Coles Kingston checkout changes

Coles Kingston has made some changes to their store layout, to the consternation of some local shoppers.

A community member reached out to the Kingborough Chronicle with their thoughts.

"I was informed by a supervisor that the express lane register that remains there is only for cigarette sales,"

"Consequently, because I won't use self-service

machines I, amongst many other frustrated people, am stuck behind trolley loads of groceries with three or so items in our basket at what minimal registers they now

"Their aim, in my opinion, is to force us to use these

"If people stopped using them and instead lined up at a checkout, they would have to open more registers.

It is not pleasant what Sue Carlyon saw and experienced.

Yet I argue it is too simplistic to attribute such events to the offenders' "...drug, alcohol ... spiritually lost" status. We all rely on police officers to keep basic order and protect us when necessary.

Police and most frontline emergency responders can't all be expected to be highly competent psychologists or sociologists - yet they are frequently thrust into situations where those skills are urgently required.

Increasing social inequity, especially with housing, as well as not-so-easily evident histories of abuse or other impediments in many young people's lives are contributing factors, which can lead to very bad behaviour.

Poorly managed mental illness and the more destructive oppositional aspects of 'social media' don't help either.

When we encounter strange-looking individuals or experience unpleasantness in public, citizens should try to be calm and to not be obviously judgemental. Confronting and disagreeable situations can frequent-

ly be alleviated either by showing tolerance and empathy or, when safe, just ignoring them.





Are you bushfire-ready?

It is not too late to prepare for bushfires.

There are a few simple steps you can take to protect yourself, your family and your property.

Doing your bushfire plan can take as little as five ninutes.

Complete a bushfire plan online at www.fire.tas.gov.au or pick up a paper copy from the Kingborough Council office. Remember that during a bushfire, you may lose phone and internet connection.

If the power goes out, you won't be able to use electric gates, electric pumps and phone chargers.

Listen to your ABC Radio station for up-to-date emergency information on 936 AM.

Burning embers can travel great distances ahead of a fire front and high winds, and falling trees and smoke can make driving dangerous.

Leaving early is always the safest option.

If you are in a high-risk area, near bushland or grassland, that may mean leaving before there are tangible signs of fire.

Stay informed and monitor conditions during the bush-

fire season to help you decide the best course of action.

Monitor TASALERT for emergency services updates and
the Bureau of Meteorology for the latest weather updates.

we do not want any emergencies, but it is best to be

"Natural disasters and emergencies can occur at any time, and this summer we have been warned that bush-

fires are a real possibility," Cr Wriedt said.
"Preparing yourself, your family and your home will put you in the best position to respond to an emergency

Margate motorists not under the influence

On Saturday, December 30, police officers from the Huonville and Kingston police stations, with the assistance of road policing services, conducted a high visibility static random breath testing (RBT) site on the Channel Highway at Margate.

Acting Sergeant Ben Fogarty said of the 307 motorists intercepted, there was one defect notice issued, one unlicensed driver, two unregistered motor vehicles and one suspended driver.

Of the 307 RBTs conducted, there were no drivers detected under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

"It was pleasing to see the majority of road users continue to do the right thing this holiday season," Acting Sergeant Fogarty said.

"Safety on our roads is a priority for Tasmania Police, and we will continue to conduct high visibility operations as we look out for you these holidays."

Police were targeting the 'fatal five' - speeding, fatigue, distraction, seatbelts and alcohol/drugs.

Child Sexual Abuse Victim - Survivor Advisory Group


The Tasmanian Government is seeking expressions of interest from adult victim-survivors and parents or carers of victim-survivors to form an Advisory Group to inform Tasmania's approach to preventing and responding to child sexual abuse.

TARGA events postponed until 2025

Kingborough residents must wait another year for a TARGA leg that travels through the municipality.

Earlier this year, TARGA announced the 2024 route, including leg six, which would go through Kingborough and the Huon Valley.

Unfortunately, TARGA Australia has announced it will postpone the return of its tarmac rally events until 2025. The 31st running of TARGA Tasmania, initially scheduled for April 8 - 13 this year will now be held from April 28 to May 3, 2025.

TARGA CEO Mark Perry said he was extremely disappointed about the further postponement but believes it is necessary to ensure a strong event for the future.

"In recent weeks it has become clear that the full scope of work needed for a successful return makes running the event in April 2024 an unachievable task," he said. "While the further delay of our return will be sad news for thousands of people, we must ensure we get everything right first.

"This delay will enable us to finalise several key components while also fully supporting the ongoing coronial inquest which should see us in a position to implement all relevant recommendations from this process for the 2025 TARGA Tasmania."
