Kingborough candidate

Kingborough Councillor Aldo Antolli has been announced as one of the four pre-selected candidates for the Tasmanian Liberal Party in the next state election.

Former Tasmanian Senator Eric Abetz joins Cr Antolli alongside existing Franklin MPs Minister Nic Street and Dean Young.

Cr Antolli was also the Liberal Party's candidate for the 2022 Huon Legislative Council election but lost to Independent Dean Harriss.

"I am committed to keeping my roles as a candidate and councillor separate, ensuring a clear focus on both responsibilities," Cr Antolli said.

"I welcome any feedback or thoughts you may have on this matter.

"This choice was made in conjunction with my family with a deeply rooted passion for public service, cultivated through my dedicated service as a councillor in Kingborough.

Whilst the next state election is not due until mid-2025, there is debate the election will be brought forward to this year as John Tucker and Lara Alexander's defection in 2023 landed Premier Jeremy Rockliff in a minority government.

Climber rescued

The road is now open to one lane of traffic and managed by traffic signals between 6am and 6pm Monday to Friday.



Kingborough more active than average

Feedback is being sought from the community on the findings of the Kingborough Sport and Recreation Strategy.

The strategy identified gaps in Kingborough's sporting and recreation facilities and the barriers stopping people from actively participating in these activities. The development of the strategy involved community engagement with over 1000 participants and found

ty engagement with over 1000 participants and found there was an increase in participation in recreational activities like walking, swimming, cycling and going to the gym. The strategy also revealed that Kingborough resi-

dents are more active than the national average in participating in sports and recreational activities.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the youth survey gave a fantastic snapshot of Kingborough's younger community members and what sports and recreational activities they prefer to play.

"The most popular sports with Kingborough youth are football (soccer), swimming, netball, futsal, mountain bike riding, cricket, walking and athletics," she said.

"The most mentioned topic throughout this engagement was the community's desire for a public swimming pool or aquatic facility, which is why one of the key recommendations of the strategy is to investigate options for a pool."

Other recommendations made in the strategy include further investment in tracks and trails, cycle paths, a skate park and outdoor gym equipment, as well as exploring the potential for greater use of the school facilities by the community.

Submissions can be made to Kingborough Council until Tuesday, March 5.





Don't feed the ducks

In collaboration with BirdLife Tasmania, the Pacific Black Duck Conservation Group and local councils, the Derwent Estuary Program has created a new, handy and easy-to-read booklet to help people identify ducks in Tasmania and learn a bit about their diets, antics and how to keep them safe and healthy.

With beautiful illustrations by Hobart-based artist Sam Lyne, the booklet will help people easily identify our ducks in Tasmania.

Convenor of BirdLife Tasmania Karen Dick said they were proud to be part of the initiative. "Many people don't realise that feeding ducks is

seriously impacting our native species," she said. "Feeding ducks any food can cause illnesses, pollute

waterways where large numbers of ducks congregate and can attract rodents.

"We're encouraging people to make the switch and become duck twitchers of the Derwent, rather than duck feeders."

Derwent Estuary Program CEO Ursula Taylor echoed the importance of native ducks being able to consume their own specialised diets, which they rely upon for essential nutrients.

"Watching them dabble and dive for their healthy food sources is a far more enjoyable way to celebrate our ducks and contribute to their wellbeing," she said.

How tax changes affect Kingborough

Every taxpayer in the electorate of Franklin, around 50,000 people, will receive a tax cut from July 1 under tax changes announced by the Australian Government recently.

The average tax cut will be \$1429 for taxpayers in Kingborough.

Around 43,000 people, or 86 per cent of taxpayers in the electorate of Franklin, will receive a bigger tax cut than they would have under the plan as it stood five years ago.

The average Australian wage earner of \$73,000 per

annum will receive a tax cut of \$1504, which is more than \$800 extra each year.

These cuts are designed to provide cost-of-living relief to middle Australia while making the tax system fairer.

Member for Franklin Julie Collins said the cuts delivered more help for middle-income Tasmanians under the pump from the cost of living.

"This is the right and responsible thing to do - to deliver more relief without adding to inflationary pressures or burdening the budget," she said.

Mayors call for ferry funding

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt has joined the Mayors of Hobart City, Clarence and Glenorchy to call for the Tasmanian Government to deliver a \$26 million ferry infrastructure package to complete the River Derwent terminal network.

The packages would include \$20 million to match an existing commitment by the Australian Government for three additional ferry terminals (Howrah Point, Kingston Beach, Regatta Point) and \$6 million to complete the

redevelopment of the Bellerive Terminal.

The Councils previously secured a \$20 million funding commitment from the Australian Government for new terminals at Lindisfarne, Sandy Bay and Wilkinsons Point.

The proposed \$26 million investment by the Tasmanian Government would deliver the remaining infrastructure necessary to support an expanded ferry network to key strategic sites across the River Derwent.

The mayors are also calling on the State Government to partner with Councils on an operating plan to activate the network and secure a long-term ferry service provider.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the mayors welcomed the Tasmanian Government's commitment to expand and operate the ferry service.

"It is clear that further investment is required to make this vision a reality," she said.


