phoebe's second trip with Mercy Ships. In 2019 she spent two weeks in Senegal.

Volunteers with Mercy Ships pay all their own expenses, so Phoebe is fundraising the cost of her flight and incidental expenses.



Kingston Neighbourhood House received \$4600 for a community project teaching participants how to grow and eat from their garden.

They are one of 37 organisations to receive funding under the latest round of the Healthy Tasmania Step Forward Grants program.

Step Forward grants provide up to \$5000 for a wide range of activities and equipment that support health and well-being, such as equipment and training.

Other recipients included Cygnet Community Children's Centre and the Huonville Lions Football Club.

Minister for Health Guy Barnett said the grants will help improve the health and wellbeing of all Tasmanians.

"Preventive health initiatives such as this are vitally important as they not only help Tasmanians live healthy and active lives but also reduce the pressure on our health system in the long term," Minister Barnett said.







The Beach Watch program launched at the beginning of December includes eight sites in Kingborough between Taroona and Blackmans Bay.

The Beach Watch, coordinated by the Derwent Estuary Program (DEP), enables our community and visitors to the region to find a healthy beach with confidence every summer through its active monitoring, sampling and reporting of recreational water quality.

As part of the Beach Watch this year, daily water quality predictions will be provided for monitored sites around the estuary

Predictions are based on rainfall and information from partners like TasWater and local councils on overflows or system damage.

These predictions will not replace regular testing, which will be carried out every Tuesday.

"Every week over summer, water samples are collected from more than 38 sites in the Derwent to test for enterococci, a faecal indicator bacterium," said Derwent Estuary Program chief executive Ursula Taylor.

"The results demonstrate which beaches are suitable for swimming and where contamination sources may impact water quality

"We publish the results at the end of every week on our DEP Beach Watch webpage and Facebook site so community members can make informed decisions about where they enjoy recreational water activities."

Three sites between Kingston Beach and Blackmans Bay have an N/A rating on the website.

This means that the sites do not have the minimum five years of data available, however that information will be available next year.

The program is a voluntary partnership with 15 local organisations, including councils, who provide financial and in-kind support.

Ms Taylor said the partnership has been incredibly successful and the Kingborough Council has done a lot of work investigating the stormwater system and making repairs.

In the past year over 60 stormwater network issues have been resolved in Clarence and Kingborough municipalities. Ms Taylor encourages people to follow the DEP for more

advice and information about the healthiest beaches to enjoy across the Derwent and to have a safe and happy summer season.

The Beach Watch will run until the end of March.



Paul of Sacred Heart Convent, New Town, who taught at Franklin in 1909 and recalls many pupils and anecdotes. One such 'story' being that when Fr. Jim Ryan One such 'story' being that when Fr. Jim Ryan was being welcomed at the School, a pig ran into the room, causing a great uproar amongst the children.

Records show that a meeting was called on February 12th, 1933, to inaugurate a Parents and Friends Association. Parents were very en-thusiastic with many past pupils, now par-ents and friends, being elected. The first Presi-dent was Fr. W. Fitz-

patrick, Sec. Mr F. Dooley, and Treasurer Mr D. Ryan. Past admission re-cords show a low roll call of 26 children in April, 1934, and a record high of 78 in 1961. The gradual decline in vocations and the economic position of the Huon and the conding of Catholic families has forced the closure of the School, but the children will not be denied a Catholic Education, as there will be a bus to convey them to the School at Geeves-ton. ton

ton. The Parish is holding a Thanksgiving Mass, concelebrated by Arch-bishop Young, the pre-sent Parish Priest (Fr. P. McAnany) and many past priests on Wednes-day, December 19th at 7 p.m. All past pupils and friends are invited back to help celebrate this Mass. Afterwards there will be a supper in the School Room for all.
