Blackmans Bay ocean talks

Scientists, divers, fishers and representatives from the Tasmanian Aboriginal community gathered in Blackmans Bay Hall on Thursday, March 14 to discuss Tasmania's declining ocean health.

The event was led by IMAS scientist and co-founder of Great Southern Reef Foundation Dr Scott Bennett, co-owner of Total Dive Solutions Bridget de Lange, researcher at the Australian Institute Evie Simpson and Aboriginal artist and climate researcher Dean Greeno.

Environment Tasmania organised this event to discuss how Tasmania's ocean health is declining and what we and the Tasmanian Government can "My concern about ocean health is the rate of climate change impacting

the Great Southern Reef (GSR)," Dr Bennett said. "More than 70 per cent of species on the GSR are endemic, meaning they

are found nowhere else on earth. "We therefore face the real possibility of mass extinctions of GSR species

over the coming decades unless urgent climate action is taken." Bridget de Lange described Tasmania's declining ocean health as overwhelming and heartbreaking

"I see mother ocean coming under attack from all angles: acidification, alien species, farming pressures, extinction and pollution," she said.

"Perhaps the most significant loss is for us as humans, as we witness our sacred blue spaces changing so rapidly in our own lifetimes.

Evie Simpson said Tasmania needs a marine plan.

"The collapse of the sand flathead fishery and the plight of the Maugean skate are just two examples of Tasmania's failing, 30-year-old marine law," she said.

"Tasmania needs a marine plan for healthy oceans that resolves stakeholder conflict, addresses climate change and takes into account all the ways Tasmania's coastal waters are used.



Funding commitments spark debate

A re-elected Liberal Government has announced they will commit over \$700,000 in funding to various community projects in Kingborough.

Proponents have engaged with Liberal candidates to support their community projects.

- Electric vehicle charging station in Margate, \$100,000
- · Kingborough Junior Football Club disability toilets and upgrades, \$88.000

Independent for Nelson Meg Webb said that the announcement by the Liberal Party of funding commitments to community and sporting groups was a practice previously identified as inappropriate by the Tasmanian Integrity Commission.

"It is disappointing to see the re-emergence of pork-bar-

relling behaviour by the Liberal Party in yet another election, which flies in the face of previous warnings from the Integrity Commission," Ms Webb said.

Ms Webb said two years ago the Integrity Commission recommended transparency reforms to election commitment processes be legislated before the next state elec-

"The government failed to do so and is now flouting the Commission's advice," Ms Webb said.

Greens Leader and member for Franklin Rosalie Woodruff said that the Liberals' approach to community organisations is simple.

"Starve them of the money they need between elections, then use election times as a vehicle for vote-buying," she

"There are hundreds of community groups crying out for support - and that's exactly why Tasmania needs an open, merit-based process to distribute precious public money.

"So many organisations would desperately want a slice of the Liberals' election promises, but they have been cut out because they aren't close enough to Liberal MPs or their candidates.

The Liberals' list of community funding is not set in stone, as all funding will be subject to approval by both houses of State Parliament.

The commitments are designed to encourage greater community engagement and drive job opportunities, especially in regional areas.

Alleviating bill shock

Independent candidate for Franklin Clare Glade-Wright said car owners should have the option of a weekly deduction to pay their car registrations.

"This would equate to a weekly payment on average around \$12 per week and will assist families and individuals deal with the cost-of-living crisis by alleviating bill shock," she said.

The Liberal Government made it possible to pay car registrations quarterly instead of annually.

TasWater, Aurora and some councils now offer a weekly payment for their bills.

"It makes a big difference when you divide the annual bill by 52, as it means the shock of a big bill doesn't hit you, especially if you are receiving one big bill after another," Glade-Wright said.

"It would not cost the government much to implement and run this idea beyond initial set-up costs, and this idea will not blow the state budget, but is a simple and practical way to help ease the pressures of cost-of-living.

"The weekly payment method would be especially useful for people on average or lower incomes trying to make their budgets work.'

Changes to tax cuts from July

In response to higher than normal inflation and cost of living pressures, the Australian Government has passed legislation to amend the tax cuts which will apply from July 1 this year.

The changes are explained below, along with some things you may wish to think about to help maximise your savings.

What's changing?

The stage three tax cuts were already legislated and are due to come into effect on July 1.

The recent amendments change some of the personal income tax rates, as well as the income brackets that certain tax rates apply to.

The tax-free threshold (which is the amount of income

\$18,200.

Compared to the original tax cuts, the changes are:

- Reduce the 19 per cent tax rate to 16 per cent, • Reinstate the 37 per cent tax bracket (which was going to be removed from July 1), but increase the income band to which this applies from \$120,000 to
- Decrease the threshold above which the 45 per cent tax rate applies, from \$200,000 to \$190,000.

Ms Harris said Tassie Mums' mission is to support children in need with everyday essentials.

"There is so much more value in keeping this vital service alive, the immense amount of goods diverted from landfills, the data and storytelling that contribute to making a positive change on childhood poverty.

"Other benefits include the connection between social and health services, the strong community of volunteers, supporters and donors that have built up around Tassie Mums.


