



Amber up for award

Kingborough gymnast Amber French has been nominated for the 2024 7News Tasmanian Young Achiever Awards.

Judging will take place on Wednesday, February 28, with finalists and winners announced at a gala presentation dinner on Saturday, May 11.

Category winners will each receive \$2000 in prizes and a trophy.

One of the category winners will be named the 2024 Tasmanian Young Achiever of the Year and will also receive a state trophy.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* reached out to Amber for thoughts on her nomination.

"I felt very grateful to be nominated for the Tasmanian Young Achiever Award," Amber said. "Being recognised for my commitment and dedi-

cation to both the sport and sporting community is special and rewarding.

"Last year I was lucky enough to be a finalist in the Motors Tasmania Sports Award."

Amber started gymnastics at the tender age of two, participating in kindergym.

She took on trampolining at eight years old and is now the current state champion for women's trampoline and a silver medallist at the 2023 Australian Gymnastics Championships.

Amber also devotes time to helping others.

"Apart from training and competitions, I'm a full-time university student studying education, entering my third year," Amber said.

"Additionally, I coach gymnastics and work as a teacher's assistant in various schools."

Kingborough candidate

Kingborough Councillor Aldo Antolli has been announced as one of the four pre-selected candidates for the Tasmanian Liberal Party in the next state election.

Former Tasmanian Senator Eric Abetz joins Cr Antolli alongside existing Franklin MPs Minister Nick Street and Dean Young.

Cr Antolli was also the Liberal Party's candidate for the 2022 Huon Legislative Council election but lost to Independent Dean Harriss.

"I am committed to keeping my roles as a candidate and councillor separate, ensuring a clear focus on both responsibilities," Cr Antolli said.

"I welcome any feedback or thoughts you may have on this matter.

"This choice was made in conjunction with my family with a deeply rooted passion for public service, cultivated through my dedicated service as a councillor in Kingborough."

Whilst the next state election is not due until mid-2025, there is debate the election will be brought forward to this year as John Tucker and Lara Alexander's defection in 2023 landed Premier Jeremy Rockliff in a minority government.

Climber rescued

Police and Ambulance Tasmania recently rescued an injured climber from East Cloudy Head, South Bruny after the man fell around 15 metres.

A medical team was winched in to stabilise the patient, along with Tasmania Police Search and Rescue members who were deployed to the location.

Approximately four hours after his fall, the weather abated to allow the ambulance rescue helicopter to winch the patient to safety.

The injured man was flown to a Melbourne hospital in a serious condition for treatment.

Kingborough more active than average

Feedback is being sought from the community on the findings of the Kingborough Sport and Recreation Strategy.

The strategy identified gaps in Kingborough's sporting and recreation facilities and the barriers stopping people from actively participating in these activities.

The development of the strategy involved community engagement with over 1000 participants and found there was an increase in participation in recreational activities like walking, swimming, cycling and going to the gym.

The strategy also revealed that Kingborough residents are more active than the national average in participating in sports and recreational activities.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the youth survey gave a fantastic snapshot of Kingborough's younger community members and what sports and

recreational activities they prefer to play.

"The most popular sports with Kingborough youth are football (soccer), swimming, netball, futsal, mountain bike riding, cricket, walking and athletics," she said.

"The most mentioned topic throughout this engagement was the community's desire for a public swimming pool or aquatic facility, which is why one of the key recommendations of the strategy is to investigate options for a pool."

Other recommendations made in the strategy include further investment in tracks and trails, cycle paths, a skate park and outdoor gym equipment, as well as exploring the potential for greater use of the school facilities by the community.

Submissions can be made to Kingborough Council until Tuesday, March 5.
