

## Family to cycle around the world

**On Friday, February 16, a Kingborough family will set out on a massive round-the-world bicycle adventure predicted to take three years to complete.**

Andrew and Nicola Hughes are packing their family of five into panniers and seeing the world slowly.

The trip will embark from Andrew's parents'

home in Woodbridge for a tour of southern Tasmania before heading to New Zealand for two and a half months.

"From there we are flying into Lima, Peru and heading south for the rest of this year," said Andrew.

"Year two and three if we make it that far will be Europe and homeward bound across Asia."

This isn't the first time the family have gone on a cycling adventure.

In 2019 the then family of four rode tandem bikes around Australia for a year.

"We are really excited about the first few nights in the tent to see how everyone fits in," Andrew said.

"Jean is only one, so getting her into a good

camping routine is going to be lots of fun."

The biggest concern is around flights into and out of countries.

"We have huge bikes and lots of gear and it'll be a guaranteed nightmare."

The Swag Family as they are known online, will be sharing their adventures via a podcast and monthly newsletter.

## Development application for Spring Farm lodged

**Property developer Tipalea Partners has lodged a development application (DA) with Kingborough Council for its new \$45 million next-generation retail hub, the Spring Farm Village project.**

The proposed centre will deliver over 7500 square metres of retail space and is also set to be the most technologically advanced and environmentally sustainable retail centre south of Hobart.

Kingston is earmarked as one of Hobart's fastest-growing regions, with a projected population increase of 7000 in the next 10 years.

Spring Farm Village will be anchored by the latest generation and largest Coles Supermarket (4250m<sup>2</sup>) in the region.

"Spring Farm Village is set to redefine everyday convenience in Kingston, and we are eager to appoint a builder and get construction underway," said CEO of Tipalea Partners Scott Spanton.

"Now that we have lodged our DA, we are hopeful for approval around May and would then aim for construction to start mid to late 2024 with the centre opening before Christmas 2025," he said.

# Some movement on Snug path

Kingborough Council have endorsed a community petition requesting a shared pathway connecting Snug with Lower Snug and Conningham.

The petition received 256 signatures which councillors acknowledged demonstrated significant community interest.

Concerned locals from the Coningham and Lower Snug Community Association (CALSCA) have been advocating for the path for some time, and more recently, a dedicated group formed the 'Greater Snug Safe Paths Project.'

In the report put before Kingborough Council on February 5, two options for pathways were discussed, one on either side of the Channel Highway.



256 signatures have been collected on a petition requesting a shared pathway connecting Snug with Lower Snug and Conningham. Councillor Kaspar Deane said, "With so many families living in Lower Snug and Conningham, having a safe way to walk and ride into Snug absolutely makes sense". (PS)

Creating the pathway on the eastern side would mean students could cross the highway at the school crossing rather than in Lower Snug, where the speed limit is 80 kilometres per hour.

During the meeting, Councillor Kaspar Deane successfully moved an amendment to ensure the council prioritised pursuing the eastern pathway option.

The council's report highlighted difficulties they had experienced progressing a pathway to date.

One such hurdle had been obtaining a key parcel of land that is part of a deceased estate.

"It sounds like some progress has been made in obtaining the land," Cr Deane said.

"Given significant benefits to the community and demonstrated local support, it would be a massive shame if the project didn't get off the ground".

# Follow the science, Mr Premier

Dear Editor,

This week my forest activist colleague, Dr Lisa Searle, and I had a chat with Premier Rockliff about native forests, endangered species and the climate emergency.

The Premier told us that he and the Liberal Party trust climate science, but he said that he and his government don't need to improve on anything when it comes to Tasmania's environment because of hydropower.

But hydropower is not the magic bullet that everybody makes it out to be.

The ecosystem degradation caused by hydropower accelerates declines in freshwater biodiversity, displaces river ecosystems and also produces harmful

methane that exacerbates climate change.

Over time, river sediment clogs dams which decreases reservoir capacity and reduces the amount of energy generated.

Climate change and rising water demands mean lower river volumes, which shrinks the hydropower capacity.

So let me remind you, Premier, about the science that you believe in so strongly.

Researchers at the Australian National University (ANU) and Griffith University, are calling for an immediate end to all native forest logging if Australia wants to meet its net zero targets in coming decades.

Other scientific strategies that must be acted on if we

want to give humankind and the future of our environment a fighting chance:

- working towards zero new species extinctions
  - effective restoration of degraded terrestrial, inland water, marine and coastal ecosystems
  - tackling the impact of invasive feral species
  - reducing the impact of plastics on nature
  - minimising the impact of climate change
  - putting an end to native forest logging
- The future is in your hands, Premier Rockliff.  
Don't stuff it up.

## Blackmans Bay spirit

Dear Editor,

So pleasing to discover the Blackmans Bay community spirit of caring and helping others in need still exists and thrives.

Walking to my local Bayview shopping centre yesterday, Thursday, February 1, an unlucky young man on his electric bicycle accidentally hit the road gutter and was catapulted off his bike as he negotiated the Opal Drive roundabout and ended up half on the road and half on the tarmac footpath, luckily just missing a light pole.

He was traumatised, had a severely lacerated leg/knee and badly bruised shoulder and neck but his helmet saved him from head injury.

I heard, then saw him come off the bike and on impact the front wheel separated from the bike and continued on down the road and actually rolled upright across the lower roundabout on Roslyn Avenue coming to a bouncing halt against a paling fence.

In the 20 to 30 seconds of me watching the wheel's progress, a passing motorist had stopped to see if the young man was conscious and aware and we both assisted him to sit upright and check himself for possible injuries.

I checked the bike for damage and in the meantime, three friendly tradies had driven around the lower roundabout in their truck, collected the bike wheel and returned it back up Algonia Road to the accident victim.

Two more motorists stopped after seeing the young man visibly distressed and offered assistance if needed.

I stayed with the young man helping to put the wheel back on the bike only to discover the front fork was damaged from the accident rendering the bike unsafe to ride.

The strong gusting wind, which probably contributed to the accident continued to blast us exposed on the roadside.

I briefly left his side to collect my mail, literally a minute away and on returning two more passers-by had stopped to help if needed, all offering sound sensible suggestions on wound dressing and calming advice.

When the victim had recovered sufficiently, drinking sips of water and agreeing he could no longer ride his bike we repacked his damaged bike pannier and back-pack together as the straps had been severed.

He called home and a concerned parent arrived 15 minutes later to collect a brave but damaged son.

We discovered his bike would not fit into the car but yet again a pedestrian passer-by stopped and said, "I live just across the road, we can wheel the bike over there and secure it for you to collect later."

Magic.

The unfortunate young man went home with mum to have his wounds attended to, his bike was safely stored for later collection and all was well again.

Aren't we lucky to live in a suburb so full of the many caring and generous strangers in these days of negativity, mistrust and apprehension?

Love this place.

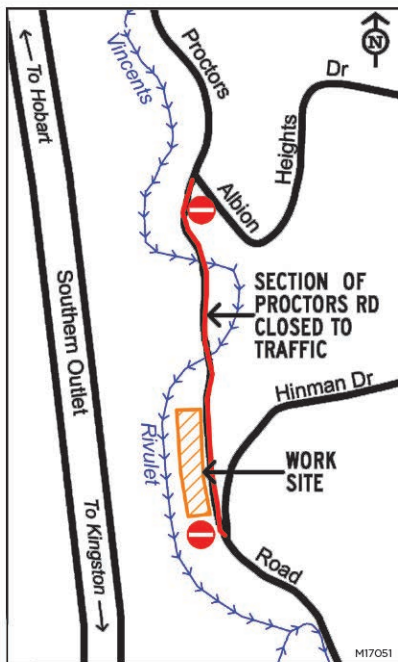

# Rally for cystic fibrosis

**Kingborough Mayor and Cystic Fibrosis Tasmania (CFT) CEO Paula Wriedt has agreed to don the appropriate gear and get on the back of a motorcycle, despite her fears, if \$3000 is raised to support Tasmanians with cystic fibrosis (CF).**

On Saturday, February 17 the Tasmanian chapter of the Vietnam Veterans and Veterans Motorcycle Club will hold a car and bike rally in southern Tasmania.

The route will begin at Pontville and travel around 190 kilometres to Old Beach.

All profits will go to CFT and assist them in supporting Tasmanians living with the condition.

Despite advances in medical research and treatments, there is still no cure for CF.

This will be the fourth annual car and bike rally organised by the Vietnam Veterans and Veterans Motorcycle Club.

The 2023 event raised over \$15,145 for Tasmanians living with CF.

Cr Wriedt started working with CFT in 2010 as their

first employee.

Before that, they had been a voluntary organisation.

She said that 'a little nervous was an understatement when asked how she was feeling about going on her first motorcycle ride.

"But when the members of the Vietnam Veterans and Veterans Motorcycle Club suggested that a good fundraiser would be to try and get people to donate to see me get on the back of a bike, I agreed," Cr Wriedt said. "I'm always up for a challenge."

Cr Wriedt will be a pillion passenger with an experienced rider in control of the bike.

"I believe I'll be on Troy Smith's bike," Cr Wriedt said.

"Troy and his mum, Lynn, have both been some of the incredibly hard workers and driving forces of this fundraising event since it started in 2020.

"Tim Young, also a member of the Club is the grandfather of a young girl with CF, so I may even end up on his bike.

"Let's hope for nice weather!"

# Healing through martial arts

Undeatead at Channel Court Shopping Centre, Kingston is taking part in the Pink Belt Project.

The Pink Belt Project provides women on a recovery journey with a one-year scholarship allowing them to train for free at their local martial arts club.

Martial arts clubs from every State and Territory of Australia take part to empower women and improve their health and recovery experience.

Scholarships are provided through martial arts instructors like Nicola Francis from Undeatead, who agree to sponsor a scholarship and cover expenses such as uniform, sash and membership fees on behalf of a selected scholarship recipient.

Undeatead specialises in female-only classes for teenage girls and women.

The Pink Belt Project was started in 2018 by West Australian black belt mum Kristy Hitchens who discov-

ered for herself training provided a unique combination of health and well-being benefits that went far beyond the expected lessons in self-defence.

Mrs Hitchens saw how the training helped a friend impacted by domestic violence so went on to research the phenomenon and develop a model that could encourage more women to participate by removing the financial and other barriers to participation.

In its five-year history, almost 200 scholarships have been offered across Australia.

Scholarship recipients have gone on to become instructors, start new jobs, buy new homes, develop new social networks and heal their trauma.

These outcomes reflect the sociological research on the transformative power of martial arts for women.

Applications for the scholarship to Undeatead are due by February 29.
