Community supportive during almost two-hour wait

Dear Editor,

On behalf of my family, I would like to sincerely thank the members of the public who stopped to offer their assistance when my adult son had a severe medical condition on the side of the Channel Highway, just north of Electrona, late Friday afternoon, March 1 while we were on our

way home to Woodbridge.

To us, his family, who were with him during this event, it was extremely traumatic as it escalated into what appeared to be a life-threatening situation.

During this time, I was also assisted on the phone by a paramedic from 000 for the last twenty-three minutes before the ambulance finally arrived.

He advised me on at least four occasions to start CPR on my son as he wasn't passing the breathing test that we were monitoring according to his instructions.

Luckily, each time we didn't need to.

Checking my phone log, sometime after the incident, it showed that from the first of three phone calls I made to 000, it took 1 hour and 40 minutes before an ambulance finally arrived on the scene.

An absolutely agonising wait for their assistance. The relief for us was enormous once the ambulance arrived and the paramedics took charge.

Their professional calmness and reassurance were wonderful, and we are naturally extremely grateful to them and the paramedic who assisted on the phone.

As mentioned earlier, our hearts do go out with big hugs to all who stopped to offer assistance, particularly the martial arts man, the female GP and the lady from Middleton.

I also couldn't have coped without the help from my other son and my wife who were on the scene in a flash after phoning them.

My son has recovered and is now fine but we are all pretty shell-shocked from the experience.



Kingborough family raising dementia awareness

On May 5, Kingborough local Ryan Jones will lace up his running shoes to participate in the Australia Dementia Memory Walk and Jog, tackling a 10 kilometre route alongside his family.

Ryan and his family have joined forces to raise awareness and funds for dementia research and support services for the families and carers.

Despite the absence of a local event in Tasmania, Ryan, his wife Sarah, daughter Amy and other family members have committed to participating in the Melbourne Dementia Memory Walk and Jog event, one of 22 such events across Australia.

Seven years ago, Ryan's mother Libby was diagnosed with early-onset dementia at the age of 57.

The diagnosis sent shockwaves through their family, altering the vibrant life Libby once led as a dedicated teacher, loving mother and devoted grandmother.

Libby is one of the staggering two out of three individuals in Australia affected by a form of dementia.

This debilitating disease ravages the mind, robbing individuals of their memories and identities and eventually controlling their bodies.

For Ryan and his family, witnessing the transformation of his mother has been heartbreaking, knowing that their children and other grandchildren will never fully experience the essence of the woman Libby once was.

As Ryan, Sarah and the whole family gear up for the challenge ahead, they invite the community to show their support.

The Memory Walk and Jog is organised by Dementia Australia, the national peak body for people impacted by dementia.

They represent over 400,000 Australians living with dementia and the almost 1.5 million Australians involved in their care.



Please cut looped waste

Borong Wildlife Sanctuary's rescue service received an adult female platypus from Browns River in Kingston on Tuesday, March 5.

The animal was found floating in shallow water by a member of the public with an elastic hair band wrapped tightly around its body.

Borong's Head Wildlife Veterinarian Dr Luke Gregory said that on assessing the animal under anaesthetic, it was found to have a very deep wound around her upper torso where the hairband had cut in. "She had also sustained a permanent injury to one of

her front legs," said Dr Gregory, "which meant that she was unable to use her foot normally."

Based on similar cases seen at the Sanctuary in recent years, Bororong believes that the hairband had initially been wrapped around the foot before sliding back along the body.

Due to the serious and inoperable nature of her injuries, combined with a very poor body condition, the animal had to be humanely euthanised.

Borong Primary Care Director Matt Clement said that when we think about waste in our waterways, we

commonly think of larger, more visible items like plastic bags.

"Smaller items such as twine and hairbands are difficult to spot but can have a devastating impact on our wildlife," said Matt.

"This platypus likely suffered for many weeks before being brought to our wildlife hospital."

Borong encourages people to follow the advice of "Seize it - Snip it - Bin it" about looped rubbish.

In addition, the Sanctuary encourages people to shop with zero-waste principles in mind.







Meet the Candidates

2024 Tasmanian State Election - Franklin Electorate



The Kingborough Chronicle newspaper asked the community for questions to ask the Franklin electorate candidates running in the 2024 Tasmanian State Election. All candidates were contacted, with the following responses received.



Eric Abetz
Liberal candidate for Franklin

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

Reducing the cost of energy with a \$250 rebate per household, supporting investment and job creation which provide higher paid jobs. Amending planning laws to enable quicker and more affordable house builds. Increasing supply reduces the cost of rentals and mortgages.

2. What is your plan to make housing more affordable and accessible?

Housing costs have grown through planning restrictions and requirements that impact affordability. The continual closure of productive forests sees the cost of wood increase. Stamp duty relief for first home buyers with a view to the abolition of this inefficient tax.

3. What is your position on Tasmania having an AFL team and stadium at Mac Point?

I support a Tasmanian AFL team, the time has come. The multipurpose stadium planned for Mac Point is exactly that - multipurpose. The AFL would be the anchor tenant. The stadium attracted Federal Labor support to the tune of \$240 million and support from the AFL.

If Tasmanian Labor kills the stadium, this money is denied to the Tasmanian economy along with all the jobs.

With the AFL team also comes AFL funding for grassroots and community football right around Tasmania.

4. Where do you want to see Tasmania in four years?

Long-term strategic thinking is needed beyond a four-year horizon. Economic strength is the underpinning for any government activity and spending. A strong resilient economy based on self-reliance, with people committed to advancing Tasmania's best interests ensuring a Tasmanian future for our children while protecting our way of life. The instilling in the young a respect for others including for frontline workers and the need to recognise they have agency in the direction of their lives. A society where identity politics is eschewed and personal responsibility is embraced.



Ebony Altimira
Labor candidate for Franklin

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

Having been a single mother, I am acutely aware of the cost-of-living struggles facing Tasmanian households, including the complexities of returning to the workforce and navigating childcare.

As someone who has spoken to many Tasmanians facing these pressures, and who has felt them myself, I want to be part of a Labor government that makes reducing the cost of living its number one priority.

Labor will provide more access to affordable childcare by setting up 50 additional childcare centres in Tasmania.

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

We need to get more homes on the market by building up and out.

We must ensure that the growth of our cities do not outpace the capacity of our roads.

Therefore, we need to look seriously at what opportunities there are to ensure our infrastructure is built with growth and the future in mind.

In this, it is critical to hear the voice of the next generation who will be here to see the outcomes.

3. What is your position on Tasmania having an AFL team and stadium at Mac Point?

I can't wait to be barracking for our team in our stadium!

I've been a strong supporter of the team and stadium from the beginning.

I have family members who had to move overseas to the mainland to follow their footy dreams.

I look forward to sitting with my future kids watching Tasmanians playing for a Tasmanian team.

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

While the cost-of-living is often talked about as an issue, few are providing solutions.

There are many different cost-of-living policies that I have advocated for during my time as a Member of Parliament, and I'll continue to fight for these policies if re-elected.

I believe a root-and-branch review of Tasmania's government-owned businesses is needed.

Companies like Metro, Hydro and Aurora are owned by Tasmanians - they should be leveraging their position to keep prices as low as possible.

The next Parliament must properly invest in public transport, which is something I will always fight for.

Over the last decade, our public transport system has been undermined and services have been axed.

Transport and fuel costs are a significant burden on households, but having an efficient, affordable and desirable public transport system can help alleviate these

This is particularly true for those in regional areas including the Channel and Huon who regularly commute into Hobart.

2. What is your plan to make housing more affordable and accessible?

If you don't have a stable and secure roof over your head, how can you make your way in the world?

Increasing the supply of social and affordable housing should be the key priority of the next Parliament.

There has been too much reliance on not-for-profit community housing providers to build the thousands of social and affordable housing dwellings this state needs.

Instead, the next Government should utilise its own capacity and remove barriers to sensible private and public development.

Owning a home is now completely beyond the reach of tens of thousands of Tasmanians, leading to more people renting.

Renters need better protections through legislative changes, but a balance must be struck with the interests of landlords too.

Last year, as an Independent Member, I successfully carried legislation through both houses of Parliament with unanimous support to better protect social housing tenants.

There are many more reforms I am passionate about that will make renting and housing more affordable, including a model of a short-stay accommodation levy that I first proposed in 2022.

3. What is your position on Tasmania having an AFL team and stadium at Mac Point?

I strongly support Tasmania having its own team in the AFL and AFLW.

It would realise the dream that many Tasmanians have had for so long.

However, the reality is that our state does not currently have the facilities needed to set up a team for success.

Building a multipurpose stadium at Macquarie Point isn't just about the footy.

It would also provide a space for large conferences, exhibitions and events which Tasmania isn't able to host currently.

It would be an intergenerational asset that will spur decades of economic activity in our capital city.

However, any stadium built must be developed in a sustainable way.

The project and funding need to be transparent, and there must be plans for traffic and people management so the impacts to Hobart's waterfront are minimised.

I think the Government's handling of this project has been poor, which is jeopardising the entire AFL/AFLW team dream.

4. Where do you want to see Tasmania in four years?

I want Tasmania to be a happier, healthier place that provides greater economic opportunities for all.

We can have a health and hospital system that can deliver timely care to all Tasmanians, including those in our regions.

The trend of increasing homelessness can be reversed, and the ever-growing social housing waitlist can be reduced through clever and targeted policy initiatives.

In four years, I hope our state can provide shelter and a safe place to sleep for those who can't afford to keep a roof over their head.

Tasmania has tremendous economic potential across a whole range of existing and emerging industries that can be realised with smarter government decision-making.

I don't think it's unreasonable to hope for a Tasmania that delivers good government services, good jobs, and looks after its people within the next four years.

The next Parliament just needs to ditch the mudslinging and personality politics and get on with the job.

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

I know that so many people in Franklin feel like they're drowning in this cost-of-living crisis.

I'll back Labor's plan to take urgent action by getting bills down and tackling all those little costs that add up for families.

Tasmania owns the Hydro, but under the Liberals we've been paying mainland prices for power.

Prices have shot up by 22.5 per cent in just the last two years.

Labor will roll back these price hikes and save the average household \$400 a year.

We'll also cap power prices to make sure they don't increase by more than 2.5 per cent per year.

Little expenses can pile up quickly for families, so I'll also back Labor's plan to take the pressure off parents.

1. How will you ease the cost-of-living burden on Tasmanians?

We can't do everything on the cost-of-living, but we have to do everything possible. As Labor's energy spokesman, my main focus has been on ensuring families and businesses pay Tasmanian prices for Tasmanian power. We will reverse the Liberals' massive electricity price hikes and cap future increases to 2.5 per cent a year - that will save the average family \$400 per year. Tasmanians built the hydro and we must be the ones who benefit from it. Our power bills should not go up because of coal and gas prices on the mainland.

2. What is your plan to make housing more affordable and accessible?

On top of the work already being done, we want to accelerate the construction of affordable housing, especially since there has been an easing in the market. We will deliver 1000 new properties through build-to-rent programs that offer tax incentives for developers to provide long-term rentals. To help people to own their homes, Labor will invest \$20 million into the MyHome program, which allows people to buy a property with a much smaller deposit. We will urgently fix up untenanted social housing properties that are awaiting repairs. To boost the supply of new housing, we will make planning simpler.

3. What is your position on Tasmania having an AFL team and stadium at Mac Point?

Labor absolutely supports Tasmanian AFL and AFLW teams. We support the ongoing funding of \$144 million over 12 years and the high-performance centre. But we have to face the reality that it is going to be impossible to build a stadium at the site the Liberals are proposing. All the evidence, including soil contamination, restricted size of the site, impact on the Hobart Cenotaph, the port and nearby businesses, and the location of the historic Goods Shed mean actually building the stadium on that site will be highly problematic. Labor has said we will sit down with the AFL and discuss how we can work together to get a team that doesn't break our budget and can actually be delivered.

4. Where do you want to see Tasmania in four years?

I want to see a state that's the home of renewable energy in Australia. We have so much to be proud of but we do need to get some basics right. We need to implement Labor's plan to ease the cost-of-living, fix our broken health system and make sure every child has the best chance in life through an education system that works. After 10 years of the Liberals, it is pretty clear we need a change.

Rent and mortgage payments, bills and grocery prices have all gone up, and people are being forced to make impossible choices about what to pay for. Then you throw in things like school levies or transport costs, and things get even harder.

The Greens are campaigning for meaningful action on the cost-of-living - not just nice-sounding slogans some politicians love.

Our plan includes limiting rent increases and capping power prices. We'll fight to make public transport free and reliable everywhere and to halve the cost of car registration for low-income Tasmanians.

It's nearly impossible to find a place to rent, and if you want to buy somewhere now you're faced with prices we never would have dreamed of just a few years ago.

The Liberals have not made housing their focus, and even now they're more focused on building a billion-dollar stadium instead of homes for Tasmanians.

The Greens are fighting to build more public homes, to put strong limits on Airbnb, and to stop the massive rent hikes that are being experienced by so many people.

We're also pushing to see more support for homeless Tasmanians and the organisations that support them.


